PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with great pride that I once again present to you the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Annual Report, - season 2021/22 and what another exceptional year we have enjoyed at this mighty club.

Last season I reported to you the disruption Covid had caused throughout the year and how we had negotiated our way through this nightmare. We had hoped the worst of Covid had passed and I guess in some respects it had, but be assured there were plenty of Covid challenges and hoops to jump through this season affecting every aspect of our club. Fortunately, South Maroubra is a resilient club and was well ahead of others in preparation, planning and communication so the effects of Covid were contained and managed.

Lets now take a little journey through season 21/22 and the fantastic outcomes we were able to achieve.

Lifesaving - led again by Director Nicole Cooney and ably supported by Darren Saunders we were able to substantially grow our lifesaving ranks at both the Surf Rescue Certificate and Bronze medallion levels. It was great to see lightning Bronze and SRC courses run for the first time in quite some years. Our team of Trainers were also able to run a range of advanced lifesaving courses adding to the level of skill on surf patrols. Whilst Covid restrictions regarding movement and beach attendance were eased over the season, horrible weather, surf conditions, combined with a tragedy in the ocean at Little Bay impacted beach attendance. That said, our patrols carried out 50 aquatic rescues, 4514 Preventative Actions (moving swimmers out of danger areas), 229 first aid cases, with 'No Lives Lost' so as you can see, our people were quite busy when beaches were open.

I also extend appreciation to Nicole, Maria Garay and team of members, who carried out an exhaustive attempt to save a mans life found in the sand dunes south end of the beach near the coastal walk. Unfortunately, and despite best efforts by our people including utilising all available lifesaving equipment including a defibrillator, backed up by Paramedics, the man's life was unable to be saved. This was not a drowning but a medical episode which is definitely increasing in frequency with the popular nearby coastal walk and Arthur Byrne Reserve, combined with the isolation this part of our coastline presents and is something we need to increasingly prepared for.

Thank you to all of our lifesavers, trainers, leadership team for your dedication and skills. I'm sure I speak for all stakeholders, sponsors and membership in thanking you for your voluntary service.



Competition - Led by Shane White and Maria Garay, the fruits of many years of hard work were on display this year with former Nippers moving into the senior club competition space plus growth within traditional competition areas including surf boats and IRBs. Once again affected by Covid, we did see things normalise to some degree towards the back end of the season although where Covid backed off, bad weather moved in.

I am able to report that under Shane, we have grown our coaching ranks and realised some wonderful results in all disciplines entered into that will be reported on later within the Competition Section. Highlights as alluded to above were the champions now within our Cadet and Junior ranks supported by parents and a wonderful coaching support group which as we know is the secret to success.

Appreciation is extended to all section heads, coaches and athletes for your efforts throughout the year as we know that success comes with hard work and that hard work is year-round.

Nippers - And a big welcome to Peter and Mary Kondilios after a baton change within the nipper leadership team this season, with Greg Turton assuming the deputy role. Proud to see South Maroubra Nippers become the biggest Nipper Group in not just New South Wales but Australia and that comes about because of our success, our reputation, our family focused nipper community, our successful Covid strategies combined with great coaches and support of those children with an interest in competition.

Under the leadership of Peter and his team, we were once again right up in the top 5 teams within New South Wales in competition which is a terrific feat when managing the large nipper participation at our club.

It's a massive effort to run Australia's biggest Nipper Group and a massive strain on finances, resources and things such as storage capacity for equipment which we are hoping to address somewhat next season. We always welcome financial support of a great Australian aquatic tradition!

Thank you to the fantastic Age Managers, Assistant Age Managers, Water Safety, mums and dads that help out in particular those mums and dads that undertake Bronze Medallion training to help out with water safety but also back up with surf patrol duties, absolute champions!

- Ensured the availability of our Club facilities to local schools, sporting groups, emergency services and Council,
- Developed a sustainable, safe and popular social calendar for community and members,
- Took receipt of and christened the Johnny Marks Express club bus in memory of one of our finest, John Marks Life Member.
- Reached DA submission of our plan for phase 2 of our club house renovations working with Randwick City Council on design and funding.
- Carried out extensive external remedial repairs and full club repaint utilising a Colour Consultant to ensure best possible visible outcome for members and community.
- Demolition of the Bernie Kelly club bar and expansion to cater for increase community and member interest.

- Established a Shadow Board for our Youth
- Participated in Gotcha4life 24hr row raising funds for mental health support.
- Thanked our sponsors and supporters with our annual sponsors lunch in Horizons.
- Linda hosted our 'Remembering our Fallen Members Day'.
- Hosted Sportspersons Day, Good Friday, Australia Day, Gold Members, Grand Final Day, Social Sundays and range of other members social events.

- Negotiated with Council improved family friendly grass area beach-side of club, widened concrete pathway for gatherings, new Surf Patrol member parking zone.
- In the running for Club of the Year - Sydney Branch.
- Met with Matt Thistlethwaite MP, Michael Daley MP, Mayor Parker, Councillors to secure phase 2 club renovation funding,

Club Planning Day

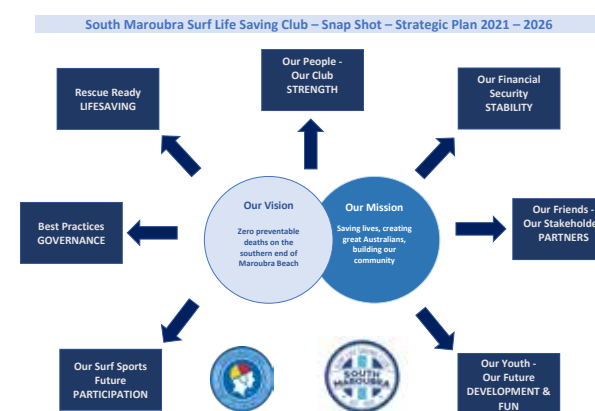

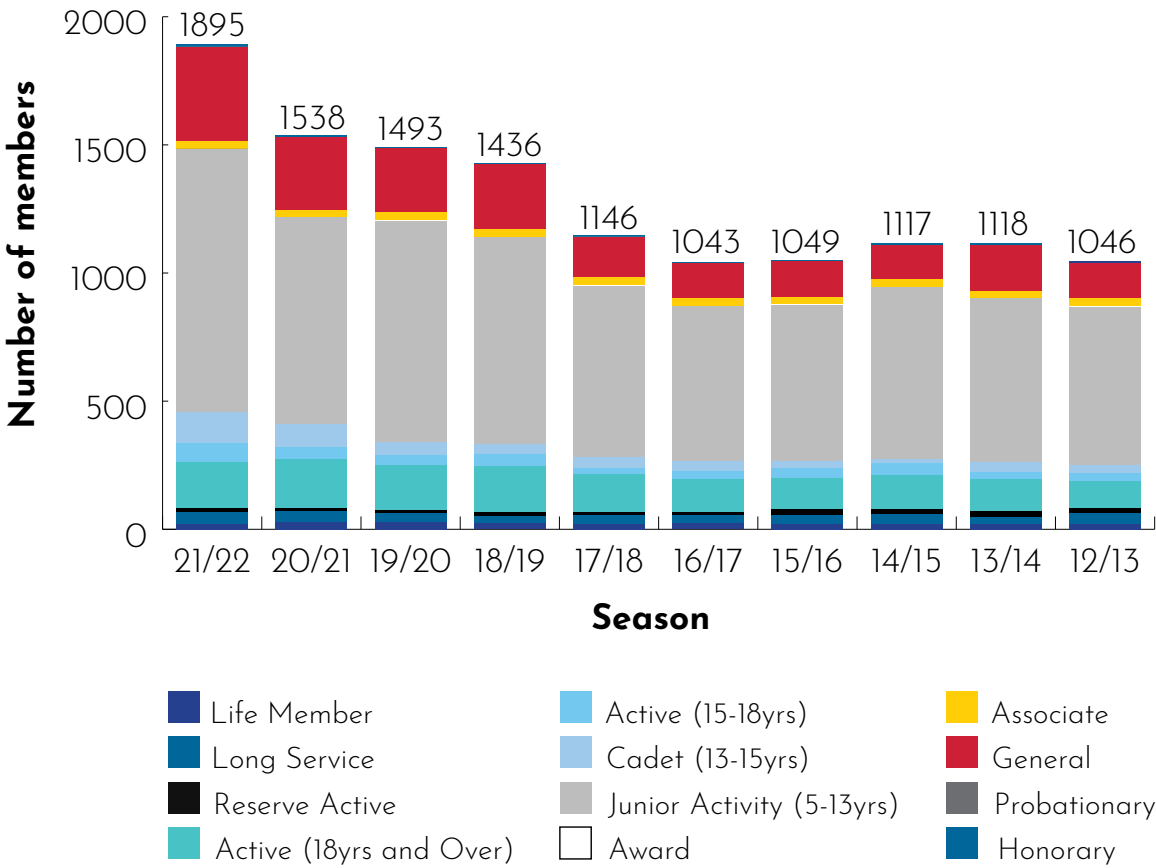

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE'S REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the 2021/22 financial year.

The club reported a net profit of \$171,287 (compared to \$153,859 in FY20/21), representing a significant result considering the challenges we had again with Covid.

During the financial year ending 30th April 2022, the club recorded a **total revenue of \$708,942** which is up 12% from previous season (\$627,518 FY20/21)

Donations, Grants & Sponsorship increased by 8% over the past 12 months.

The Juniors Group and Maroubra Seals Club provided a combined \$55,000 through the Club Grants Scheme with funds being expensed on Lifesaving Equipment.

A special thank you to all our sponsors who have remained steadfast despite the impact of Covid.

Clubhouse Income is derived from Heritage Room hire, Kelly Bar sales, Club Kiosk and Horizons Lease contract.

The Heritage room generated a total of \$96,000 (\$72,000 FY20/21) with a positive uplift from Sunday Socials.

Total Membership stands at 1,895.

Our Nipper membership this season represented the largest group nationally with 1,028.

Fundraising revenue was flat compared to last year, and down on previous years, again, due to

the fact that we did not conduct our annual Fun Run/Oktoberfest Community Event or Annual Golf Day. Fortunately, we were able to conduct successful Sportsman Lunch, Trivia Night and Ocean Swim activities.

Thanks to all our competition sections for their yearly commitment to fundraising to assist the funding of our State and Aussie Touring Teams.

Net Merchandise Sales shows a profit this year of \$15,951 (loss \$2,180 FY20/21) bolstered by the end of season sale on apparel stock.

We currently still have merchandise stock to the value of \$22,545 and steps should be taken to reduce or write-off further old inventory.

Sundry Income is made up from First Aid/BM/SRC course fees, Education Manual sales, Touring Team Revenue & payments made by nippers for non-club endorsed carnival entry fees.

This form of income is up slightly \$43,644 (\$35,941 FY20/21) due primarily from Touring Team contributions to offset carnival and travel fees.

During the past financial period the club showed a 12% increase in expenditure. **Total Expenditure** at \$537,655 for FY21/22 compared to \$473,660 FY20/21.

Admin and General Operating expenses were slightly up at \$97,295 (\$87,883 FY20/21) which resulted from expenditure linked to Admin and Office costs (\$29,510), bank fees and charges (\$3,045), Annual report, audit costs and club printing (\$8,844), Capitations (\$34,703), phones and the like.

Last season the club was victim of fraud to the amount of \$4,939.75, one of our Board of Management members had their email account hacked which led to an authorised payment. The matter was reported to our Bank and NSW Police, unfortunately, the funds could not be recovered which have been written off this financial year. Further financial and approval controls have been put in place to mitigate future fraud risks.

Building & Property expenditure decreased by 8% this financial year with the benefit of our Solar Panels reducing our electricity costs by almost 50% (\$20,208 FY20/21). Other items represented in this ledger are Repairs and Maintenance (\$8,851) (FY20/21 \$21,173), Insurance (\$5,399) (FY20/21 \$5,461.25), Lift, Horizons Maintenance, Cleaning, Fire Safety and Gym Equipment (\$17,146). A new expenditure line introduced this year is the operating costs for the new club Bus (\$4,062).

In preparation for our major building upgrade which we expect to commence within the next 3 years, the club has started building further its Building Account, currently at \$510,000.

Competition expenditure of \$89,670 (\$75,200 FY20/21) includes touring costs \$52,882 (Summer and Winter IRB), repairs and maintenance of competition equipment, and senior member carnival entry fees of \$17,962. This increase was off set by the team contribution as mentioned above, this is due to having a full summer season for surf carnivals, including State Championships and Aussies which reflected on an increase in carnival entry fees and carnival related expenses.

Lifesaving expenditure

To support our Lifesaving commitment to ensure a safe aquatic environment at South Maroubra, investment was made in the purchase of new Lifesaving equipment \$16,020 (\$14,265 FY20/21) and IRB Equipment \$10,100.

Expenses incurred via the maintenance of Trailers and 2 x ATV's, provision of patrol lunches for our volunteer Lifesavers (\$4,992), Education/ Lifesaving Awards \$2,971, first aid supplies, lifesaving patrol apparel \$4,190 and IRB Service & Repairs \$3,923.

Nipper expenditure increased by 32% with a larger number of carnival entries \$16,471 (\$9,206 FY20/21) and an increase in the 2022 Nipper State Touring team for a cost of \$26,367 (\$7,958 FY 20/21) due to the number of competitors and apparel for the touring team which was subsidised by the section's fundraising efforts.

New Nipper boards were purchased at a net cost of \$1,444.

Nipper Presentations cost \$6,501, Development Camps \$5,131.

Events & Fundraising figures are higher primarily due to the associate cost of Bar Stock \$34,221 (\$14,305 FY20/21) and the Gold Members Day function. The Board held its annual Sponsors Function.

Member Expenses increased slightly this year to \$33,462 (\$28,640 FY 20/21).

Throughout the season and as Covid restrictions eased, we were able to open up our club bar and provide a number of club functions (including Presentation night) and incentives for the over 18 years membership. We introduced the 40s+ Fitness program

The Board continued to support retention efforts of our 13-to-17-year membership groups to the tune of \$2,300.

Depreciation - our financial statement stays on the path of our 13-year cycle of \$53,000 per annum deduction (Amortization) from our financial books to remove the listed clubhouse Land and Building value from \$700,000 to zero.

In Summary:

Despite Covid restrictions and the challenges faced throughout the year, the financial position of the club remains sound.

Expenditure restraint must still be maintained as we recover and plan for our building renovations.

Thanks to our Club Licensee Tony Shaw and our bar staff for the time they volunteered and their efforts this year. A big thank you to our Caretakers Barry & Lesley and our Office ladies. Like in previous seasons, all the above members have worked extremely hard this past year, along with the Board

of Management Committee, to ensure our members and supporters enjoyed their time spent at South Maroubra Surf Club.

Huge thanks to Tracey Teitler for stepping in and taking the reins from Kelly Fernandez, my personal thanks to you for your expertise and guidance in the preparation of our financial records for the club Auditor. Big thanks to Kelly for supporting me and Tracey during this process, and also to Uri for assisting Tracey and I as well.

In closing, I congratulate all our members for their efforts throughout the year.

This being my first year as your Director of Finance, I knew I had a big challenge ahead in filling in Yvette's shoes. I have done the best I could do, within my knowledge and capabilities to ensure our finances were managed appropriately and our club remained financially sound. I would like to thank my fellow board members for your continuous support and guidance, and thanks to Yvette Rutherford for being there to support me whenever I needed her help and support.



NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS
FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30TH APRIL, 2022

The financial statements cover the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Incorporated as a not-for-profit individual entity domiciled in Australia.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009*, the *Incorporation Regulation (NSW) 2016*, the *Charitable Fundraising Act (NSW) 1991*, and the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity, as it is unlikely there to exist users who are unable to command the preparation of reports tailored so as to satisfy specifically all of their information needs.

The basis for the decision to prepare a Special Purpose Report is the ACNC guidelines which state that charities with an annual revenue of more than \$250,000 but under \$1 million are classified as medium size and can submit a Special Purpose Report.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009*, the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations, the *Australian Charities and Not-for-profits Commission Act 2012*, and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

Any material accounting estimates, judgments and errors would be fully disclosed if applicable; for this report there are none.

No other applicable Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issue Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provision of the Income Tax Act.

Building

The building in which the Club is situated is shown in the accounts as having a net value of \$491,658. In the event of a termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value. The cost of the building will be depreciated over the remaining term of the lease with Randwick City Council due to expire 30th June 2031.

NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (CONTINUED)

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Events Subsequent to Balance Date

There were no significant events occurring after balance date.

Cash Flow Information

The Club has no credit stand-by or finance facilities in place.

Insurance

A Public Liability Insurance Policy is held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in lifesaving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

Fundraising Activities

Charitable Fundraising Act 1991: this Act and supporting Charitable Fundraising Regulations prescribe the manner in which fundraising appeals are conducted, controlled and reported in NSW. The amounts shown at Note 9 are in accordance with the Authority Condition 7, which is issued to the Club under section 19 of the Act.

Donations and bequests: These are returned as income as and only when received at the Club's administration office or deposited into the Club's bank account. As specified in the Act, unsolicited donations, members' donations and bequests are not treated as fundraising income when determining information required under the Act.

Cost of fundraising: Cost use in Note 9 includes all direct fundraising costs in accordance with the Act. The inclusion of indirect costs is discretionary. Excluded indirect costs include overheads such as the time spent by accounting or office staff administering appeals, cost apportionment of rent, light and power, and insurance. Exclusion of the indirect costs decreases the cost of fundraising.





BUILDING UPGRADE

Members, as you may have seen, South Maroubra SLSC undertook extensive upgrades during the year including: rectification works, club and member amenity improvements, internal painting, and knock down and rebuild of the club bar. Additionally, in working with Randwick Council throughout the season, resulting in us securing on-duty lifesaver parking and beachside improvements including widening of pathways from the car park and in front of the club, installation of irrigation and laying of new grass for the comfort of the public and families.

LICENSEE'S REPORT

The past season was again affected by the restraints of the Covid pandemic but during the season restrictions began to lift which saw a return to both functions and the Sunday social in the Heritage Room. Similarly, Oktoberfest was the victim of the Covid pandemic; however, the easing of these restrictions should see a return to the annual Fun Run being held in 2022. For those who have supported the event in previous years, expect a call to support this years' event.

The Sunday Socials continue to be more and more popular. The refurbishment of the grassed area outside the Heritage Room has allowed the club to establish a beer garden style look and this has increased the patronage of the Heritage Room, especially from members of the public who see the chance to have a quiet drink whilst enjoying one of the best ocean views in Sydney. This increased patronage bodes well for the future.

It was identified that the bar in the Heritage Room, which was originally from the old upstairs lounge, needed to be renovated to meet the demands of the future. The new bar has undergone a major face-lift and will be substantially increased in area and have, amongst other things, two dedicated serving areas, substantial storage, three post mix stations and a brand-new fridge. The renovation is well under way and will be completed prior to the 2021/22 AGM.

It would be remiss of me not to mention the support of our sponsors. Maroubra Seals Club and The Juniors Group of Clubs, to name just two, provide direct support to the licensee functions of the club. This support comes in a number of ways from providing glassware for the various beverages or use of vehicles to facilitate movement of goods to the club.

Finally, I take this opportunity to thank a number of people who worked tirelessly behind the bar namely, Gus Taylor, Isabella and Angelina Garay, Jacqui Simmis, Horst Menzel, Nick Hippman, Phillipa Stanley, Barry "Caretaker" Osbourne and Associate of the year Lesley. BUILDING COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Members, it gives me great pleasure to once again report the following information on the South Maroubra SLSC building front, an area of operation that many members may not know too much about nor be too concerned about. Let me assure you that here at South Maroubra, unlike some other clubs, we place a high degree of importance on trying to maintain our building whilst doing our best to plan for the future, providing wonderful members and community facilities.

Continuing on from last season we maintained dialogue with Federal, State and Local Governments regarding the funding of the comprehensive Phase 2 upgrade of our club, 12 years since Randwick City Council assisted us with Phase 1.

This year we have:

- Completed concept plans for Phase 2 renovation and received approval from the Board of Management to progress to detailed DA level plans. Thanks to Randwick Council who have co-funded the cost of these plans. The DA is expected to be lodged within a few months.
- A full club repaint and remedial work is at the time of writing underway at significant club expense. This remedial work is addressing some concrete cancer, water leaks through the club and due to their consequences, some plastering internally and externally. We also have resolved damage to rendering as part of the remedial work. Project completion is expected within 4 weeks or so depending on weather. We hope you love the colour selection!
- Full demolition and renovation of the club bar occurred during the off-season creating storage and working space, new refrigeration, beer lines and other associated equipment. Our thanks are extended to Rick Riosa, Richard Muirhead, Dolphins Winter Swimming Club, Ben Hall, Blake Yarnold and Jordan Perez our tradesmen for chipping in to contain costs. Big thanks to Matt Thistlethwaite MP for assisting with a small refrigeration grant.
- Council completed the re-turfing and irrigation installation of the grass area beachside of the club. This improvement combined with widening of the concrete pathway beachside has also made for a family and community friendly space that is loved by families.

- After a request from our club, Council provided a Duty Lifesaver specific marked parking area for weekends and public holidays allowing our rostered lifesavers an area to park.
- New Patrol surveillance stadium seating was purchased for our lifesavers and secured on the bitumen near the patrol tower for when surveillance occurs.
- Installation of anti-slip strips for the stairway ground floor to first floor to prevent slips.
- A concrete slab is coming for the new Nipper Storage container - to be located south of the club.
- Currently the club is examining solutions to top floor balcony waterproofing, lack of drainage and tile leaks. The repair of this large area is likely to occur next year when funding permits.

The above projects reflect the big-ticket items but plenty of smaller repair, replacements, and general maintenance and cleaning are everyday issues. We appeal to all members to respect your club by washing off in the public showers before entering the club, cleaning up after yourself and if you are a nipper parent - please control your kids inside the club. We often say if it's not acceptable at your home then it's not acceptable at our club, and please wear footwear inside the club. Thanks to Barry and Lesley our club caretakers for their efforts in keeping our club clean in a harsh environment and thanks to the Board of Management for looking after the club and its future.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING SERVICES' REPORT

What a season we have had! It's almost hard to know where to start, but I do know the outcome was a success and maybe that is all that matters in the end.

Kicking off the season contending with ever changing Covid rules, the lifesaving team, and particularly the Patrol Captains, really came together to ensure we could start as smoothly as possible. Despite another difficult year for all, I am proud that all the community within the Club came together for a very successful season.

This season we saw Darren Saunders come on as the new Assistant Director of Lifesaving Services, with the rest of the leadership team within the Lifesaving Portfolio remaining the same. The stability in the lifesaving committee has continued to allow us to grow on our learnings from the previous seasons to take on the challenges of the season.

As usual we kicked off the season with gear inspection, but this was no usual gear inspection. With lockdowns and travel restrictions we needed to work to ensure we could keep within the rules and make sure everything is up to spec. A big thank you to everyone who helped get all the gear ready in the lead up and helped conduct the checks, but particularly to Ken, Darren, Laurie, Scott, Codie and Maria who put in a lot of work making sure we were ready.

Recruitment, training and upskilling has been a big focus over the last few seasons, and this season was no different. We did however see a delay in starting up our courses. Our usual October Bronze and SRC courses did not run, however we did introduce our first intensive course running an SRC to Bronze course just before Christmas and then an SRC course late January. Each course was a 4-day course and was a great success. We will see this style of courses as a more permanent feature in our offerings. The education team rallied together, and I really can't thank them enough.

Despite the challenges we put through some excellent numbers this season along with a total of 215 awards this season. We have an impressive 103 new lifesavers, including 45 new Bronze Medallion holders, as well as 58 new Surf Rescue Certificate holders. With oxygen administration no longer a part of the BM course it was important we had more members upskill in the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate, this season we trained 15 more on this vital skill as well as a new trainer. We've changed the delivery of this course to a one-day intensive which has been well received by our members. Additionally, we trained 6 new IRB Crew.

We've also had members take up higher awards such as the Silver Medallion Beach Management (4) and the senior First Aid Certificate (70), which gives us members who will have a greater awareness and ability while on patrol.

Finally, but by no means the least, it's also been great to see new trainers join our training team. We can never have enough trainers and I hope we can see even more join us in the new season. If this interests you, come and have a chat with me or one of our trainers to learn what it's all about.

Patrols this season have been great, and I was happy to be able to get down to visit all the teams this past season and talk with our Patrol Captains and team members. With the growth in our active patrolling members, we were able to create a new patrol team this season, with Darren taking on the patrol captain role, along with Uri joining as VC. The ever-changing rules meant we started the season with reduced numbers and wearing masks. Once again, a massive thanks to all the PCs who helped to communicate with their teams the ever-changing rules and rostering on within their team to stay within our Covid plans. With stability in our member retention and a great influx of new lifesavers we have seen our patrol teams numbers grow again, as well as many taking up new skills means we're able to ensure those visiting the beach remain safe. Our members logged 10,232 hours this season.

Between Covid, storms, marine life, and floods we experienced very difficult beach conditions, with many closed beach days but this did not deter beach visitation. We certainly saw this in our stats with visitation (72,715) only slightly down on last season. Our rescues (50) were performed with a number of different equipment including the IRB (11), rescue board (10) and rescue tube (26), which demonstrates how important the equipment and skills of our lifesavers is. I was happy to see the number of preventative actions (4,514), and to know that our members are keeping a keen eye on swimmers from various vantage points on the beach and from an elevated position in our Patrol Tower and being proactive in swimmer interventions keeping them safe. After all, our purpose of existing as a club is to keep our beaches safe. I'm glad to report that again we had no lives lost between the flags.

This season with more flooding once again our membership stepped up and helped service the community. Thank you to Darren Saunders, Scott Hobday, Ashleigh Breden, Rene Prochnow, Isabella Garay and Andrew Wem for putting your hand up and attending the floods along with me, and Angelina Garay and Tom King for supporting the Police Call Centre. With each joint agency call

out we get, we learn more and provide a new level of service to the community.

I feel well settled into the Director of Lifesaving Services role and have learnt a lot during the course of the last few seasons. I've had the benefit of some great friends and mentors over the years and to all of you I am thankful. Thank you to valued lifesaving team members who have always offered the hand of friendship providing words of encouragement and advice plus have assisted in so many practical ways to achieve great outcomes. I would like to publicly acknowledge for the record the Lifesaving leadership Team - Darren, Laurie, Codie, and Ken for taking care of your sections so well and for providing feedback and guidance where needed. A very big thanks to the Board of Management for your support and backing. To all the Patrol Captains and other Lifesaving Committee members - thank you for your feedback throughout the season, the positive and constructive feedback means we can continue to grow.

It's hard to do what we do without funding and as such I would also like to thank all our supporters, without their generous contribution to the Club we couldn't provide the service we do. Big thanks to The Juniors Group, the Maroubra Seals Club, Matraville RSL Club and Earlwood-Bardwell Park RSL for providing key lifesaving equipment, Ampol for fuel sponsorship of our Inflatable Rescue Boat operations, and Randwick City Council for your continued support. As well as continued grants through SLSNSW and SLSCA.

I am extremely proud of our entire lifesaving community for ensuring visitors to our beach remained safe, to those who dedicate their time to training our new lifesavers and upskilling our current ones, to those who are available for emergency call outs or putting their hand up to attend flood ravaged communities to assist with evacuations: I thank you. I look forward to the 2022/23 season and seeing you all on the beach.

EDUCATION & TRAINING COORDINATOR'S REPORT

The 2021/22 season was a challenging one for the Education Team at South Maroubra, but despite the challenges we still saw the team put through great numbers. The Club finished the season with a total of 216 new awards, placing us 4th in the Branch for total number of awards. Ahead of us were Coogee, North Bondi and Bondi, and when you consider the membership base and the number of trainers they have, we as a Club should be extremely proud of the results delivered.

As it is every year, our main focus is getting new members through the door by way of the SRC and Bronze Medallion. This season saw us put through 58 SRC members and 45 Bronze Medallion members, bringing a total of 103 new patrolling members onto our beach. Our job now is to retain these members and encourage them to further enhance their lifesaving skills through the advanced awards we offer each season.

On top of a massive influx of new members, our returning members also sought out opportunities to increase their skill base, with 6 new IRB crews and 15 new Advanced Resuscitation award holders and we will look to build on these numbers even further going into next season. By adding the Apply First Aid course as a requirement for the bronze medallion, we put 70 through this course which is delivered by the SLSNSW Academy.

This season saw us introduce for the first time an SRC to Bronze and SRC intensive course. These were both well received, and will become a permanent fixture in our offerings. Each course ran for 4-days during the summer school holidays and is a great way to get our younger members through their awards.

I have to thank Hunter Perry who put his hand up to be the Education Coordinator this season, while personal and work commitments meant he was not able to see out the season he was a great help while he was able to assist. IRB LIFESAVING COORDINATOR'S REPORT

Another year, another IRB update out of me! Boats are floating and motors are running, is there anything else you want to hear out of me? The IRB section has been bubbling away through Covid for a final rebirth this season post Covid lockdowns! With everyone re-evaluating their lives and taking stock on where to spend their precious time I'm glad to say the section hasn't skipped a beat with the same dedicated lifesaving members showing up time and time again. If there is one man to thank already; only this far in it is Rene Prochnow. He has been by far the most dedicated lifesaver for my section this year. If you're a patrolling member odds are you have hung out with him a few times on patrol this year alone!

This season the section continued to grow with new recruits however we were restricted with the number of courses we could run due to the lockdown at the end of 2021. We now have 8 new IRB crewmen joining the ranks at South Maroubra Surf Club. This season saw extremely challenging conditions for all levels of IRB operators which led to a few spills. LIFESAVING IN ACTION



The 2021/2022 season was, once again, not without its challenges. With the uncertainty of a commencement date in accordance with the Public Health Orders, every effort was made to ensure South Maroubra Nippers were ready to pull the trigger as soon as the Government gave their approval for community sport to commence. The end result was South Maroubra Nippers were one of the first clubs in Sydney Branch to begin the season on the 30th of October 2021.

Covid compliance once again re-introduced restrictions with the checking of vaccination status', staggered start times, individual age zones, hand sanitizing, check-in areas, just to name a few. However, these restrictions were necessary to keep the nippers and volunteers safe and more importantly on the beach. The adaptability and resourcefulness of all the volunteers to deliver a program under these changes is nothing short of extraordinary.

With families experiencing a bit of "cabin fever" these last two years, it quickly became obvious families were looking for an outlet for their active children. This resulted in nearly 1100 Nippers registered, making South Maroubra Nippers the largest Nipper program in Australia, a growth of almost 20% up from 806 (2020-21). A program this size can only be maintained through the ongoing assistance of many parents/ caregivers volunteering their time to fill the roles of Age Managers, Beach Crew, Water Safety, and Surf Sport Coaches. Thank you to everyone who made Nipper Sundays possible. There were limitations placed on

us to deliver our program, but through the excellent planning skills of the Junior Development Committee and Board of Management, we made this work. What had the potential to be clunky - ran like clockwork.

From the support of new and existing Age Managers we were able to keep the doors open to old and new Nippers resulting in record numbers in the under 6, 7 and 8 age groups. The under 6 and 7 age groups continued to utilise the rock pools at the southern end of the beach. With over 350 nippers in these two age groups it is no small task to keep them all participating and engaged. Once again this was coordinated and led by the helpful eye of Lauren McLean, the U6/7 Age Managers and all the Beach Crew. The retention rate of these nippers coming back each year is an awesome achievement, and one we should all be very proud of.

Congratulations and a huge thank you to our Junior Captains, Georgie Kiernan and Vectis Buckett. Your commitment, approach, and willingness to be there to support and complete whatever task the Club asks of you, whilst being exemplary role models did not go unnoticed and is truly appreciated. You both did South Maroubra and your families proud. We can't wait to see what you bring to the Club in our senior path.

This season saw the election of a leadership committee from our Under 14 Nippers which was a new initiative employed by South Maroubra, on suggestion of the Under 14 Nippers. Led by our Junior Captains Georgie & Vectis they were

ably supported by a committee of: Jasmine Alexiou, Jessica Henville, Juliette Andersen-Allen, Matilda Saunders, Angus Messiter, and Luke Newrick. This group of young lifesavers are to be commended for the mature approach to these roles and onwards to their new lives as patrolling members. They were members of 51 strong age group, all achieving their SRC and becoming active patrolling members for the community.

We also sadly said farewell to our U14s Young Lifesavers as they've graduated from the program. We can't wait to see what they deliver in their senior path at the club but also look forward to still seeing them at Sunday Nippers supporting the program to their fellow younger nipper members.

I would like to bring special attention to our outgoing U14 Girls Age Manager, Thelma Milsop. Thelma has been with this group of girls since they commenced their Nipper journey. This on its own is not all that remarkable, however what makes it so is Thelma did not have a child registered in Nippers. Thelma only showed up all those years ago to support her partner, whose son was in the age group above. During this Age Managing journey, Thelma also achieved her Bronze Medallion to demonstrate to the girls what they could achieve. Thelma, thank you for your commitment to our Club and we'll find you a role to fill next season.

In order to develop great lifesavers and assets to the community, we invest a lot of resources focusing on lifesaving skills at the beach,



education and development of our young members and family members. During the past season, we delivered numerous training courses, with a number of our future young leaders representing our club at the Junior Development camps. They learnt and shared valuable leadership skills, whilst furthering their life saving skills, in a well-coordinated program.

- 626 achieved their age-appropriate Surf-Education awards;
- U13s/U14s achieved their SRCs and are actively patrolling our beach;
- 17 Parents achieved their Age Managers award;
- 13 of our age managers received their 5-year Age Manager Service certificate;
- A number of our cadets & parents achieved their Bronze Medallions, all doing active patrols and water safety;
- A number of our parents received their 15yr, 10yr & 5yr National Patrol Service Award; and
- A large number of our parents completed their first aid certificate.

COMPETITION/ TRAINING

Competitive surf and sand training had a delayed start due to the outbreak of the Delta variant of Covid in mid-2021 however our Nipper competitors threw themselves into training as soon as restrictions eased enough in October 2021 to enable group training all in the hopes of representing South Maroubra SLSC at the pinnacle event of competitive junior surf lifesaving - Sydney Branch Championships and the NSW State Age & Youth Championships.

We had big numbers in water and sand training attendance each week. With three, sometimes four training sessions offered

each week in both disciplines by our coaches, this was reflected in the improved skills and confidence that our nippers showed on normal nipper days, as well in competition.

To our Junior Coaches Marty Kiernan, Andy Newrick, Corinne Henville, George Alexiou, Murph Renford, Max Murphy, Drew Richardson, Tony Jenkins, Damian Alexiou, Jarrod Cullen, Steve Perry, and all of the water safety volunteers, I thank you for your guidance, support and encouragement. Your knowledge and commitment are appreciated. You all invested a massive amount of time and energy developing our Nippers competitive skills. It is rewarding to see how these young athletes develop to become great lifesavers.

To all of our carnival officials, water safety & IRB drivers who have supported our section over this season and volunteer their valuable time, thank you. Without you, our nippers would not be able to compete.

This season we also held our annual full day training camp. Due to poor weather conditions, our water athletes were moved to Malabar for training and our sand athletes stayed at South Maroubra. However, they all came together for lunch and an afternoon fun game of cricket. It was a pretty intensive training schedule but most importantly, it really brought the team together. It was an incredibly rewarding experience for the coaches and the kids, and certainly one that we will be repeating this next season.

This season the Touring Team Manager position was meticulously led by Renae McNamara. Renae's work ethic and organisational skills are second to none. The detailed communication which we were always provided with meant that we all knew where we supposed and when, which is no mean feat.

Renae, thank you for keeping us so well organised. We are forever grateful, and we would not have had such a successful season without you.

Once again, the Sydney Branch water competition was unable to be held at Maroubra Beach and was moved to Yarra Bay. The sand competitors stayed and competed in windy, sometimes almost cyclonic conditions at Maroubra beach. The last-minute changes are something that we have learned to live with over recent times. South Maroubra Nippers were successful in finishing 3rd in the overall point score, an amazing result out of 12 Sydney clubs.

At the NSW State Junior Surf Life Saving Championships, South Maroubra Nippers sent our largest competitive touring team of 141 Nippers aged U9-U14 at the Sydney Northern Beaches. Over the first 2 days of competition our U9-U12 competitors got to battle it out with the best of the best junior surf sports athletes in NSW in the water and on the sand. However, on Day 2 some of the U9 & U10 team events were canceled due to worsening surf conditions. For our U13, U14, March Past Team, Competitors with a Disability, and our U14 Champion Lifesavers, their State Championships was cut short with many not even getting the opportunity to compete due to the intensely bad weather and an outbreak of gastro virus on Day 3 which led to the premature cancellation of the carnival after only a few hours of competition. Despite multiple attempts to reschedule the NSW State Championships over the following two weeks, Mother Nature once again had other plans. Unfortunately, the difficult decision was then made to cancel all further events at the State Championships leaving our older Nippers bitterly disappointed.

However, despite all these setbacks, South Maroubra

Nippers were successful in finishing 2nd in the overall point score at the NSW State Age Championships. This is the best result a team from South Maroubra has ever achieved at this level.

We also finished off the season with our current U8 nippers having their first deep water training sessions at Malabar Beach. Over 3 weekends we had a fantastic turn out at each session, even braving some really cold conditions, something we have become accustomed to. Thank you to coach Marty and all the water safety for putting these introduction sessions on.

AWARDS/ PRESENTATIONS

This season's presentations were split over 2 nipper Sundays with our young U6, U7 and U8 age group presented with their participation medals and awards under a banner of blue and white balloons. The older nippers received their awards on the last day of the nipper season. It was a bittersweet day full of lots of joy and laughter but also an emotional day as we farewelled our U14s on their graduation day.

Congratulations to the Nippers that were awarded with their 100%, 200%, 400%, 500%, 600% and even 800% & 900% attendance trophies, a well-deserved award and recognition to the nippers and families for such commitment, and of course, congratulations to the recipients of the Coaches and Age Manager's awards.

Congratulations to all Nippers that received medals at the NSW State Championships and congratulations to our Club Champions for your age groups. The Bruce Rutherford Memorial Award for the most outstanding surf female nipper competitor of the season was awarded to Georgie Kiernan, a well-deserving recipient, congratulations Georgie. This year we also introduced

the Max Murphy Shield, who's recipient was in recognition for outstanding contribution to Surf Sports - Beach Events. Congratulations Ryan McNamara for being the first ever recipient of this shield, well deserved.

Thank you to the club's education team led by Nicole Cooney, Director of Lifesaving Services. The dedication of the club training officers is to be commended in helping our future lifesavers and parents learn more about the surf, beach conditions and valuable lifesaving skills. Thank you, Nicole, also for the wonderful work you do with our SRCs. The numbers are growing each year and the beaches are safer for it because of you.

A special call out to Matt Brown who really goes above and beyond to ensure that Nippers runs smoothly every Sunday, whether it's getting in early to run the Drop and Go car park, help set up and pack up the beach or just get the troublesome AV system going!

To my trusty right-hand registrar, Chantal Hughes, making sure that the largest Nipper group in Australia is entered in the system and then tallied and counted is no small feat. Thanks for all your effort again this season.

DIRECTOR OF COMPETITION'S REPORT

Season 2021/22 was a successful yet challenging summer for the competition section again interrupted by Covid followed by a once in a century weather pattern that disrupted all water sports on the East Coast of Australia. This was topped off with the increased wildlife activity. This perfect storm led to countless carnivals being cancelled including the NSW State Titles at Queenscliff. All water sports were pretty much non-existent for our swimmers and craft competitors for a lot of the summer with training moved to the pool or gym. Our runners and boat rowers were business as usual, and we all moved on with our end goal of the Aussie Titles that was moved from Perth to the Gold Coast.

We sent a team of 165 represented in all disciplines spearheaded by our increasingly strong Cadet section that had transitioned from our successful Nipper program. For the first time at the Australian Surf Life Saving Titles, the Under 13's joined the Under 14 & 15's at the Youth Titles which kicked off the 10-day carnival at North Kirra. Our swimmers and board paddlers competed well with some great results, yet it was our sand competitors that excelled.

It's not every day we see a South Maroubra cap standing on top of the dais at the Aussie Titles. After coming close in the sprint, we were privileged to see a faultless performance from Josh Ballard in the flags. Josh showed his true grit and determination to outlast close to 200 competitors in a very strong field to take home GOLD. It was a proud moment for the whole team and a just reward for all of the hard work Josh put in over the season.

With Silver for Vectis Bucket in the Under 14 Champion Lifesaver and Bronze for Jasmine Alexiou in the 2Km Ocean swim we were destined for our best club result in many years. After the Youth titles had concluded, we had pocketed 6 medals giving the Masters and Boaties plenty to be inspired by. Our Masters again did us proud bagging another 6 medals led by individual medals by Max Murphy, Michael Renford and Genevieve Anderson.

SOUTH MAROUBRA OCEAN SWIM

Twelve months ago we were discussing how we were going to raise funds for vital surf life saving equipment and the upcoming Australian Surf Life Saving Titles in Perth.... It was suggested we look at running an Ocean Swim, and the rest is history.

The last time South Maroubra hosted an Ocean Swim was 2018 and therefore there was much excitement when asked for interest in putting a sub-committee together. We came up with a standalone date on the Anzac weekend towards the end of the ocean swimming season which is always hard to find in the jam packed calendar. This date was also chosen due to historical weather and surf conditions at that time of the year normally being perfect at Maroubra Beach for such an event. At the time of committing, we were coming out of Covid and life was slowly going back to normal.

Our aim was to maximise our exposure and make it a professional event without taking too much time from our members in the registration of the event. We partnered with the Register Now platform for registrations, Multisport for the timing and OceanSwims for the marketing to the wider ocean swim community. It took many hours setting this up with long term gain and ease for future events. These 3 companies did a wonderful job for which we are very grateful.

In the lead up, we were hit with relentless rain, bad weather and large ocean swells. The ocean turned brown from all of the run off which increased the wildlife activity close to the coast. 17 out of 20 Ocean swims had been postponed or cancelled prior to our swim and the Ocean Swim Season had become the worst ever. 3 days before our swim we had 75 participants registered and it didn't look promising. Some last minute meetings were called and with the help from some good forecasting and the expertise of the Lifeguards, the nervous decision was

made to run the swim, all praying for reasonable conditions and the water to clean up. "You will never never know if you don't have a go..."

The 24th of April had arrived and our prayers were answered. The skies were clear, waves small with a light off-shore wind and the water had cleaned up. Our members turned up in droves to help out with workforce and the vibe was fantastic. We started with the Junior 500m Swim for 10 to 13 year old's. This was followed by the 1km & 2.5km Open events. Late entries were on fire and the swimming community were ready to hit the water once again. We finished with just shy of 300 swimmers and the day went off without a hitch.

We also combined the swim with the end of year patrolling celebration with a band to party well into the afternoon. The BBQ was pumping, the bar was keeping everyone well refreshed and it was a wonderful way to celebrate another successful season.

I would like to thank all of our Sponsors that donated after a very challenging year for business. Without your support, the swim would not have gone ahead hoping you are all onboard for a bigger swim next year. Thank you to the Ocean Swim Sub Committee for all of your hard work and dedication to make it so successful. Special call out to our two guest MC's Emily Miers and Grant Balldock for their time and amazing commentary. Thank you to the Board of Management for their support, guidance and willing to proceed. A big thank you to all members that turned up on the day and helped out in any way. The feedback from everyone was extremely positive and we are looking forward to next years swim.

Our two veterans crews also won their divisions and claimed GOLD medals on the day. Our junior boys, the GT's had a huge day and were unlucky to just miss out on a medal with a strong 4th place.

The Aussies returned to the spiritual home on the Gold Coast at Broadbeach. This was until Monday when Huey decided to throw up huge surf and the racing was relocated to Kirra. Our vets raced well on veterans day, with the Snagglepuss just missing a medal and finishing a respectable 4th place in the final.

Getting all 3 junior crews up to the Aussies was a huge effort

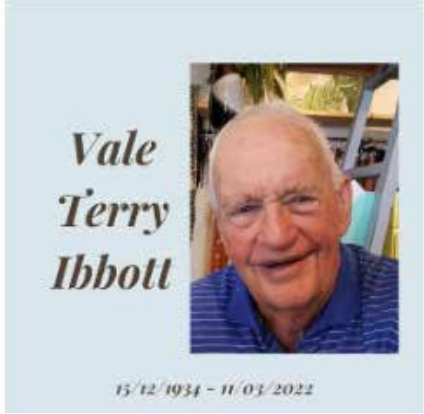

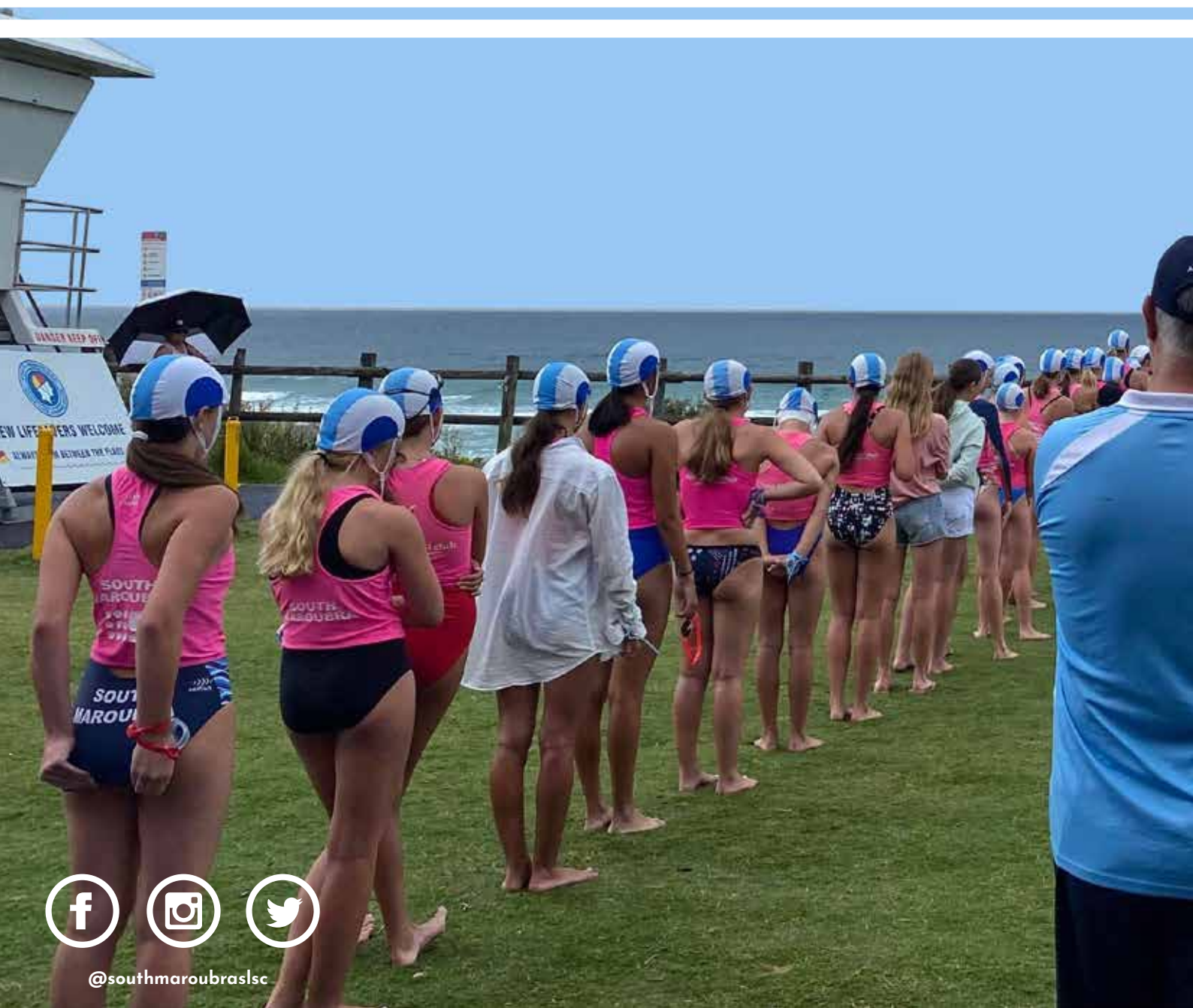
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
