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Chairman's Report

Another surf season has come and gone with plenty for South Maroubra members to be proud of in all areas of operation including but not limited to continued lifesaving improvement, a second major renovation, extension and improved education facilities within the middle floor now known as the *Bernie Kelly Bar & Heritage Room* and so much more.

I would however like to start this seasons wrap up by firstly thanking all of the Clubs Office Bearers who give up a great deal of time and energy to make our club as successful and strong as it possibly can be. I strongly encourage members to put their hand up when asked or you see an area you can assist in.

I am proud to advise that once again this season there were **'No Lives Lost'** at South Maroubra beach. Such an achievement is only possible by the dedicated members led by our **LIFESAVING DEPARTMENT** who remained extremely active throughout the season overseeing beach operations in often fine weather, high patronage but hazardous surf conditions. Many of our senior



lifesavers when not on patrol backed up as our Bronze, SRC and other award Instructors producing some outstanding lifesavers.

In addition to the above, our club members deservedly took out two **'Rescues of the Month'** during the season with father and son lifesavers Graham and Lucas Toms responding to a fisherman washed off the rocks from their home near Lurline Bay. Both Graham and Lucas entered the big surf on a board and tube respectively, making every effort to save the man's life despite floating face down upon arrival. They managed to carry out deep water resuscitation on a board until additional assistance arrived however despite best efforts by everyone involved the fisherman was unable to be revived. Graham and Lucas deservedly received the Rescue of the Month Award in Canberra with Matt Thistlethwaite our local Federal MP and following this award we were proud to see them take out the Sydney Branch Award for the Rescue of the Year.

The major rescue effort above was repeated later in the season when rostered Patrol 6 were confronted with a body board surfer impacting head first into a sand bank, losing consciousness for a short time and waking to find he had lost movement of his legs. The surfer was attended to by Patrol Captain Dr Don Smith and Nicole Krite who took control of the life threatening situation and with assistance of other lifesavers and lifeguards assessed and stabilised the 39 year old surfer before delicately carrying him to the club where Paramedics took over. It was revealed that the surfer had fractured his C1 and C2 vertebra which normally means quadriplegia or death. The quick response and care provided by all involved most likely gave this surfer a second chance of a meaningful future.

Outside of the high profile incidents during the season, conditions were challenging with one patrol carrying out over 60 recorded rescues on one day and other patrols stretched to their limits. Well done to all of our lifesavers for your commitment to our community and a big thank you to South Juniors who provide invaluable funding under the CDSE program each year

specifically for lifesaving equipment, much of which was used for many of these incidents.

Congratulations to our Director of Lifesaving Services Damien Woods and Deputy Ron Krite, Chief Instructor Cathy Hall, Michael Fernandez and the entire lifesaving team for their commitment.

Our challenge for next year will be to continue to grow, retain and multi skill lifesavers, whilst continuing to develop a strong administrative lifesaving base, succession and leadership plan.

On the **COMPETITION** front during the 2014/15 season, South Maroubra probably didn't reach the heights we would have liked but did see a re-emergence of our **boaties** with some respectable results throughout the season and emerging crews who I have no doubt will be around for a long time to come and have great potential. Our achievements in the boat section and the positive future ahead would not have been possible without the enthusiasm, dedication and quirky sense of humour of coach and head sweep Phil Stivano.

Our **swimmers** led by Lucy McJannett and Rhys Jones toiled well but were hampered by their pool commitments which seemed to conflict with surf competition throughout the season. Well done to Lucy who was recently selected to the Rescue 2016 Australian Life Saving Team. As part of this team Lucy will be involved in a series of domestic and international competition, camps and training to prepare the team to take on the World Championships in Eindhoven and Noordwijk, the Netherlands in August/September 2016.

On the **Rescue Boat racing (IRBs)** front, this group just continues to excel in all areas of lifesaving including competition. They continue to grow in number and skills and provide on beach expertise and leadership in a range of lifesaving areas in and outside the boat. This season as well as participating and excelling in local, State and Australian competition a portion of the team travelled to France to participate in the World Championships and again did themselves proud.

South Maroubra continues as one of the Australian top teams in IRB racing, we welcome new members to come and be a part of this dynamic group of lifesavers and a group that possess exceptional skills when it comes to aquatic rescues and club participation.

Finally and still on the issue of competition, I would like to commend our friendly Masters group who have continued to grow in number and participation. We now have representation in the boats, on the sand and in the water and have watched a growing team who that takes their competition seriously and training even more seriously! Congratulations to Phil Dutton Masters Coordinator along with Max Murphy, Anthony Coghlan, David Lowlett and a host of other **Masters Competitors** who did the club proud flying the club colours all around the Country and in fact as far as France at the World Champs. Well done to this wonderful group of members.

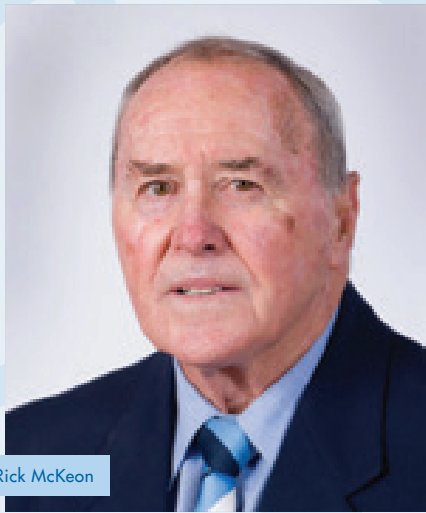

Rick was heavily involved in the establishment of South Maroubra SLSC in 1959 when Malabar Surf Club became defunct due to water pollution problems within Malabar Bay.

Rick convened the meeting on Sunday 31st May 1959 at the then Malabar Surf Club – with the support of the Surf Life Saving Association to form South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club.

Rick was instrumental in ensuring that a patrol would be on the beach at South Maroubra the first weekend in October of 1959. With a membership of 17, everyone was on duty.

Our club was privileged to have such a wonderful man and family involved for many years with South Maroubra and as such we extend our deepest sympathy to Ricks family. RIP Rick!

Rick received his Life Membership of South Maroubra SLSC in 1982, recognition from his peers for outstanding service rendered to the Club.

FINANCE SECTION

Director of Finance Report

As Finance Director and on behalf of the Board of Management Committee I am proud to present the 2014-2015 Audited Financial Statements.

The Financial Statements show an operating loss this season of \$133,296 compared to our operating profit last season (2014) of \$87,812.

The loss for the year reflects the significant cost of the clubhouse renovations carried out at the beginning of the season (\$353,518). The result however is the upgrade and extension of the clubhouse mid floor lounge/education room to double the size which can now be fully utilized by our Education Team where multiple groups can use the space at any one time. The renaming/christening of our new room to the Heritage Room was well attended and we thank Michael Daley MP for his involvement.

To finance the cost of the renovations most of our reserve funds were expended together with a generous boost from the Maroubra Seals Club (\$75,000). Thank you to the Department of Education and Communities - Community Building Partnership Program (\$30,000) and the Ministry for Police and Emergency Services (\$3,000) as these grants allowed for new digital equipment to be installed throughout the room. The expansion of this room has also given our club access to tap into a more lucrative 'room hire/function' market that we are confident will bring much needed funds into the club.

Cash generated from operating activities during this financial year was invested in Capital Equipment for Lifesaving and Lifesaving Operations (\$102,915), Administration and Clubhouse maintenance (\$149,747), Training Costs and Competition \$75,920.

Club fundraising activities held throughout the year resulted in a net profit of \$52,479. Activities included the annual Oktoberfest (thank you to Coordinator Warrick Bullen), South Maroubra Junior Carnival (thanks to Coordinators Linda Perrin IM and Yvette Rutherford IM), Club Sportsman Luncheon (Coordinated by Paul Fownes IM), Annual Golf Day (Organised by Jack Shaw IM), Bar Trading (thanks to our club Licensee Gus Taylor) and this season saw the return of the Club Trivia Night (well done to Michelle Lo for organising this most enjoyable night).

We have now entered our 2nd contractual year with Le Law Pty Ltd (Top Cat Catering) for the lease of the clubhouse top floor area known as Horizons. The quarterly lease fee to our club certainly provides financial stability however with continual increases in building and operational costs, we must be sure to work hard to increase our other revenue streams to ensure we can support the ever increasing costs associated with operating a Surf Club. Even though we carry the status as a registered charity, it is a constant challenge to obtain new Sponsors and maintain current Club Sponsorship and donation revenues.

Members need to work hard supporting our contributors to ensure we receive their continued support.

Later within this document we have listed our sponsors and local business that have most generously supported our activities over the past year and we pass on our sincere thanks and appreciation. Special mention and thanks goes to the Maroubra Seals Club for their long term financial support. South Sydney Juniors for their large injection of funds via the ClubGrants Program which allows our club to purchase most of its lifesaving equipment for the season. To The Randwick Club for the provision of funds for a new IRB and to Matraville RSL who contribute to our patrol uniforms. To City of Randwick (clubhouse maintenance and administration assistance) and Botany Bay City Councils (lifesaving projects) for their annual grants and finally to club sponsors such as NG Farah Real Estate, Rams, Bisley, Healthy Smile, Look Design, Pall Mall Manufacturing, Caltex, Royal Touch Paper, Rix Refrigeration and Top Cat Catering – Thank you.

Thank you to my team that props up the clubs Office Administration. Michelle Lo & June Burgess, you both have volunteered countless hours throughout the year to ensure that our club office is open each and every Sunday during the season. To Gus Taylor (Club Licensee) and Barry Osborne (Club Caretaker) for the huge amount of volunteer time they most graciously give to the club.

I also wish to thank club accountants Kelly Nichols and Anne Engel for their assistance throughout the audit process. Kelly was instrumental in the initial preparations of the accounts for our audit and I personally thank Kelly for her time and expertise.

I believe that the Board of Management Committee have provided a financially responsible set of Financial Statements for the year ended 30th April 2015. Our club has just engaged a new Auditor, Mr Garry Day, from Harley, Russell & Day. I thank Garry Day for agreeing to become our club Auditor as we bid farewell to our previous Auditor, Alan Johnston who provided many years of Auditing service to our club.

In closing, to all our members and especially our active Lifesavers, thank you for contributing to ensure we can celebrate another successful season.

I look forward to contributing to a positive and successful 2015/16 year ahead.



So what else is on the agenda down the track, or if we attract a financial sponsor a little sooner!

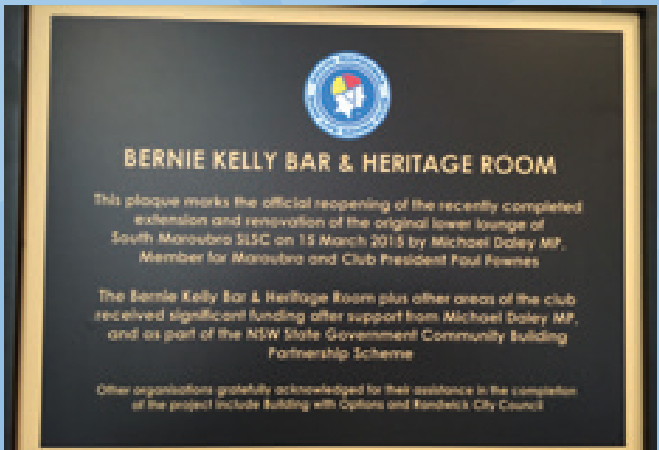
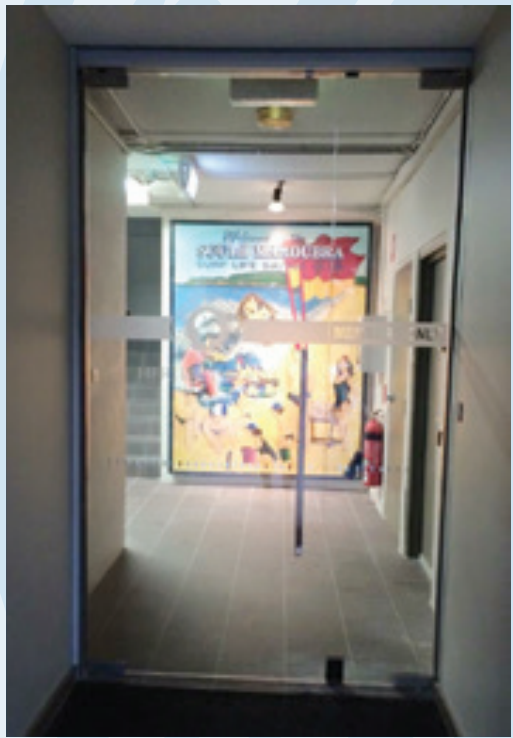
- Subcommittee working on redecorating and placement of memorabilia within the Heritage room.

- Enhancement of storage facilities and club office.

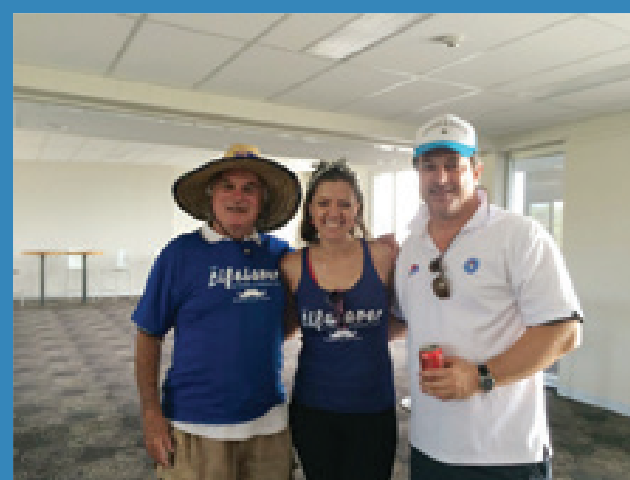

Director of Lifesaving Report

This season, like the many beforehand, our lifesavers were put to the test keeping our stretch of beach safe.



The 2014/15 season saw a very high number of dangerous surf weekends, with a lot of closed beach days. This however did not deter people entering the water, resulting in a larger number of rescues performed by our members. 236 rescues were performed over the duration of the season, which is up on our 127 from last season. We had a total of 71,671 people visit our beach this year, which is showing our beach is becoming increasingly popular, reiterating the fact that our lifesavers need to be vigilant in their duties.

236 rescues in one season is a huge effort and in many cases whole patrols have been involved in rescues. Tube rescue skills played a big part in the rescue mix this year. 107 rescues were performed with only a tube. For me, this is very exciting as it gives younger and newer members the chance to get out and make some rescues an experience that will change their lives.

We added another patrol this season, which again has reduced the number of patrols for each team. By doing this, it does mean smaller patrols; however we are seeing higher quality lifesavers come from this with more people getting involved and not holding back leaving the job to someone else. As a result, we are also seeing a higher retention rate as members are feeling like they have achieved something by being down on patrol.

Active Membership is on the increase and good numbers help make strong patrols. Over the last two years we have seen a 15% growth year on year in our active membership base. On the beach these numbers will only help us keep delivering the quality community service that people expect from the movement. The retention and recruitment of members is a whole club responsibility and all sections have done a great job to buck the trends and get more people involved. Over 30% active membership increase in two years is a fantastic result.

There are a couple of rescues that really stand out this season and truly show what high quality lifesavers we have patrolling our beach. The first one is patrol 4 in early January, captained by Phil Dutton. They guys and young girls were faced with rough and choppy conditions, along with an abundance of seaweed. The patrol completed 22 rescues that afternoon, showing extraordinary team work to complete the rescues. The young girls worked tirelessly performing tube rescues, while the IRB met them out the back to transport the patients back in.

The second rescue that stands out occurred in early February under the watchful eye of Jay Shelley and his Patrol 5. Jay and his team were met with large swells and a number of rips along the beach. This ensured that the team

were kept extremely busy that afternoon with a crazy 67 rescues. It really was non-stop of those guys and girls and again, a real team effort was shown to ensure no lives were lost. Everyone worked together on a rotation to combat fatigue. In my time at the club I have never seen a number of rescues like this ever get done in one day. Well done to all, it was truly a great effort.

Once again, it was a strong year for Cathie Hall and her education team. 34 new Bronze Medallion holders were put through, along with 28 SRC's. While we are down on our number of new Bronze's from last year, the quality of lifesavers that were trained up this year is extremely strong and will boost our patrols enormously. Thank you to Cathie and her team who do a great job each season bring new lifesavers into the mix. It can be a tough and tiring gig, but they never fail to deliver.

This season, just like last, our members participated in a large number of water safety events. These included external events such as the Australia Day Harbour Swim and the Nudie Swim, along with internal events such as the Branch Nipper and Age championships, the Nipper State Championships, the South Maroubra Juniors Carnival, Nth Cronulla Xmas carnival and the U/11 Nipper leadership camp.

A big thank you has to go to Nixy who played a big hand in organising the water safety personnel for the external events. The team performed in such a professional manner that they have already been booked in for next year. The IRB section was given a larger roster than normal in regards to the carnivals they were required at this season and as per usual, they didn't fail to turn up and provide quality water safety to the competitors. Carnival officials often praised the efforts of our IRB crews for the work they did. Well done guys.



To help boost our recruitment, the club organised for a recruitment drive down at UNSW. Thank you to all the members that assisted with this day and I am confident Cathie and the team will be busy next season training up a number of new Bronze's.

To wrap things up, thank you firstly to every single one of our patrolling members; the Patrol Captains, the ADOL Ronny Krite, IRB Coordinator Michael Fernandez, Education Coordinator Cathie Hall, Gear Steward Ken Hudson and Kelly Nichols and Nixy Krite for all the extra hours they put in to assist me. Thank you all, your hard work and dedication truly sets a solid foundation for the years to come. I look forward to working with each of you again next season.

Lucas Toms, Graham Toms

On Sunday 31 August 2014 at 10:30am, off duty Lifesavers, Lucas and Graham Toms witnessed a rock fisherman in distress from their home in Lurline Bay. After contacting '000' the pair made their way down to the rock shelf. Assessing the best access point due to the large swell and treacherous conditions, Lucas entered the water with his board with Graham entering behind him with a rescue tube.

Lucas was first to reach the patient who was face down in the water, unconscious and unresponsive. Lucas grabbed hold of the patient and placed him on his board for support. Once secured Lucas commenced deep water resuscitation aided by his father Graham who arrived shortly after. Due to the dangerous surf conditions both Lucas and Graham decided not to risk returning to the rock shelf and instead continued resuscitation and waited for assistance to arrive. The effort by Lucas and Graham was made all the more extraordinary given the size and weight of the unconscious patient.

A short while later, assistance arrived from a Maroubra Lifeguard on an RWC as well as off-duty lifesavers in an IRB from Maroubra SLSC. The patient was transferred to the RWC sled where resuscitation continued. Lifesaver 1 arrived on scene soon after, winching the patient aboard and continuing CRP until reaching the ground at Arthur Byrne Reserve (Maroubra Beach) where paramedics were waiting. In the end the paramedics were unable to revive the patient who was declared deceased on scene.

Both Lucas and Graham performed above and beyond expectations utilising their Surf Lifesaving skills to access and attempt to resuscitate the patient in extremely trying conditions. Without the quick and selfless response of these individuals this could have quite easily turned into a major search operation.

Father and son in deadly surf rescue

A FATHER and son tried in vain to save the life of a rock fisherman in Sydney in choppy seas to fetch a bucket in Sydney's east yesterday.

Off-duty South Maroubra surf lifesavers Graham Toms and his 15-year-old son Lucas dragged the unconscious man, in his 40s, onto a surfboard, but he failed to re-

spond to CPR.

It is the second death of a rock fisherman in Sydney in two weeks, leading to renewed calls from Surf Life Saving Australia (SLSA) for

life jackets to be made mandatory.

The man was fishing with a friend when he got into trouble in "treacherous" con-

ditions. He was not wearing a life jacket.

Brave Graham and Lucas spotted the man in trouble from their house, got changed and went to help.

"There was a bit of swell but Luke led the way. I had fins and a rescue tube, but he (was) on a surfboard — got to this guy within seconds," he said.

"When I got there Lucas had the guy on the board and was giving him mouth to mouth, which we practice at the surf club, but this was the real life stuff.

"I assisted, I did what I could; he was a big guy, he was 100kg plus. We were both struggling.

Lifeguards then arrived on a jetski and rubber ducky and carried on CPR before a helicopter took the man away.

Maroubra resident Alan Smusko, who witnessed the rescue, said the conditions in the water were treacherous.

Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club captain Gilbert Olzomer said it was a known black spot for fishermen.

"We do quite a few rescues there, particularly rock fishermen and surfers on bigger days," he said.

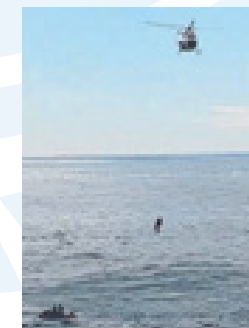
Randwick City Council lifeguards, as well as Maroubra Surf Life Savers, helped in the rescue.

It follows the death of a 42-year-old Kings Langley man who was swept off rocks while fishing at North Curl Curl last Saturday.

Police have urged rock fishermen to wear life jackets and to monitor the ocean for deteriorating conditions.

There have been 24 rock fishing fatalities since the NSW government received a report that recommended making life jackets compulsory in March 2012.

A subsequent SLSA study into rock fishing deaths found that despite years of education campaigns there had been "no significant change in the number of fatalities per year".

On Saturday 18 April 2015 at around 2:30pm, Patrol Captain Don Smith, Nicole 'Nixy' Krite and others saved a male from becoming a quadriplegic after he was dumped by a wave 150 metres south of the flags.

On this day, South Maroubra patrol 6 and Maroubra shared duties due to there only being one flagged area. Nixy who positioned herself at the southern side of the flags while patrolling noticed four surfers carrying an injured person out of the waves towards the sand.

In an instant, Nixy called for Don to assist and both raced down the beach in the ATV while radioing Maroubra lifeguards about the incident. The pair was first on scene to find a 39 year-old male, awake and alert, but not moving and lying on a body board at the edge of the waves surrounded by concerned surfers.

Nixy immediately stabilised the surfer's head while Don questioned and examined him. The male briefly lost consciousness but was quickly revived. He claimed to have heard a crack in his neck and was complaining of pain in his shoulders and pins & needles in his hands.

Don and Nixy assessed that he had a probable neck fracture and should not be moved up the beach until his neck was stabilised in a cervical collar. By this time, three lifeguards, two Maroubra patrol members and a South Maroubra patrol member with a spinal board arrived.

The cervical collar was placed around the male's neck then transferred onto the spinal board and transported to the car park at South Maroubra. Meanwhile, Don notified SurfCom and soon after three ambulance officers arrived and transferred the male to hospital.

The entire rescue was accomplished with the combined resources of South Maroubra, Maroubra and the lifeguards working together. However, it was the quick reaction of Nixy and Don that meant the patient was stabilised within seconds of the injury occurring.

A follow up confirmed the patient had fractured his neck at C1 and C2, but worse injury was avoided due to the timely intervention of all those involved in the rescue.

Director of Youth Report

Delivering the youth program at South Maroubra has been an amazing personal experience. Over the past two years whilst being in charge of the Youth program at the Club, I have been extremely lucky to be surrounded and supported by such a fantastic bunch of people, not just from the Club but also from organisations that support us day in and day out.



The 2014/2015 nipper program at South Maroubra SLSC was successfully delivered in a fun and educative manner; we finished the season with 680 nippers registered, a considerable increase in numbers in comparison to past two seasons and also a considerable number in comparison to the 7,000 nippers registered across the Sydney Branch. The success of this program is a true reflection of the commitment and support of our parents, nippers and volunteers that are part of such a great program.

I believe it is important to recognise the importance of this youth program, the benefits it provides to our community and particularly how it is delivered. The program is 100% delivered by volunteers. Our volunteer workforce is a great asset to our community.

Our nippers participated and proudly represented our Club at numerous Community led activities; I am very proud of how our nippers presented themselves and represented South Maroubra SLSC.

The nipper season started off with a similar calendar as per the previous season. This year the weather was more favourable to us, although water activities were more challenging. We maintained our 100% attendance award, continued with our Twilight nipper day, Nipper Disco, our Nipper Surf Carnival in December and BBQ activities through the season to finish off with the Annual Trivia night.

This season, we welcomed 128 new future lifesavers to our U6s Groups with Emma Devlin and Michael Atherton as their Age Managers. Both supported by our Beach Crew, you guys did an exceptional job managing such big groups and I thank you for your work.

We also sadly farewellled our U14s Young Lifesavers as they've graduated from the program. I wish them the very best in the senior ranks and I thank Sheena Beal and Doug Woods for your support and work for the many years you worked with these nippers. I am sure you have left an impression in these young lifesavers' lives that will last for a lifetime.

Our U8s group managed by Darren McLean and Brett Milsop, both supported by our Beach Crew did an amazing job. Thanks for your commitment and support. The transition from the southern end of the beach and the introduction of new water activities and training was well managed by Darren and Brett. Kids participated and enjoyed thoroughly their nipper Sundays and the new challenges. A large number successfully represented South Maroubra SLSC at several carnivals and Branch, making their parents and the club very proud.

To my Age Managers from U9s to U13s, you did an amazing job leading your groups, the feedback I received from parents



was always extremely positive. I thank you for your commitment and support.

A big thank you to the cadets that came back this year to support and work with our nippers, it is a great experience to see you at the beach sharing and teaching what you have learned through your years as a nipper.

Our focus was on education and further building on lifesaving skills for our young lifesavers at training, we achieved this in a great atmosphere delivering the program in a fun way ensuring our nippers thoroughly enjoyed their time at our beach and club. These activities were complemented by a well-structured and thorough training program.

From the 680 registered Nippers:

- 526 of them have achieved their age appropriate Surf Education award
- 17 Under 13's and 15 Under 12s sat and passed their Resuscitation Certificate
- 8 Under 14's completed their Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and are now on active patrols

The Nipper committee endorsed and sent children from the Under 11's and under 13's groups to the Sydney Branch Nipper development camps. These young lifesavers at training learnt valuable leadership skills whilst also improving and learning new lifesaving skills, all delivered in a well organised program where nippers from all the Sydney Branch clubs worked as a team.

As for our parents:

- A large number of parents completed their Bronze Medallions or SRCs
- Several completed their IRB certificates (Crewman or Driver)
- 40 parents attended and completed their Age Managers course

These parents will form part of our volunteer workforce and for some aside from being on active patrols at our beach, they will also support our nippers at the Beach, being water safety or being part of our famous 'Beach Crew'.

The dedication of the Club training officers and are to be commended in helping our future lifesavers and parents learn more about the surf, beach conditions and valuable lifesaving skills.

The program wouldn't be here without Nippers, they would not be at the beach without the parents and carers, and the program

couldn't be delivered without our volunteers or with the support and commitment of our Club Directors.

It is important to recognise the people involved in delivering the program and the enormous amount of work that is put in to deliver it successfully, as soon as the season finishes, preparation and planning for the following season commences. The commitment and efforts of these volunteers is amazing and most of the time will go unnoticed.

To my nipper parents, I sincerely thank you for your support, efforts and commitment; you play an instrumental role in the success of our program. I would like to thank the members of my Executive team, my Assistant Director – Sophie Dyson, my Nipper Registrar – Michelle Lo and my Gear Steward – Paul Ryan. Thanks to you all for your time, support and commitment, you guys make my role so much easier.

This Season's nipper training program was thorough and provided a more flexible approach, allowing working parents/carers to take advantage of the program for their children. Water training attendance was huge; we had a large number of children attending Surf swimming as well as Board training, this reflected on the improved skills our nippers showed at our normal nipper days as well as competitions.

To our swim coach, Kim McJannett, I thank you for your guidance, support and encouragement.

To our board coaches Laurence Last, Ray Robinson and Karen Hardy, I thank you for your dedication, support and guidance, the large numbers attending training is a testament to the great work you deliver.



To our sand coaches, Phil Dutton and Max Murphy, I thank you for your guidance, patience and time.

To our wade coach, Nathan Goldschmidt, I thank you for your commitment and support, training a large number of U8s is a mammoth task and you deliver it marvellously.

To all coaches, thanks again for all your efforts, time and patience with our nippers. It is such a rewarding experience, especially



when you see these nippers building their self-esteem whilst learning and improving their lifesaving skills.

To Dennis Clarke and his patrol team assigned every nipper Sunday, as well, as Michael Fernandez and his IRB team that supported all nipper activities, I thank you.

To my amazing Beach Crew team, the support you provide to the Age Manager and Nippers is amazing. I thank you for your commitment, time, persistence and patience. The work and time you put in the development of our young lifesavers at training is invaluable.

Packing and unpacking the beach is a task that many of you are not familiar with and not an easy one, 7AM on a Sunday morning is a norm for our gear steward and support team followed by the pack up which is completed an hour or so after the last nippers have left the beach. I'd like to recognise and thank Paul Ryan, Brett Milsop and Justin Lo for your support and dedication, you guys rock!

This season we proudly represented our club at several events across the Sydney Branch, Northern Braches and Illawarra Branch. Our nippers ought to be commended as wherever they participated, they managed to leave a great image of our club. These young lifesavers represented South Maroubra SLSC with pride, always showing sportsmanship, fairness and camaraderie.

Sydney Branch was hosted by Maroubra SLSC for the second year in a row. Water events at Maroubra beach were cancelled due to poor conditions placing focus on all sand events, although we missed on achieving placing in water, we managed to secure great results in sand. Well done to all nippers that attended.

Umina Beach was the host of the 2015 State Championships; South Maroubra SLSC was represented by 70 talented young lifesavers led by our Junior Captains: Shannel Ryan-Last and Meg Woods.

The team was managed by our Team Manager – Lawrence Last, and supported by our club's Officials, Water Safety and IRB team, and of course the Age Managers and Parents that supported the team throughout the weekend.



Conditions weren't so favourable to the competitors, although the determination and perseverance of our nippers paid off. From 150 competing clubs, South Maroubra SLSC placed 5th in the State with 110 points, what an outstanding achievement! A Club record!

The team atmosphere, camaraderie and the way our children conducted themselves during the event were outstanding.

Congratulations to the whole team that participated, you made us proud. Well done.

Presentation days were conducted as per our season calendar and we made use of the new rooms at our Club house; our young U6s and U7s were presented with their medals, certificates and awards, what a great day we had.

It was followed several weeks later by the presentation to the rest of the nipper group, the day was filled with excitement and fun, and it was great to present the well-deserved awards, certificates and medals.

Congratulations to the nippers that were awarded with their 100%, 200%, 300%+ attendance trophies, a well-deserved award for such commitment.

Congratulations to all nippers that were awarded point scoring trophies, and also the nippers that were nominated and received the Coaches awards.

Congratulations to Shannel Ryan-Last and Robbie Beal, our Club Girl and Club Boy.

The Bruce Rutherford Memorial Award for the most outstanding female nipper of the season was awarded to Madeline Hardy, a well-deserved recipient, Congratulations Maddy!

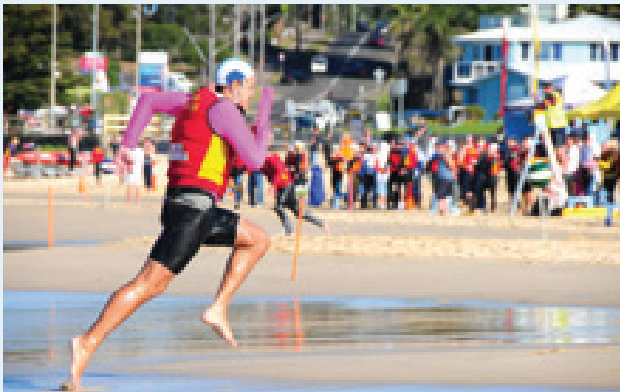

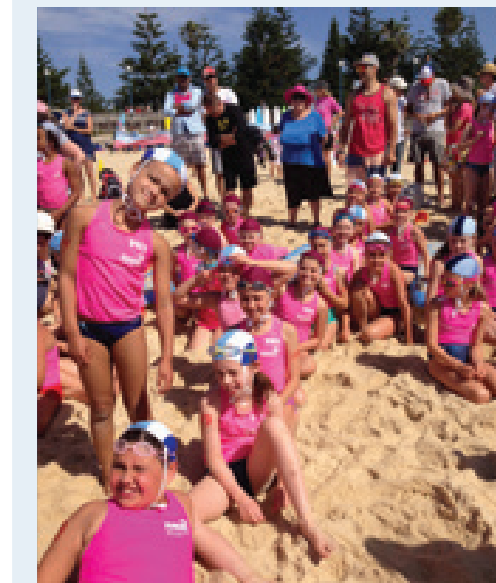
