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# CHAIRMAN'S REPORT



It is my pleasure to present to you the 2017/18 annual report, a season where we as a club have achieved so much on so many fronts resulting in the recognition and recent awarding of the prestigious

award which I must say has a very nice ring to it and there's plenty of good reason why South Maroubra took out the distinguished title.

Here's a snap shot into the year that was the 2017/18 season!

### LIFESAVING

Our core business being Lifesaving have delivered a solid year of performance on the beach and in the water with 'No Lives Lost' and a whole lot of great lifesavers recruited and trained up. Throughout the season our lifesavers carried out 101 **Rescues** and 3153 **Preventative actions**, 556 **First Aid** cases and delivered 7671 **Patrol hours**.

Our lifesaving and Education Team recognises we need to continue to build the number of lifesavers whilst broadening the skills base on the beach and in the water. So, in the lifesaving space, a big tick and thank you to the entire lifesaving team led by DOL Damien Woods, Ronny Krite, Nicole Cooney, Michael Fernandez, Patrol Captains and Instructors who provide the leadership each week necessary to get the job done. As stated lifesaving is our core business and as such it remains all of our responsibility to build and support the members in red and yellow. On a sad note Damien will be standing down as Director of Lifesaving after a number of years in the job but is sure to continue to support and build South Maroubra moving forward just in a different way.

## YOUTH/NIPPERS

We had big numbers, with up to 700 at one-point, with great parent participation and generally a comprehensive Surf Education Program which was successfully concluded in March. Tenth place overall at the NSW State Championships for Competition, and we have growing numbers of officials and quality coaches. The highlight this season was certainly staring in the ABC ME 14 part series of **Nippers**, which reflected well on the entire Lifesaving and Nipper Community, and still available on ABC (ME) iview in case you missed it. Nippers continues to be an area within our club where there is so much scope for continued development, sponsorship and growth so another big tick and well done to the entire leadership and support group.

Running Nippers is a massive job and can only be carried out with the cooperation and involvement of committed leaders which comes in the form of parents and supporters getting their hands dirty and becoming involved. I was thrilled to see a whole lot of nipper parents obtain their Bronze qualification and not only carrying out water safety with the kids but supporting our surf patrols as well. Well done to you all!!

On a side note Marcelo our Director of Youth will be stepping down at the end of this year, I'd very much like to thank Marcelo on a sterling effort leading and building our Youth section. Marcelo will continue in the Youth space at Branch level and sure to remain involved at our club. Thank you, Marcelo!

### COMPETITION

This season we saw new Director of Competition Tom McJannett take on this challenging job which he carried out with gusto and interest, and whilst we have a long way to go in building diversity in competition, we are on the right path.



# ADMINISTRATION

Next season Tom and I along with other clubs in Randwick District will be looking at a new coaching structure where we join with other nearby clubs to offer increased opportunity.

Boat Captain Phil is busily building our boat section with some exciting developments to be presented to the membership early next season, our IRB section are fully into their competition season with some positive results and new touring management team. With new equipment coming we are sure that this very important section will continue to thrive. The boards and skis section has seen a revival led by a group of dedicated trainers and up and coming young competitors. Club stalwart Shane White with a group of Masters Competitors acting as coaches has formed a fantastic partnership with our up and coming kids to form a really exciting and growing group of ski and board paddlers. I really hope we can continue to support and develop this important group.

# RETENTION, DIVERSITY AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Yes, you guessed it we ticked the box here as we are blessed to have a diverse and multicultural membership base that continues to grow. We are a place where everyone is welcome to participate in the many activities that we run annually whether it be Sunday socials with nipper parents and Water Safety after Sunday activities, participating in skills development opportunities for our Juniors, determining and building the right competition opportunities for the club and in doing so addressing the issue of attracting and retaining adolescence and young adults who remain a challenge in terms of retention. We participate in countless internal and external aquatic activities and in doing so support the broader Sydney Community in particular charity groups, whilst continuing to build lines of funding for the club through planned events. # VICE CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

The season has once again been a rewarding one for our Club with many highlights and achievements which our sections will report on throughout the report. In the Vice Chair position, my contribution to the Club is mainly project driven by the BOM and a support role to my fellow Directors and their committees.



Two major projects have been tasked by the BOM, that being a review of the Constitution and of course the Memorabilia Project.

Our Club's current Constitution 2011 is outdated and lacking relevance in some areas for the many changes within Surf Life Saving. The Constitution Committee has been tasked to prepare an updated and more current constitution and produce a separate Regulations document for the Club incorporating a list of recommendations of change from Board of Management. I would like to recognise the members of this sub-committee who have put in months and months of research to come up with the best options for the Club to recognise and display its history. To Ken Arthur, Paul Duffy, Peter Murphy and John Park, thank you very much for your persistence and perseverance with this project. The Surf Club Gym has continued to provide an opportunity for members to work-out and keep fit. We do encourage members to use this great facility and purchase a Gym Membership each year. Patrolling members are offered this facility at a discounted rate. # **Bill Haigh**

Life Patron of South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club

On the 15th November, 2017 we were saddened to hear of the passing of Bill Haigh, Life Patron of South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club at the age of 93.



Born in Liverpool, England on the 25th May 1924, Bill immigrated with his parents to Australia and was educated at Malabar Public School. Bill worked at Bunnerong Power Station from 1948 to 1959. He was elected as an Alderman to Randwick Municipal Council in 1956, serving two terms as Mayor from 1962 to 1968. He remains the longest continuous serving Mayor of Randwick.

Bill was elected as Member for Maroubra and entered State Parliament in 1968 where he served a further 15 years. He served as Minister Assisting the Premier from 1976 to 1978, Minister for Services 1977 to 1978 and as Minister for Corrective services from 1978 to 1981.

Bill Haigh loved our Club, which he recounted many times. He was always willing to help with advice and guidance and substantial support when needed. The South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club building was officially opened by The Honourable W.H Haigh together with Club President T.J. Dynan on Sunday 26 October 1969. The plaque commemorating this event now adorns the wall of the Clubhouse adjacent the front entranceway. South Maroubra had no greater friend in those difficult early years than William Henry 'Bill' Haigh.

Bill was a people person and was well loved and respected in the community as well as by our Club members. He has left behind a wonderful legacy.

# John Ludlow

On 23 May 2018 we were sadden with the news of the passing of Life Member John Ludlow. John was a foundation member of the Club who gave over 50 years of patrol service on the beach and held many key positions within the Club during his decades of membership right through to his passing. John gained his Bronze Medallion award on 29 March 1953.



John was instrumental in many areas of the Club especially with clubhouse building in the early days. John Ludlow was the Dolphins Winter Swimming Club – the longest serving President, an achievement which I doubt will be surpassed by any other President. Within the Surf Club John held positions including Vice Cub Captain, Club Captain, and Vice President for 15 years, he was a member of many sub committees actively sharing his wisdom and knowledge of South Maroubra. John was a successful competitor in his early days as a swimmer and later turning to his passion of Surfboat rowing and competed with success at State, Australian and World Masters Championships.

John was bestowed the honour of Life Membership in the 1981/82 season.

We salute you John and thank you sincerely for everything you did for our Club. We extend our deepest sympathy to Meryl and his family.

As a Surf Life Saving Club, we should never forget that keeping the public safe on our beach is and will always be our primary objective. We are lucky to have a great team of members who dedicated their time and skills to this objective and in such keep our beach safe with expecting nothing in return.

Surf Lifesaving is an institution that offers many avenues and opportunities to people of differing ages, abilities, experiences and backgrounds. # DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club for period 2017/18. At the completion of the financial season the club is showing an operating profit of \$99,974 compared to last season's profit of \$42,710.

### REVENUES

Traditional sources of income throughout the season have remained consistent with previous years. Membership revenue equated to 16%, donations/sponsorships/grants 43% & club activities 31%.

Overall Membership increased this season by 11%. The Active 15 to 18 year category decreased by 16% but growth of 17% was recorded in our Active 18 years and over memberships. Nippers and General categories also increased.

This season completed the 5th year of our association with Top Cat Catering who lease out the clubhouse Horizons Function Centre. The BOM are pleased to advise that Top Cat Catering have continued its lease for another 3 years.


The Income report reflects an overall 7% increase in income for the season which is reflected by increases in Clubhouse Income and Memberships. Once again our club was successful in securing government grant funding from the Dept. Family & Community to install clubhouse shutters to protect the clubhouse from strong southerly weather conditions and funding from the Community Building Partnership to purchase a new surf boat. All other revenue forms were fairly consistent with previous season.


### Total income for the year \$543,994

### EXPENDITURE

Building & Property expenses increased by 30% due to the installation of clubhouse Shutters, big increases in electricity costs, lift and fire compliance costs are also steadily increasing. We made some improvements to our clubhouse hot water system.

The figures show a 50% decrease in the competition sector due to a reduction in carnival entry fees as our boat section did not participate in the Ocean Thunder Surf Boat Series and we did not send a competition team to the Summer

# FINANCE

Australian Championships held in Perth. A number of new racing boards and ski's were purchased throughout the season.

A reduction in costs for the Lifesaving Section has also been recorded as we did not roll over/replace our ATV this season, our club currently has two ATV's. A fully equipped IRB was purchased during this financial period with delivery due in November via the Souths Juniors CDSE grant money along with the purchase of new radios, resus manikins, IRB motors and rescue boards.

Admin/General operations of the club costs have slightly decreased with expenditure in this area including the continued employment of part time office administration which was increased this year to cover Sunday Mornings. Member capitation's continues to take up 30% of this sections costs.

Overall club expenditure for the season decreased by 5% from last year.

### Total Overall Expenditure \$444,020

### FUNCTIONS, EVENTS AND FUNDRAISING

There were no major changes to the activities performed by the club in the area of Fundraising. The annual Oktoberfest, Sportsman Day and Ocean Swim were held throughout the season, The Oktoberfest and Sportsman Day were profitably activities however a loss was recorded for the Ocean Swim due to the unfavourable conditions on the day resulting in low participation numbers. ## NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

#### NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial; reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

No other applicable Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issus Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

#### Income Tax

The Club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provision of the Income Tax Act.

#### Building

The building in which the club is situated is shown in the accounts as having a value of \$706,200. In the event of termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value.

#### Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### **Events Subsequent to Balance Date**

There were no significant occurring after balance date.

#### **Cash Flow Information**

The Club has no credit stand-by or-finance facilities in place.

#### Insurance

A public Liability Insurance Policy is held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in lifesaving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

## NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 APRIL 2018

#### **Fundraising Activities**

Charitable Fundraising Act 1991: this act and supporting Charitable Fundraising Regulation prescribe the manner in which fundraising appeals are conducted, controlled and reported in NSW. The amounts shown at Note 8 are in accordance with the Authority Condition 7, which is issued to the Club under Section 19 of the Act. Donations and bequests: are returned as income as and only when received at the Club's administration office or deposited into the Club's bank account. As specified in the Act, unsolicited donations, members' donations and bequests are not treated as fundraising income when determining information required under the Act.

Cost of fundraising: cost use in Note 8 include all direct fundraising costs in accordance with the Act. The inclusion of indirect costs is discretionary. Indirect costs excluded, include overheads such as the time spent by accounting or office staff administering appeals.

The other ongoing project and reported on elsewhere in this report is the Memorabilia Project which will provide a modern overview of our club history and should some to come to fruition next season.

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking Ken Hudson, Caretakers Barry and Leslie that do so much to keep the place in tip top working order. I don't think members



appreciate the extent of cleaning that goes on weekly to keep the club in a presentable state. I remind members, in particular patrol and IRB members that we are not permitted to deposit sand on the paving (car park side of the club) as it presents a slip hazard for those walking around the club plus has council cleaning after us. Taps have been installed near the patrol tower to allow for washing of IRBs and Jet Skis.

Finally, I am excited to announce we are seeking a line of funding for;


• improvements to our toilets on the middle floor with creation of female toilets and full renovation of the mens shower room toilet and installation of a disabled toilet.

# DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING REPORT

What another great year for our lifesaving services. Our beach continues to see more or more visits and our members keep evolving to meet this increasing demand.

As you will see from our education report the team has been hard at work this year training new lifesavers and upskilling the current member base with a huge spike in numbers. Mike and his team have trained 40 new bronzes over the year up from 29 the year before. This injection of new members is critical in maintaining a healthy workload across all our members.

On the beach we had a few large swell weeks at the start of season change the beach for what ended up being the lowest rescue numbers in the year for well over a decade. This was due to the increase in preventive actions by our members that were up over 30%. The other main factor was a large sand bank that was created with the large swells. This bank formed a safe place for swimmers for most the season with very low rip activity. Even our south rip wasn't running as hot as normal all contributing to our lower than average rescue stats. Outside patrol hours we have had 2 great examples that our training and service that we provide to the community doesn't end on the weekend. Shane White and Brett Milsop both were involved in after hour's rescues that from all accounts prevented a tragedy.

Our members preform a number of external water safety activities throughout the year. We provided over 60 members to 3 ocean swims around Sydney. We also did our first patrol weekend at Garie SLSC to support the club with its patrol requirements and expose our members to other beaches and patrolling methods. We are hoping this weekend at Garie will be an ongoing part of our lifesaving calendar

This year branch along with our Lifesaving Committee relocated the branch jet ski (RWC) but to its original home at South Maroubra. It has been over 10 years since it has been housed at our club. To help support this branch service our club also put forward 5 new RWC drivers this year. Many of which were our more experienced lifesavers looking for the next challenge. Our location and depth of highly skilled motor craft operators makes South Maroubra a great fit.

This year I had the privilege of sharing the skill and knowledge that I have learnt at South Maroubra with young lifesavers from clubs around NSW. This group then travelled to New Zealand on a lifesaving exchange where we shared techniques and different challenges clubs/lifesavers face.

This was a great experience and even after 20 years on the beach I learnt a lot and came back even more proud of our club and members than when I left.

At the start of this year with the generosity of Site Pizza Bar the Lifesaving Committee introduced a monthly internal recognition program for a patrolling members. The Patrol member of the month award gave our members a change to recognise their peers for outstanding service.







# EDUCATION REPORT

Another season gone, and once again what a busy one it was for our Education team. Our main focus this season was to boost our numbers in both the Bronze Medallion and other senior awards and I am proud to say that our small team of trainers achieved just that. We hit our target of 40 new Bronze Medallion members which is our highest number in the last 4-5 seasons. This is something we will look to grow even further in the season to come. A special mention has to go to Nicole Cooney who puts a lot of time and effort into advertising our Bronze courses which we are seeing bring in more people each year.

On top of the Bronze award, our trainers all played a hand in training a number of other senior awards such as IRB drivers and crew, ARTC (advanced reputation) and spinal awards. All up we put through around 50 extra senior awards compared to last year so a massive thanks to all our trainers for firstly making themselves available to train these courses, but also getting out there and recruiting members to up-skill. To add to this, a massive thank you has to go the Cathie Hall who took the lead on all of our proficiencies. She, along with a few other trainers, put through 333 proficiencies in 4 sessions which is a huge effort. Every proficiency was handled extremely well and covered everything it needed to.

This season also saw a healthy intake into courses that we haven't had much interest in over the last few years. Through actively promoting these courses to members we are getting more interest which I believe will go a long way in ensuring we retain our members. One of these awards included the RVVC (Jet Ski) award which has provided a new path for our IRB drivers to get out there and try something different. We also had two members complete their Gold Medallion which is a feat we haven't seen in a fair while. Hopefully off the back of that we can build on those numbers in the future.

The team also welcomed new trainee trainer Isabella Garay into the ranks. Bella came up through Nippers, completed



her SRC and then her Bronze last season. From there, she discovered her desire to train and to pass on her knowledge to others. Bella assisted Nicole in training both our SRC squads, barely missing a session, on top of her patrol duties where she was on the beach pretty much every Sunday. Bella presents with a maturity well beyond her years and her confidence in delivering course content is second to none. As a result, Bella has earned herself the title of Rookie Trainer of the Year. Well done Bella!

To the rest of our trainers, I say it every year on multiple occasions, however thank you so much for all your efforts in training our members. I personally think it is one of the more time-consuming gigs within our club with a number of late weeknights and early weekend mornings. To have the level of commitment you all do, on top of your regular patrolling duties and everyday lives is really something special. At the end of the day if we aren't training new members and upskilling current ones, we eventually won't have anyone to field a patrol, so again thank you all so much for all the work you do.

#### Breakdown of training:

**Cathie** – Was involved in pretty much every award this season. Cathie trained 2 Bronze courses, 2 spinal courses, and an ARTC. She also ran all of our proficiencies, on top of working towards becoming a facilitator of SMAR and Beach m\Management and assessing a number of awards within the Branch! An absolute huge and inspiring effort from Cath.

Jay – Another massive effort from Jay this season, training 2 Bronze courses and 2 IRB courses. The way our training schedule is, means Jay starts training in August first up with IRB and doesn't stop until the last Bronze course near the end of the season. It's a large workload that spans from before the season even starts which is a massive credit to him.

**Ronny** – Played a hand in training 2 Bronze courses and a couple IRB courses as well. Like Jay, Ronny had quite a long season training.

Nixy – Nixy took the lead on our fitness training for both Bronze squads. These are an extra session we have introduced where the group can come down once a week and do a series of Run-Swim-Runs to help build their fitness and surf skills for their assessment. This has proven not only to help with the candidates' fitness but has gone a long way in building stronger relationships between candidates which at the end of the day will aid in retention. On top of this Nixy also assisted training a Spinal course.

**Kelly** – Kel had a big year this year planning a wedding! This didn't stop her still pitching in with training, going on to train a Bronze squad at the beginning of the season as well as running a Spinal course and helping out with a couple of sessions with the last Bronze squad of the season.

**Nicole** – As always, Nicole did an excellent job training our younger SRC candidates. It's not the easiest job in the world at times but Nicole always puts in a huge effort bringing



through quality young lifesavers. She does this on top of a number of other roles she holds within the club, all of which are extremely time consuming. To still put in time to train squads is a massive effort and a big credit to her.

**Bella** – was outstanding in her first season as a Rookie trainer, helping Nicole train 2 SRC squads this season on her way to earning the Rookie Trainer of the Year!

**Darren** – was away for work a lot this season however still helped where he could, particularly with the fitness training.

Finally, a big thank you to our assessors who give up their time assessing other clubs within the Branch. John R, John C, Vince, Robbo and Cath. Your dedication not only to your Club but to the Branch as well is a massive credit to you all so thank you.



The 2017/18 seaspon has been a much improved year for our competition section of the club. Coming into the role my main focus was converting our nippers into successful competitors and lifesavers. We moved in the right direction to build not only our strength as a team but also our team culture. A big thanks to all our coaches and supporters this year.

A special mention to Chris Stokes who ran many hours of board and surf training, Dave Lowlett for all his hard work coaching the mal riders and Michelle Lo who behind the scenes has made life easy for me and countless times pushed me in the right direction.

A big issue that started to become evident to me at the start of my tenure was the lack of competition equipment. I am proud to say that the club has generously purchased 2 new racing mals and 2 new adjustable racing skis to further develop our athletes. Thanks must go to our local MP Michael Daley who has helped us gain a grant to purchase a brand new surf boat which is on its way. Thank you to Yvette for helping with the painful grant application process.

Our masters who have traditionally been strong throughout the years continued to perform with our "Masterrettes" women claiming many medals at carnivals throughout the year. Kristy Smith lead the way taking home Bronze in the beach sprint and Silver in the flags at the 2018 Masters NSW Surf Life Savings Championship. 2018 marked a comeback from an old sea dog/club stalwart Michael "Murph" Renford. Murph left the state titles chuffed with a gold in the Surf Race and Rescue Tube but he was most pleased with his Silver in the 130 years Surf teams that he shared with Dave Dubois "Dubbo" and Dave Lowlett.

Other notable results from Masters state titles include a silver for Dave Dubois & Shane White in the Board Rescue, Silver for David Smith Beach sprint (60 - 64), Silver Jayson Lincoln Beach sprint (45 - 49), Gold to Max Murphy beach sprint (70+) and Gold for the 230-year minimum Beach relay. Combined these 4 masters athletes have done more carnivals then I've had hot dinners. Great to see they still love it after all this time.

It was very pleasing to see the transition of 4 South Maroubra nippers graduates competing for the club all summer Drew McJannett, Toby Goldschmidt, Cooper Stokes and Luc Christensen. The boys took part in many carnivals throughout the season with lots of ups and downs but they worked extremely hard on the board and in the surf as well as numerous pool sessions a week to ensure their conditioning was up to scratch for the rigorous demands of multi event carnivals. At the 2018 NSW Open Surf Life Savings Championship, Cooper and Luc managed to make the Semis of the board rescue at the state titles, these two are a team to watch in the near future in this event. Toby, Drew, Cooper and Luc all made it through 4 gruelling iron man rounds to get into the semis with Drew progressing to the final and achieving a respectable 13th place in a tough field. Collectively they finished 5th in the swim teams and 6th in the Cameron relay.

Drew McJannett made his club and family proud, the South Maroubra nipper graduate survived 3 hard days of competition at the NSW Championships to make the final of the U15's Surf Race. Drew got a good start off the line and used his fantastic surf skills, acquired over years of training at South Maroubra with many great nipper coaches, to navigate his way through the break and out to the cans, he held strong and powered home never once relinquishing the number 1 spot. A flawless finish and dash up the beach cemented his win and place in the record books. His team mates were thrilled, and Drew was glad to share the moment with such a great bunch of boys and parents.


