How great is it to see the parents come on board and join in the clubs activities eventually to become those leading the club. 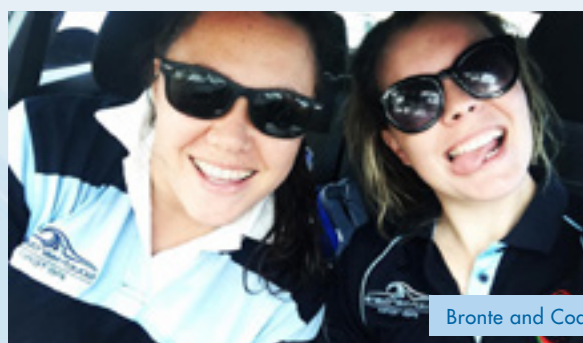

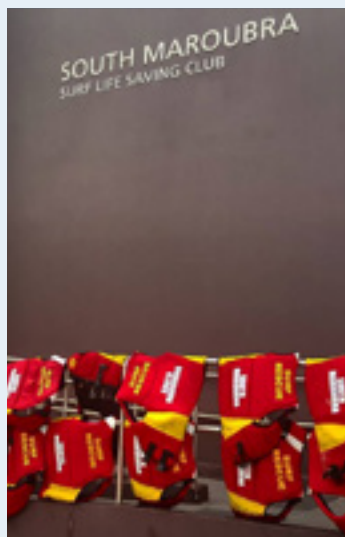

Director of Finance Report

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club for period 2015/16. At the completion of the financial season the club is showing a small operating profit of \$2,527 compared to last season operating loss of \$133,296.

REVENUES

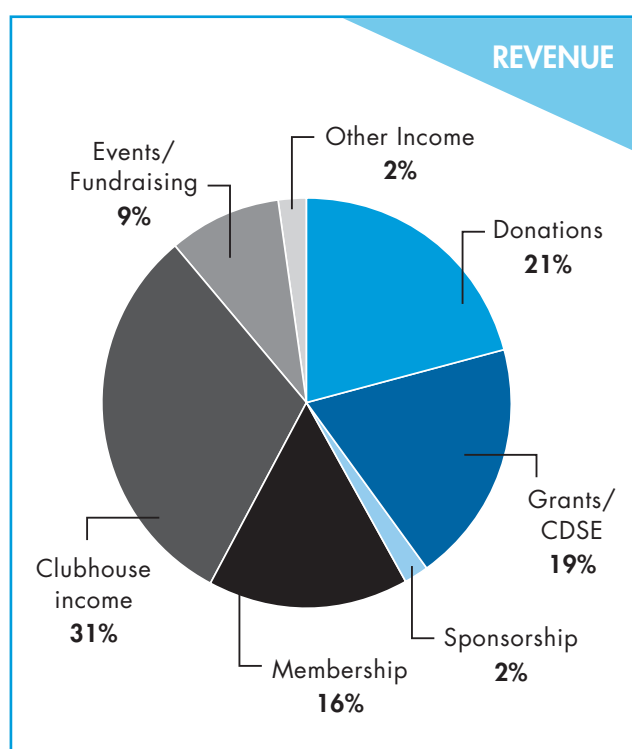
As per previous seasons the club relied on traditional sources of income – memberships, donations, sponsorships/grants & club activities. This season we experienced a growth in our general clubhouse income which includes revenue from the hire of the clubhouse Heritage room.

This season completed the 3rd year of our contractual association with Top Cat Catering and their Lease of the clubhouse's Horizons Lounge.

There is a substantial negative differential from last season recorded against our donation income explainable by last season's (2015) 'one off' donations made towards our (now completed) clubhouse renovation projects. Revenue also slightly contracted compared to last year in the areas of fundraising and membership.

Membership decreased by approx 100 this season with a slight decrease in both juniors and open membership categories. This is consistent with membership levels and trends throughout other Sydney clubs.

EXPENDITURE

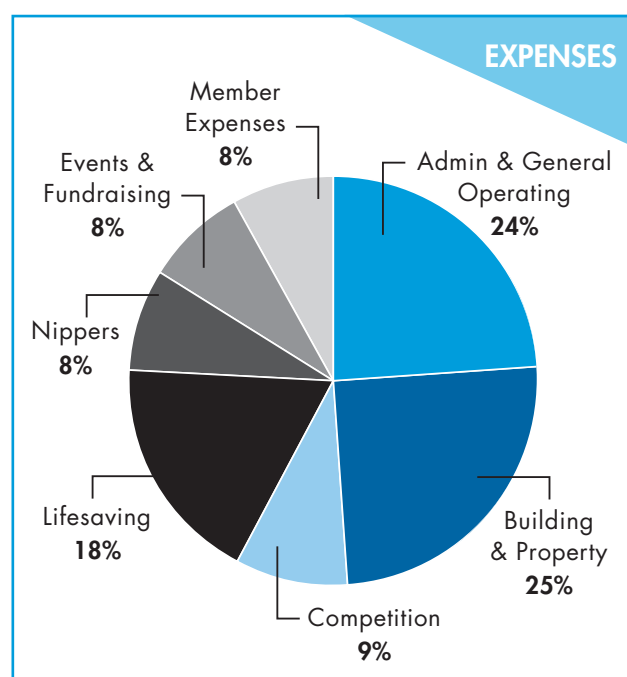
The Clubhouse Building and Admin/General operations of the club make up the major contributor of the clubs expenses for the season. Throughout the year the Board elected to carry out a number of small clubhouse upgrades including the renovation of the buildings front entrance, ground to first floor tiling and a revamp of the clubs gymnasium (totalling \$50,000).

Big ticket lifesaving equipment purchases, funded from the CDSE grants, included a new ATV, IRB and final payment of the Patrol Tower.

Following on from last season the Board continued the employment of part time administration/office staff to assist the Board Directors in the deployment of their duties and to man the club office. The decrease in overall expenditure for the season compared to last is determined by the 2015 expense of the Heritage room major clubhouse renovation.

The Heritage Lounge function space, run by the club, continues to provide a stream of income. This coming season we will be looking at the feasibility of building on our booking portfolio for this room however consideration & planning for precise management of bar staff, cleaning and stock will determine our ability to increase usage of the room.

FUNCTIONS, EVENTS AND FUNDRAISING

The club continued with its traditional fundraising projects throughout the past year including the successful running of the Oktoberfest, South Maroubra Carnival, Sportsman Day, Golf Day and Trivia Night. It was great to support the 'boaties' new fundraising initiative of hosting a State of Origin members night. Thanks to our Club Licensee Gus Taylor, Caretaker Barry Osborne, Bar Staff, Warrick Bullen (Oktoberfest), Yvette and Linda Perrin (Sth Maroubra Carnival), Jack Shaw (Golf Day), Paul Fownes (Sportsman Day), Michelle Lo (Trivia), Phil Stivano (State of Origin Night) and members that contributed to the running of these events.

A large number of club member activities were also conducted including Gold Members/Associates Function, Start, Mid and End of Season lifesaving get togethers, Nippers disco and twilight bbq's, Christmas Scramble together with numerous nipper and member Sunday socials and bbq's. Expenditure on member functions increased slightly this year as did Touring Team expenditure as the clubs Board approved additional club contributions for our nipper, state and national touring teams budgets. Thanks to our Board Directors, Club Officers and members who supported and assisted our fundraising and member activities with a special shout out to our Social Coordinators Codie Wem and Nicole Cooney.

SPONSORSHIP, DONATIONS AND GRANTS

Through the long standing support of the Souths Junior RLFC our club was again successful in securing funds from the CDSE (Randwick ClubGRANTS Scheme) \$45,000 allowing for the purchase of vital lifesaving equipment, apparel and education materials. Randwick City and Botany Bay City Councils also honoured long standing agreements with the club and continued their grants to assist the club with expenses related to the building and administration. Acknowledgment also the Maroubra Seals Club for their continued sponsorship and support of our club. Further on in the Annual Report is a list and acknowledgment to all of our club sponsors and supporters where we pass on our sincere thanks and gratitude.

In closing, I believe the club is addressing the changing financial and operating dynamics that our surf club, along with many others, are currently facing. I have delivered a solar panel proposal to the Board which I believe will substantially reduce our \$18,000 annual electricity costs. A number of government grant applications are underway to secure funds for the upgrade of the Heritage room kitchen, provision of window and door shutters to protect the building against the severe 'southerly and east coast low' weather that hits our doors and results in water damage to the club together with a scope document for our club to host an ocean swim.



I have really enjoyed being part of the club's membership and committee this past season, working together to provide and develop our Surf Rescue capability, member facilities and membership value, all anchored by a first class Nipper program, has made for an exciting and successful year.

Thank you to Michelle Lo and June Burgess for all your assistance in the club office. To Kelly Nichols for her invaluable and expert guidance in the preparation of the financial figures for the club Auditor. Well done to Paul Fownes and Linda Perrin for their additional efforts as members of the Board of Management. You are all stars.

Notes to and forming part of the accounts

For the year ended 30 April 2016

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

No other applicable Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issues Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provision of the Income Tax Act.

Building

The building in which the club is situated is shown in the accounts as having a value of \$706,200. In the event of termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Events Subsequent to Balance Date

There were no significant occurring after balance date.

Cash Flow Information

The Club has no credit stand-by or finance facilities in place.

Insurance

A public Liability Insurance Policy is held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in lifesaving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

Fundraising Activities

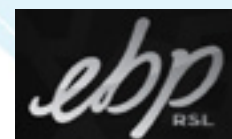

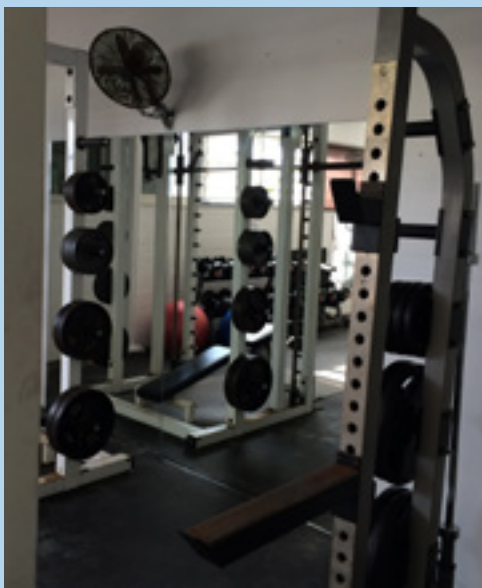
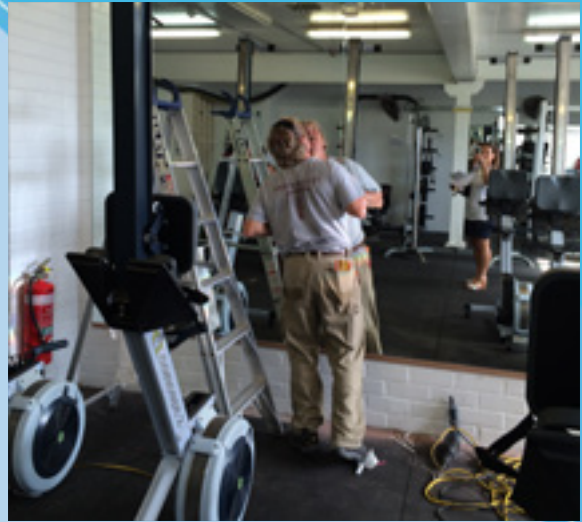

Our program of improvement whilst continuing in the past season, was a little more discrete. I am able to report that the following projects were delivered on behalf of members.

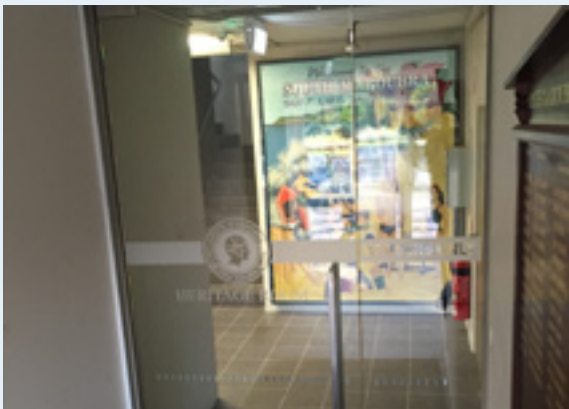
- 1) Completion of the upgraded gymnasium which will see a more modern, clean and spacious room which will hold us in good stead on the fitness front.

We probably need to source in the order of \$250k to complete these projects so any support would be of great benefit.

Director of Lifesaving Report

As per usual, the 2015/16 season saw all our lifesavers put to the test in keeping our stretch of beach safe.



We saw a large number of hot and busy days at South Maroubra this season which was welcomed by all considering the large number of closed beach and rainy days we had over the previous season. The result however naturally meant busy times were had by all our members as hot day's equal lots of people.

The season saw our patrol teams complete a total of 159 rescues with a bulk of them coming from the IRB and board in mostly large and dangerous surf conditions. The quality of rescues that have been performed through the season are a massive credit to all our lifesavers and the effort they put in to their training and maintaining such a high level of skill and rescue capability.

As has been the trend of late, we had a couple of fairly big mass rescues this last season which resulted in our lifesavers being pushed to their physical limits to ensure the safety of each and every person that was in trouble. A number of these mass rescues were caused by flash rips that popped up and dragged swimmers well past the break in a matter of seconds. It is comforting for me, that when things take a really bad turn, we have the members on the beach that can step in to turn it around and keep the public safe.

The beginning of this season saw the introduction of a new observation tower which has proven to be very helpful in maintaining a clear and unobstructed view of the beach from a distance. The tower aided in spotting a number of rescues in big surf conditions that would normally be quite hard to see from down on the beach. On closed beach day we have used this tower as a control centre for IRB and ATV activity. We had one rescue this year when we just could not see the patient from the beach due to wave height. The rescue was performed by an IRB and the patrol captain in the

tower communicating patient position via radio.

Once again, Cathie Hall and her education team did a tremendous job in training our new Bronzie's and SRC's, along with further education members through advanced awards. The numbers on our Bronze courses were down a little, however this is something we will look to recover in the upcoming season through a recruitment drive. The emphasis on the 2015/16 season was to get our members through some of the advanced lifesaving awards such as the Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, Spinal Management, ARTC and Beach Management. These awards give our members added and advanced skills and allow us to further build the lifesaving ranks on what is already a very solid foundation.

All of the training and the consistent high quality of candidates that have been produced over the last few years would not have been possible without the work of Cathie Hall and her team. The work they do and the countless hours they put in while still fulfilling their patrolling duties is second to none. Thank you to all our trainers for the continued hard work and dedication you put into it.

Thank you to all our sponsors for your support to lifesaving and keeping our beach safe over this last season. Special thanks to our major sponsors of South Juniors, Maroubra Seals and Randwick Labour club. Due to their continuous support we have been lucky enough this year to acquire a much needed All terrain Vehicle (ATV) and Achilles Solid hull inflatable rescue boat (IRB) and addiction support equipment.

Finally, thank you to my lifesaving committee – ADOL Ronny Krite, Lifesaving Registrar & First Aid Officer Kelly Nichols, IRB coordinator Michael Fernandez, Gear Coordinator Ken Hudson, Education Coordinator Cathie Hall and all the Patrol Captains for the continued work you put in to getting lifesaving into the position it is in at the moment. Without the help and support from each of you we wouldn't have achieved nearly as much as we have.

Lastly, but certainly not least, thank you to each and every patrolling member. Without your commitment and drive to keeping our beach safe each weekend over the summer season, we don't have a surf club. The work you do down there and the effort you put in certainly does not go unnoticed. Keep up the good work.

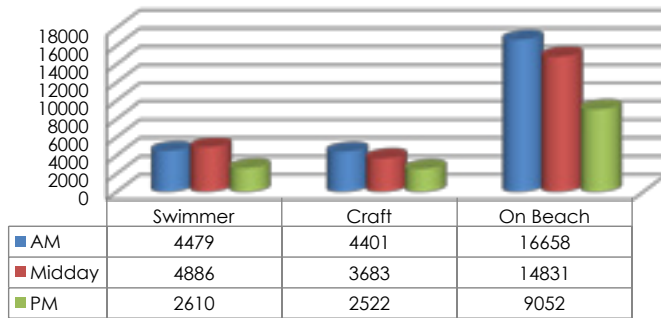

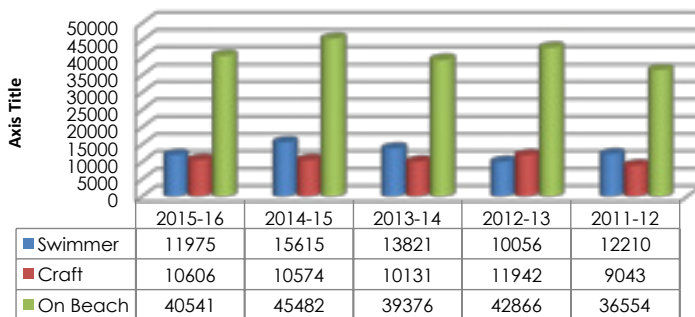

South Maroubra Patrol Statistics 2015-2016

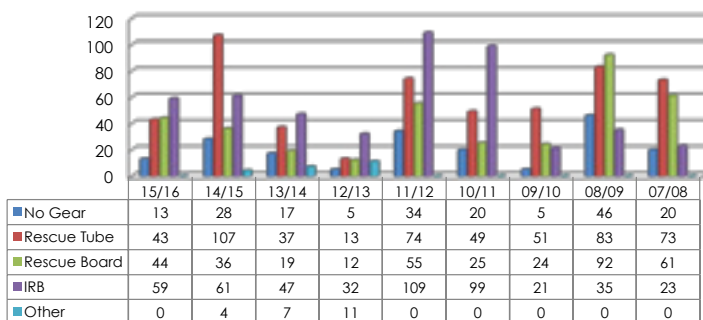
Beach Attendance 2015-2016



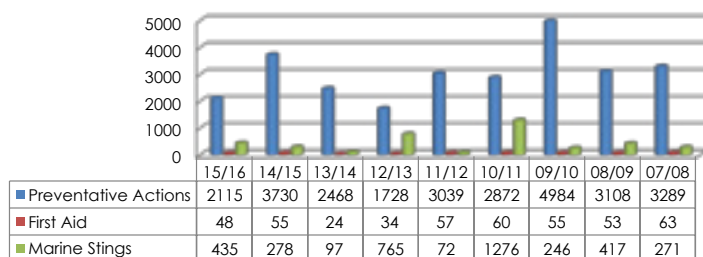
5 year Comparison - Beach Attendance



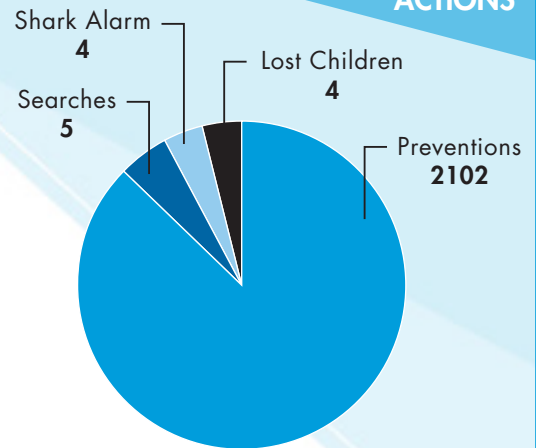
Rescue Comparison for the 9 Years



Other Comparison for 9 Years

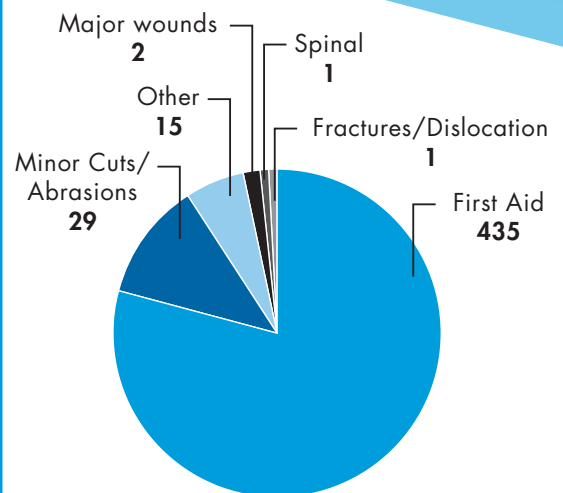

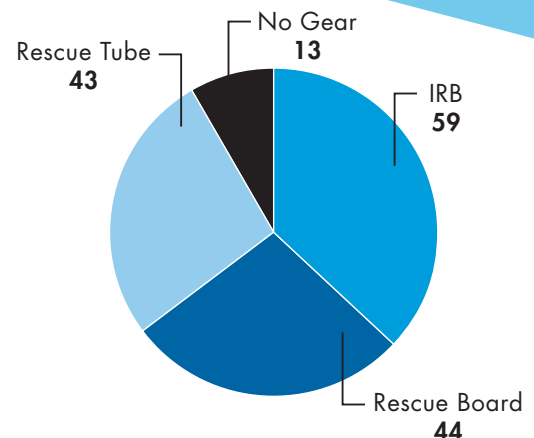

RESCUE OF THE MONTH

South Maroubra SLSC July/August 2015

Lifesavers Involved: Damien Woods, Michael Fernandez and Christopher Maloney

On Sunday 9 August at 10:30am, South Maroubra clubbies and a Maroubra lifeguard rescued a rock fisherman from Malabar Headland who had fallen and broken his leg.

On this morning, South Maroubra surf lifesavers were preparing for the new season gear inspection and were informed that a fisherman had fallen off a rock ledge.

As the location of the fisherman was unknown at the time, South Maroubra's IRB was launched by Christopher Maloney, Michael Fernandez and Damien Woods. Once in the water, the male was located at Malabar Headland without a lifejacket and his condition was unknown due to the lack of visibility.

Damien and a Maroubra lifeguard who was following entered the water and reached the fisherman via the rocks. Once the pair reached the rock ledge, Michael and Christopher returned to shore and grabbed the first aid kit and oxy-viva, and made their way back to the fisherman on foot.

Back at the scene, Damien and the lifeguard provided some initial first aid by splinting the leg and looking after the male as he was in shock after falling four metres. Michael and Christopher arrived at the scene after running 15 minutes around to the headland. They carefully made their way down to the rocks and administered oxygen and first aid to the male.

Christopher, Damien and Michael stayed with the patient until the NSW Ambulance Rescue Helicopter arrived and winched the fisherman to a nearby reserve. He was stabilised and subsequently driven by paramedics to hospital.

The abundance of hot weather days in conjunction with the large crowds kept all our lifesavers extremely busy performing a total 159 rescues, 59 of which were completed by our IRB crews.



To have over 1/3 of our rescues performed by the IRB goes to show how important this piece of equipment is to saving lives, especially on a beach like South Maroubra. It is a massive credit to our IRB drivers and crew who often find themselves going out in some very testing conditions.

This season saw 18 new crews and 11 new drivers join the ranks which was a really impressive to see. I wanted to bring up the total number of new drivers and crews we put through each season for the last couple of years and this year we finally put through a really strong number, both in quantity and quality. This tremendous result wouldn't have been possible if it wasn't for our IRB trainers who between them all ran 4 courses throughout the season. It has been great to watch these new drivers and crews go on to perform a number of IRB rescues throughout the season, which again is a massive credit to themselves and their trainers.

Thank you to all the IRB members that assisted with water safety at different carnivals and events this season. It is never an easy task and can make for a very long day on the water. The effort you all put in and the time you dedicate has certainly not gone unnoticed.

Finally, thank you to all our IRB drivers and crew for the work you do over the season. I made mention of it all in the above, but being an IRB member is not just about patrols. There is

so much more work that goes on around it with water safety events, training, competition and gear maintenance just to name a few. If it wasn't for your commitment and dedication, we would have the large section that we see today.

To my Age Managers from U9s to U13s, you did an amazing job leading your groups, the feedback I received from parents was always extremely positive. I thank you for your commitment and support.

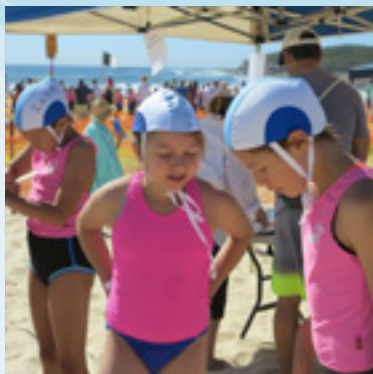

Life Membership – Ken Hudson

Life Membership awarded July 2015 – South Maroubra Annual General Meeting.

Ken Hudson's involvement with South Maroubra began back in the early 1980's when his kids joined and were active for a few years.

In his early days Ken like many parents was there primarily for his kids and was just another face around the Club who was becoming increasingly interested in how the place ticked, or as many of us have seen, not ticked too well. He quickly saw there were short comings in areas he could assist with being an experienced man in the area of motor mechanics, engines, etc and professionally, a highly respected Vehicle Inspector with the NRMA.

It didn't take too long for Ken to see in those early days that the club was experiencing problems in maintaining and servicing Inflatable Rescue Boat equipment, particularly in those early days when equipment wasn't entirely suitable for surf conditions, stored in a dingy small room with limited tools and maintained by relatively young members that were great lifesavers but not so good on the tools.

Club records show that in 1988 Ken joined South Maroubra as an Associate member.

Of interest in this life member nomination is that Ken has never patrolled South Maroubra beach or any other beach for that matter. He doesn't hold a Bronze Medallion award or SRC either. But what Ken has done for this club, Surf Lifesaving Sydney, NSW and Australia makes him one of the best lifesavers within this Country and indirectly responsible for many lives being saved on Maroubra Beach and all around Australia.

If you don't know Ken you may well ask how can this be so?

While Ken is a quiet unassuming man behind the scenes who you see each week busily working away at all times of the day and night, sorting, repairing or cleaning IRB equipment, packing, repairing, drying club tents and equipment for the next patrol or carnival he is also a bloke who is quick to put his hand up when he sees a problem, a person struggling, a drama that he might be able to offer practical advice or some physical assistance with, he's one of those rare gentlemen prepared to get his hands dirty for any just and proper cause for the betterment of our club.

His love for the club and lifesaving generally is quite apparent to me and many others within this club and outside. He's the first to put his hand up to run around and pick up gear anywhere at any time often travelling to all parts of this City, State and Nation at his own expense and inconvenience for the benefit of all those mentioned previously. He's happy to be part of internal and external committees including the annual Chamber of Commerce Fun

Run committee when most of us run for the hills to avoid it.

He's constantly picking up bits and pieces from hardware stores all around Sydney, checking out ebay and gum tree or popping into Disposal stores for the latest tent prices and frames or locksmiths for a bunch of new keys. If you don't catch him there you'll catch him purchasing boating or engine parts or petrol or checking out prices for a vacuum cleaners or ice machines and then picking them up and delivering them to his club. He's chalked up plenty of mileage in his car, normally with his trailer in tow and also chalked up plenty of mileage on his credit card, for and on behalf of the club much to the shock and horror of the Board of Management but nevertheless purchasing necessary equipment for one section or another.

Whilst I would often shudder seeing Ken walk into the club office with his long list of monthly expenses and purchases, we'd know that there was an equally long list of things that he had purchased for the club at his own expense never asking or expecting reimbursement.

Whether its picking up discarded sand from the tiled area in front of the club, mowing the grass, clearing out over grown bushes, wacking in star pickets in overflow car park, setting up or pulling down for Octoberfest, Fun Run, Junior Carnival, preparing carnival IRBs, working with the IRB Touring Team group over many years, carrying out scrutineering, officiating at carnivals, involved in realigning the storage and Lifesaving rooms you'll find Ken somewhere nearby working alone as nothing was too much trouble.

Ken is a most valued Associate Member of the Club, his contribution in so many areas but particularly his expertise in ongoing maintenance and repair of equipment within the IRB section has no doubt saved the Club many thousands of dollars, saved lives and helped develop many many young and talented lifesavers many of whom remain with the club today.

The many daring rescues utilising gear and equipment and many preventative actions over the years can also be directly connected to Ken, his maintenance program, skill and dedication. All of the gear used in lifesaving from the beach buggy, to trailers, boards, tubes, tents, radios whistles and all the gear used for weekly patrols is normally purchased and maintained by this man.

Maintaining our Club equipment is an unenviable, demanding and critical role and one that Ken takes very seriously and has done for 8 continuous years.

Who else could we rely on to do what he does whilst also dealing with some pretty demanding situations, working

around 6 years of renovations and disruption to club operations, dealing with a growing and at times prickly couple of people in the IRB section who according to Ken are sometimes a little self focused as opposed to team focused, something that irks Ken but he continues on. Who else would hang tents out in his yard to repair or dry them, walk about the club with his former beloved dog to make sure all is AOK and club locked up, acts as a peacemaker when the odd falling out occurs, there to support the caretaker when problems have developed over the years, be involved in sponsorship issues, fundraising functions, club improvements and carnivals, the list just goes on.

Ken has been nominated and recognised as Associate of the Year of the Club over many years, which is further evidence of the high respect he is held within the Club and recognising the outstanding volunteer membership of our Club. In 2006/07 season Ken was awarded the Club's Honour Blazer which he wears with pride.

To be eligible for Life Membership of our Club, you either need to have performed an exceptional act of bravery in saving or attempting to save a life, or at least 15 years SA, AR, LS or Associate membership during which you have rendered outstanding service to the Club. I would submit the 27 years service to South Maroubra SLSC of Ken Hudson goes well above and beyond what could normally be expected from any member and well and truly reaches and passes the threshold required to be awarded the great honour of Life Member of South Maroubra SLSC.

Thank you Ken for your service and being a wonderful friend, supporter and gentleman to your club for the past 27 years and we look forward to many more with you.

Honour Blazer – Damien Woods

Honour Blazer awarded July 2015 – South Maroubra Annual General Meeting.

Damien has been a member of South Maroubra Surf Club for well over 15 years.

He has accrued a total of 435.5 patrolling hours with South Maroubra. Damien has completed in the Surf Boat and IRB section obtaining countless, Branch, State and Australian medals and also one World gold medal for South Maroubra. He has been a driving force in keeping the IRB competition section at the high level it is now.

Damien has also served on the Competition, IRB, Lifesaving and Board of Management committees. In 2014 Damien worked on the South Maroubra carnivals volunteers committee. He has been instrumental in developing the South Maroubra call out team to ensure every patrol has the backup required on patrol should an emergency arise.

Damien has received his 15year National Service Award, 5 years coaching award and his Trainer's certificate showing the dedication and time he has put into patrols, training and coaching. Damien has spent hours and hours not only in the summer training boats crew but also all through the winter training the IRB crews.

Over the last 2 seasons Damien has taken on the task of Director of Lifesaving and with a young family this has been a huge commitment often sacrificing spending time with his family. He has accrued 82.75 patrolling hours in this last season alone and has spent countless hours attending Lifesaving and BOM meetings, organizing patrol teams and roster, and filling in the gaps on patrol when they were short.

Damien has a passion to make South Maroubra patrolling members confident and well skilled in the water and to make sure each patrol has the strengths required to be an effective patrol in all conditions. The last 4 bronze squads I have trained Damien has come along to the water sessions to provide coaching with the boards to ensure our new members have as much skill and confidence to do a boards rescue as possible. When Damien isn't patrolling, coaching, attending meetings or helping with Bronze squads you will often find him fixing equipment particularly in the IRB shed.

Over the last 2 season in his role as Director of Lifesaving Damien has provided me with an immense amount of support and backup in my role as Education Coordinator. Whenever I needed extra help Damien would either jump in or find someone to assist me. Many club members often complain about things not running as well as they could in Lifesaving but rarely offer help or a solution. Damien stepped up and took on the enormous role of Director of Lifesaving to try and better our club and improve the standard of Lifesaving we provide at South Maroubra often at great personal sacrifice to his young family.

I hope you will agree that Damien would be worthy recipient of the South Maroubra Honour Blazer for 2015.

Story of South Maroubra's Bert Tuck captures imagination

The story of Bert Tuck, South Maroubra Surf Club committeeman and lifesaver in the early days who fought at Gallipoli, has captured the imagination of many current and former members of the club. In March, the story was outlined by former club secretary Geoff Starkey at the surf club at a well-attended reunion.

News has now been received that Sergeant Albert Victor Tuck, a member of the first South Maroubra Surf Club in 1907-1908, is to be included in the Fallen Lifesavers' Memorial at Coogee beach following a positive recommendation from Surf Life Saving NSW's historian.

Bert Tuck's story was revealed when associate member Bob Wurth was researching the history of the first South Maroubra Surf Club in 1907-1908. Geoff Starkey and a South Maroubra boatie from the sixties, Jim (Jet) Jackson, were the first to honour Bert Tuck when they made a special trip to pay their respects at the Australian War Memorial in Canberra.

On Anzac Day 2015 Bert Tuck was honoured with a small ceremony at Shell Green cemetery on Gallipoli by former South Maroubra boatie Gary Gavegan and members of Gary's Mollymook boat crew, saying: "...it was with pride that we laid the wreath on his grave and I gave a short service thanking our hero for his services to his country and fighting with his mates in such diabolical and extraordinary circumstances." The boat crew had just completed a marathon surfboat row around the Gallipoli peninsula and had landed at Anzac Cove. Earlier in 2014 another former South Maroubra member Joe Knight Smith had travelled to Albany in his home state of Western Australia to attend the re-enactment of the troop ships leaving Australia. Joe laid a Rosette on the water of harbour to honour Bert Tuck and those who had sailed away to the war from Albany on the troopship HMAS Euripides.

Bert Tuck was killed at Gallipoli on 26 April 1915, the day after the initial landing at what became known as Anzac Cove.

Documents in the Mitchell Library in Sydney show that on 15 February 1908 Tuck, then aged twenty six, had been elected to the committee of South Maroubra Surf Club at a meeting in the NSW Sports Club presided over by club president Dr Cedric Bowker. Tuck was selected with others to compete at the Bondi surf gymkhana at the 'Wonderland City' venue, Tamarama beach, in April 1908.

When war came, Bert Tuck, thirty four, signed up on 17 August 1914, thirteen days after Britain declared war on Germany. He joined the 4th Australian Infantry Battalion and sailed from Sydney to Egypt with his D company on 20 October 1914 on the troopship, HMAS Euripides. The 4th Battalion would be held back waiting a day off Gallipoli to become the second and third waves to go ashore on the morning of 26 April.

His death was reported by Major James Heane, but the details were hazy. Australian newspapers in August 1915 reported that Albert Tuck was leading a bayonet charge when shot.

Research is continuing into other South Maroubra members of 1907-1908 who were thought to have been killed in the First World War.
