When events such as the above occur, it reminds me firstly of our lost friend and champion lifesaver Bernie Kelly LM who died after a mass rescue on our beach in 1998 and also why our organisation throughout Australia is so important. It is my pleasure to present to you the 2018/19 Annual Report where once again I can inform you that our club achieved so much on so many fronts. Whether it be Education where Michael Fernandez took out Randwick Councils Australia Day's Young Achiever Award and Sydney Branch's Assessor of the Year, or Nicole Krite taking out Sydney Branch Trainer of the Year, it's been a great season. Our Club was again a finalist for Champion Club of the Year and winner of Randwick District Patrol Efficiency Award, we had young Sarah Teitler, an up and coming lifesaver, taking out the prestigious Junior Lifesaver of the Year Award within Sydney Branch, and our Nippers returned from NSW State Titles placed 5th out of 150+ clubs. We had some great events run, with hospitality shown week in and out... it's just great stuff! Take a pat on the back South Maroubra, your performance in and out of the water has been magnificent!

LIFESAVING

Once again, I am proud to announce "No Lives Lost" at our beach during the season.

Our Lifesaving Section has again performed well with the following statistics:

- 103 Rescues
- 6794 Preventative actions.
- 78 First Aid cases and;
- thousands of hours of voluntary Surf Patrol.



Our Lifesaving Section led by Nicole Cooney did an outstanding job on all fronts. We had our young up and coming lifesavers joining the Nipper Water Safety teams which looked fabulous from the club house as they cared for the 800 odd nippers during their activities whilst regular patrols kept on eye on the public. We saw increased numbers undertaking their Bronze Medallion Award with a wide range of age groups from mature aged parents to young adolescents in addition to SRC and other advanced courses, all under the watchful eye of our club instructors. A fantastic vibe every Sunday with so much going on around the south end.

I must thank our sponsors in particular The Juniors' who have helped us with the best lifesaving equipment money can buy. Whether it be our portable resus equipment hanging in the first aid room, defib units on and off the beach, new lifesaving trailer to make transporting equipment onto and off the beach easier, new Inflatable Rescue boats and engines, rescue boards, tubes... all available to cater for the growing number of people heading to our beaches and to facilitate the management of potential incidents that we confront on a weekly basis.

Thank you to the entire lifesaving team including all those wearing the red and yellow, instructors, patrol captains, and the leadership team headed by Nicole and Jay Shelley on a wonderful year of friendship and developing the lifesavers of the future whilst keeping the pubic safe.



YOUTH/NIPPERS

On the back of the ABC Nipper Program aired the season before last, we expected an increase in numbers and sure enough the past season saw a big increase with numbers topping over 800. This is a particularly large number of children given the fact our Nippers confront traditional surf conditions with rips, surfing and dumping waves which can be confronting but very helpful in learning about beach conditions. On behalf of the Board of Management, I present for your consideration and adoption the 61st Annual Report and Financial Statement of South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the Season 2018/19.

As a lifesaving organisation, our core business and objective is to provide a safe aquatic environment to our customers. Our diverse team of highly skilled volunteer lifesavers achieved our objective once again, I am very happy and proud to report that No Lives Lost between the flags during the season. The dedication, attitude and magnificent team work of our patrolling members contribute to these amazing results, they volunteer their work and time keeping public safe at our beach and expect nothing in return.

SLSA strives to create a safe environment on Australia's beaches and coastline through patrols, education and training, public safety campaigns and the promotion of health and fitness. SLSA is the largest multifaceted volunteering organisation worldwide that comprises key aspects of lifeguard services and competitive surf sports. 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10 YEAR MEMBERSHIP COMPARISON

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DIRECTOR OF FINANCE



It gives me great pleasure to present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club for period 2018/19. Once again, the season was an exciting year for members with many improvements to club facilities undertaken, changes in Officer incumbents presented opportunities to change some processes and we witnessed the coming together of the Heritage Room Memorabilia Project.

During the financial year ending 30th April 2019, the club experienced total revenue of \$559,093 which is slightly up from previous season.

Traditional sources of income throughout the season returned a moderate increase from last year. Although a decline was recorded in the area of Donations/Grants & Sponsorship, the increase was attributed mainly to the following:

- Membership revenue increasing by 30%. Overall Membership numbers increased this season by 21% to reflect an active membership of 1408. The Active 15 to 18 year category increased by 157% with our nipper category also enjoying a 19% growth.
- Merchandise net sales increasing by 134%. The flow on effect of our increase in membership showed in our merchandise sales with our nipper group purchasing numerous costumes, caps and apparel
- Top Cat Catering, who lease out the clubhouse Horizons Function Centre, continue to be the clubs main form of revenue.

 Sundry income increased due to the selling of club competition equipment (surf boat)

During the past financial period the club showed a substantial increase in expenditure of 43%. The expenditure increase can be explained by the following:

- Building & Property expenditure increased due to the purchase of new carpet for the Horizons Function Centre (\$32,000) together with the Heritage Room Memorabilia Project (\$50,000).
- Lifesaving expenditure increased from last season as we took delivery of a new IRB, motors and Patrol Trailer via the Souths Juniors & Maroubra Seals CDSE grant money along with the purchase of new radios, resus manikins and patrol uniforms.
- Competition expenditure doubled as we finalised payments and enjoyed delivery of a new Surf Boat which was fully funded from the previous season via a government Grant. We also purchased new skis for our competition section and also recorded an increase in competitor carnival entry fee expenses.
- Admin/General operations of the club costs have remained steady as we continued employment of part time office personnel. Member capitations to Surf Life Saving Sydney and NSW continues to take up half of this section's costs.
- On the advice of our surf club Auditor we have commenced a 13-year cycle of \$50,000 per annum deduction (Amortization) from our

financial books to remove the listed clubhouse Land and Building value from \$700,000 to zero This value currently sits in our Financial Position under Assets – Non-Current Assets – Property Plant & Equipment. This is based on the fact that we don't own our clubhouse building as i sits on Crown Land and should not be shown as a club asset. We have 13 years remaining of our building lease with Randwick City Council who are the trustees.

Due to the above expected expenditure, at the completion of the financial season, the club is showi an operating loss amounted to \$76,662 compared to last season's profit of \$99,974.

Functions, Events and Fundraising Our members continue to work hard to raise valuab funds from our annual Oktoberfest and Sportsman Day. Both activities were profitable however an increase in revenue from the Sportsman Day counteracted not holding an Ocean Swim or Nipper Carnival this season.

Sections within the club continue to enjoy returns for their efforts from the Trivia and Boaties 'State of Origin' nights. The IRB Winter Touring team section continues to provide 'water safety' for a number of external events and also worked hard to bring in sor additional funds to offset some of their touring tean accommodation expenses.

Concluding this report



DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING SERVICES REPORT



This season saw a mostly new group in the leadership roles of the Lifesaving Portfolio, with Jay Shelley joining as Assistant Director of Lifesaving Services, Laurie Golsby as the new IRB Coordinator and me as the new Director of Lifesaving Services. While we had a lot to learn we had great support from the Board of Management as well as our fellow lifesaving community.

We kicked off the season with gear inspection, with the whole lifesaving committee pulling together to ensure all our gear was up to spec and proud to say that it all went through with no re-inspections required. A big thank you to Ken Hudson who help me pull it all together and understand what was needed to ensure we got through smoothly. Your knowledge and guidance is greatly appreciated Ken. We also needed to ensure we had the patrol teams and roster updated and circulated to our patrolling members, and of course begin recruiting for the new season.

Recruitment, training and upskilling was a big focus point of this season. Building on the increasing numbers from the previous seasons, and with Michael Fernandez's (Education Coordinator) continued dedication we certainly kicked some goals in this area. Despite impending fatherhood, Mike

stayed focused on education and put through some excellent numbers this season along with his training team putting through 190 new awards. We have an impressive 75 new lifesavers, including 49 new Bronze Medallion holders, as well as 26 new Surf Rescue Certificate. In terms of higher awards we had a good uptake on the Advanced Resus and Spinal awards, 19 new IRB Crew with 5 new IRB Drivers. We've also had members take up higher awards such as the Silver Medallion Beach Management and the Silver Medallion Aquatic Rescue, which gives us members who will have a greater awareness and ability while on patrol. With the SLSS Branch Jet Ski at the Club we have also seen a good number of our members attain the RWC Award and participate in patrols on the ski. Finally, but by no means the least, it's also been great to see new trainers join the our training team. We can never have enough trainers and I hope we can see even more join us in the new season.

Patrols this season have been great, and I was happy to be able to get down to visit all the teams this past season and talk with our Patrol Captains and team members. While we had a good number of days with an open beach we did see some tricky conditions. I was happy to see a great increase in our preventative actions, and to know that our members are keeping a keen eye on swimmers from various vantage points on the beach and from an elevated position in our Patrol Tower and being proactive in swimmer interventions keeping them safe. This saw our rescue number stay steady for the season, with the majority of our rescues performed using a rescue tube. Often due to conditions and location of the person in trouble this piece of equipment is the most suitable and reliable. We had a good number of rescues by IRB, which again displays the usefulness and also the skill of our IRB drivers and crew. Because after all our purpose of existing as a club is to keep our beaches safe. I'm glad to report that again we had no lives lost between the flags.

Speaking of patrols and gear – we had some gear improvements this season with a massive thanks to Jay and his work on these projects. We saw a new radio installed in the patrol tower, which saw a great use of the tower during busy and closed beach situations allowing members in the tower to communicate quickly and effectively with other team members. This season also saw the launch of our new patrol trailer, which was Jay's pet project, and after consultation with members Jay and Ken set off on building a more patrol member friendly, lighter weight trailer.

In the IRB section we saw Laurie come on as the new IRB Coordinator. Laurie is a great asset to the team, a young man willing to learn and take on feedback and implement change. A big thank you to Ken Hudson who helped Laurie with some much-needed knowledge, and who assisted along with George in reviewing all our IRB gear creating a pathway and future maintenance plan for the future. All in all I have enjoyed my first season as Director of Lifesaving Services and learnt a lot during the course of this successful season. I have a great many people to thank including valued team members who have always offered the hand of friendship providing words of encouragement and advice plus have assisted in so many practical ways to achieve great outcomes. I would like to publicly acknowledge for the record the Lifesaving leadership Team – Jay, Laurie, Ken and Mike for taking care of your sections so well and for providing feedback and guidance where needed. A very big thanks to the Board of Management for your support and backing. To all the Patrol Captains and other Lifesaving Committee members - thank you for your feedback throughout the season, the positive and constructive feedback means we can continue to grow. I truly appreciate your patience as we learnt, implemented some change and grew as a team.

It's hard to do what we do without funding and as such I would also like to thank all our supporters, without their generous contribution to the Club we couldn't provide the service we do. Big thanks to The Juniors Group and the Maroubra Seals Club for providing key lifesaving equipment, Caltex for fuel sponsorship of our Inflatable Rescue Boat operations, Randwick City Council for your continuous support.

I look forward to the 2019/20 season and seeing you all on the beach.



Under the guidance of Ken Hudson, we kept the maintenance of our patrol engines high, but nothing could mend old age. We will be decommissioning three of our well used motors this coming season as we bring in some new motors thanks for various grants from our regular donors Souths Juniors Group and The Seals Club, as well as Club Randwick. Follow a thorough inspection day involving Ken Hudson and George Trikilis, both well and truly qualified in marine mechanics, we have a solid plan to continue to improve all of our IRB equipment. This review of our IRB fleet will ensure their service for the years to come.

They ran the Open Male and Female Rescue as well as the Open Male and Female Teams. We made the final in the Male Teams event, which was pushed to the very last minute of competition. With no time to wait for the break in the surf the race was started mid set. There were some spills however the South Maroubra team of Alexander Shaddock, William Shaddock, Nicholas Pavlakis and me raced a safe race, staying upright and finishing in 9th.

I would like to send my gratitude to those who have helped me through this season whether it being assisting moving engines when I'm by myself in the shed or assisting when I call upon IRB members for water safety. I would like to express extra gratitude to Nicole Cooney, Jay Shelley, Mike Fernandez, William Shaddock, Ken Hudson and Paul Fownes who have helped me push through the trials and tribulations of being the IRB Coordinator. With the experiences and lessons learnt from this season I'm sure if I am graced with the opportunity in being the IRB Coordinator for another season there will only be more improvement out of the section which I hope holds proud to the rich history of the South Maroubra IRB section.



The 2018/19 season was my first in the driver's seat at South Maroubra Nippers and it has been quite the ride. With the fantastic support from the nipper executive committee and the vast number of volunteers it has been a truly enjoyable experience.

The season got off to a rocky start with the first nippers day cancelled due to a huge electrical storm. Over the next few months South Maroubra beach saw large swells and stormy seas, with the Nippers only managing to get into the water a hand full of times. It was a good opportunity to really get into the education components of the program and the sand skills really got a workout with hose pipe being cut into more flags at a rate of knots.

Each Sunday at nippers the whole show is careful monitored by Patrol 14 and the Water Safety Supervisor. A big shout out to Uri Teitler for again taking on the job of Water Safety Supervisor. This season certainly put you to the test. To past junior members that volunteered their time to mentor and share your knowledge with our nippers, thank you. We appreciate your commitment and time; our nippers thoroughly enjoy having you around.

In order to develop great lifesavers and assets to the community, we invest a lot of resources focusing on lifesaving skills at the beach, education and development of our young members and family members. During the past season, we delivered a numerous training courses, with a number of our nippers representing our club at the Junior Development camps.

With the support of our board coaches, we started board training in early August, which was a huge success.

We had big numbers attending surf swimming and board training which reflected on the improved skills and confidence that our nippers showed at normal nipper days, as well in competition. Sand training was also developed further, providing again a well-structured and flexible program, we saw our attendance soar, what a great achievement.

To our Junior Head Coach and Competition Manager (Colin Marshall) and coaches (Andy Newrick, Drew Richardson, Darren McLean, Marty Kiernan, Shane White, Murph Renford and Laurie Last) thank you for your guidance, support and encouragement. Your knowledge and commitment are truly appreciated. Please remember that all of our coaches are volunteers and give us their time to train our nippers, it is rewarding to see how these young athletes develop to become great lifesavers.

A new concept this year was a 2-day training camp at the club, with all the touring team members sleeping over at the club house. It was a pretty intensive training schedule but most importantly it really brought the team together. It was an incredibly rewarding experience for the coaches and the kids, and certainly one that we will be repeating this season.

Our nippers represented the club at several events during the season. All over Sydney, Northern and

Illawarra Branches, they wore and represented our colour's with pride, enthusiasm and competed in a fair and friendly manner.

Sydney Branch was hosted by Maroubra SLSC again this year which due to the conditions extended right down to the southern end of the beach. With a large contingency of competitors, we managed to secure great results in water and sand. Well done to all nippers that attended.

It was the third year at Blacksmiths Beach up at Swansea - Belmont for the State Championships. We had a large contingency of 100+ Nippers representing South Maroubra, who competed solidly, placing 5th in over-all point score in the State. The results were the highest ever point score and were within just 20 points of the top spot. Fantastic work from the coaches and the management team and a magnificent effort by our athletes... Well done!

And once again, Deanne Goldschmidt outdid herself by designing a unique and cool uniform for our team, we were the envy of many clubs at State. Thanks so much Deanne.

AWARDS/PRESENTATIONS

Presentation days were conducted as per our season calendar; our young U6s, U7s and U8s were presented with their medals, certificates and awards. 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DIRECTOR OF COMPETITION REPORT



The 2018/2019 season has been a year of success and firsts for our great club. This year's main focus has been to build on the strong foundations our heads of sections have laid and I am pleased to say we have made great steps forward.

Our boat section lead the way with fantastic results all year, in true South Maroubra fashion the women's crews set the standard. Swept by our new sweep/coach Rebecca "Beck" Hamilton our two girls crews performed all season along with our U23's women's crew "Motley Crew" winning Branch gold and our reserves women's crew "Bisley" winning gold medals at Branch and State and ending the season with bronze at Aussies. This was special as it was the first time an all-women's crew achieved a clean sweep winning medals at Branch, State and Aussies, a feat that the crew and the club are very proud of.

Our men's crews worked extremely hard all year and were unlucky not to achieve the racing results they probably deserved, our reserve men's crew were all new to each other so the past season has been a great development year to push them into the higher places at carnivals in the season to come. Our U23 boys have been together for some time now with the exception of new recruit Marshall "Hasto" Hastings a former nipper turned boatie who fit in nicely with the boys. They faced a battle all year in an extremely competitive division so the past season has been a great learning and development season for them to spring board into a dominate next 18 months.

The South Maroubra masters team excelled again this year, competing in many carnivals all over Sydney and surrounds as well as the big 4 Branch, State, Aussies and Worlds. Dave "The Grey Flash" Smith has well and truly earnt his nick name, winning the beach sprint at Branch, State, Aussies and Worlds in his division. At the NSW State Titles South Maroubra's 230 years male beach sprint team consisting of Max Murphy, Dave Reid, John Rooney and David Smith took out silver. John Rooney took bronze in the 65-69 beach flags and Max Murphy silver in the over 70s beach flags and sprint. Our water competitors excelled at Branch this season with Dave Reid taking out silver and Darren Tannock bronze in the men's 30-39 ski race. Dave Reid finished 5th in this event at Aussies.

Samarah Melia was the surprise package of the day at Branch, a wrong turn cost her the lead in the u17s female surf race. Samarah was last after turning the cans but clawed her way back and finished an admirable 4th. Determined for retribution so she decided to back up in the Opens Female Surf Race. Against a very strong field of competitors Samarah won the event in convincing fashion proving she is a force to be reckoned with in the surf sport arena.

A special thanks must go to all our coaches and competition committee members for their tireless work and dedication to the sport. A big thank you to Yvette and Michelle for handling all of the admin side of competition and all the issues that come with that. Laurie and Bronte for taking the IRB section by the scruff of the neck and putting it in a great position moving forward, Nixy Krite, Dave Lowlett, Dave Reid, Max Murphy and John Rooney for all the work they do for the masters and Phil and Beck for their outstanding work in the boat section this year.

IRB COMPETITION REPOR



It's one of the fastest and most exciting surf sports to watch. Our fresh IRB Racing Team along with 22 clubs started their engines and took to the water to demonstrate their skills and speed in the 2019 NSW Sharkskin IRB Racing Season.

Once again, our team headed to Stockton Beach to kick off the season for Round 1 of the NSW Premiership, battling it out with over 300 competitors. Conditions were favourable and our team made it to 6 finals and achieved 9th in the Overall Point score. Round 2 of the Premiership Series was held at The Lakes SLSC on the Central Coast. Conditions were challenging for our competitors with one-metre shore-dump but our drivers and crews raced at an exceptionally high level taking into account safety, technique and professionalism.

The scene was set on pristine One Mile Beach on the state's Lower North Coast for the third round. Luckily the large swell was held off by the headland to ensure competition could be run. Along with our high energy and skills, came amazing results. Big improvements were seen as we came 6th overall and doubled our Overall

Point Score results from Round 2. It was a great carnival and we looked forward to returning here for State.

The Premiership Series wrapped up at Caves Beach for the fourth and final round. A shore dump and challenging sand bank tested the skills of our racers. South Maroubra achieved 6th Place in the Overall Premiership Point Score and 3 of our teams earned Premiership Series medals.

State Championships was hosted by Cape Hawke SLSC in challenging conditions. Due to the increase in swell throughout Saturday, on Sunday the event was moved from Cape Hawke's One Mile Beach to Forster. The surf was large, but it was also very choppy. It was challenging for every crew. To make it through the rounds you had to be smart, you had to drive to the conditions not flat out. It was a great call by the competition and safety committee to move to Forster on Sunday. It gave everyone the best chance of finishing the event. Our team came 6th Overall in the State. We made 11 finals and 4 teams achieved State medals.

The Australian Championships have just taken place place at Kingscliff Beach, NSW. Coming off a fantastic weekend at State Championships, I am so proud of how the team went at the Australian Championships. The hard work of the boys paid off taking home a gold and silver Australian medal, and the team placed 6th in the overall pointscore.

The overall season has been a success having such a majorly new team. We have come together and the energy, laughter and competitiveness as a team has been amazing. I am proud to be the Team Manager of such an amazing bunch and looking forward to the future of the team.


