

LIFESAVING

Lifesaving Statistics were clearly affected by the bush fires followed by Covid which saw an early finish to Surf Patrols. This season we saw lifesavers effect 57 Aquatic Rescues, 4,469 Preventatives Actions, First Aid cases increased to 302 with many marine stings contributing to the larger total. So, a great job done by all involved from our Lifesaving Department. We enjoyed positive membership retention and new Bronze and SRC members despite a premature interruption to the second group of squads which I hope can be completed as early as possible. Thanks to all our Trainers and Coaches for progressing the skills of our members.

Despite the interruption to season 2019/20 we still saw many events take place including; the very successful 60th Anniversary Celebration MC'd by Toby Harrison where we reflected on the contribution by so many past members and celebrated with current and former members in our own wonderful Horizons Function room.

- Conducted another successful Sportsman's Day with a great crowd enjoying a host of outstanding speakers

- Conducted an ashes at sea ceremony of former member Brian Davies with his family celebrating his life

VICE-CHAIRMAN'S REPORT


ADMINISTRATION

On behalf of the Board of Management, I present for your consideration and adoption the 62nd Annual Report and Financial Statement of South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club Inc. for the Season 2019/20.

Being a volunteer lifesaving organisation, our core business and objective are to provide a safe aquatic environment to our customers. I can proudly state that once again, our diverse team of highly skilled volunteer lifesavers have achieved our objective with No Lives Lost between the flags during this season.

These amazing results are the result of the dedication, attitude and magnificent team work of our patrolling members, we volunteer our work and time to keep public safe at our beach and expect nothing in return.

SLSA is the largest multifaceted volunteering organisation worldwide that comprises key aspects of lifeguard services and competitive surf sports.

SLSA strives to create a safe environment on Australia's beaches and coastline through patrols, education and training, public safety campaigns and the promotion of health and fitness. Additionally SLSA offers many avenues and opportunities to its members to expand and enhance their skills.

FINANCE REPORT

With pleasure I present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club for the lifesaving season 2019/20.

During the financial year ending 30th April 2020 the club shows an operating profit of \$57,415 compared to last season's loss of \$76,662.

The club experienced total revenue of \$616,649, a small increase on last year. Donations, Grants and Sponsorship increased by 29% resulting from the procurement of 5 new club sponsorships whilst other traditional sources of income remained solid.

- Membership revenue increased by 5%
- Overall Membership numbers increased this season by 6% to reflect an active membership of 1493. We retained 845 members, lost 597 and welcomed 647 new members
- Merchandise net sales increased by 60%
- Donations, Grants & Sponsorship accounted for \$240,937 of annual income
- Club Hire of the Heritage room decreased by 8% due to early shut down measures passed down by the Government due to the Covid-19 pandemic resulting in a number of lost bookings for the period March and April 2020 however gross bar takings were slightly increased throughout the season
- Top Cat Catering, who lease out the clubhouse Horizons Function Centre, continue to be the clubs main form of revenue

We decreased expenditure by 14% this financial year resulting in a spend of \$559,234 in total.

Club expenditure can be explained by the following:

- Admin/General Operating costs have increased by 12% including capitation fees at \$32,642
- Building & Property expenditure decreased by 92%. There were no major clubhouse



- building projects undertaken this season however electricity, lift maintenance, insurance & general running/ maintenance costs continue to grow
- Our Competition section took delivery of a new surf boat which was fully sponsored. Carnival entry fees across the club cost \$17,000 (nippers) & \$4,819 (Seniors). It is worthy to note some nipper carnival entries fees are now payable by the competitor to offset this increasing cost
- Lifesaving expenditure increased on last year with the purchase of 2 x ATV's, IRB's, IRB Motors, Boards and other essential lifesaving equipment
- Nippers purchased new boards and rescue tube equipment worth \$12,000. Expenditure for our nipper touring team of over 100 competitors increased by 13%
- Year 2 of 13, we recorded the annual deduction (Amortization) of \$53,635 from our financial books to remove the listed clubhouse Land and Building value from \$700,000 to zero

Functions, Events and Fundraising

Numerous events & fundraising activities were held throughout the year for the benefit of members, fundraising, sponsorship and community relations. Thanks to our Club Licensee Gus Taylor, Caretakers Barry & Leslie (Heritage room coordination), Bar Staff, Tony & Jack Shaw and Ken Hudson (Oktoberfest), Paul Fownes, Yvette & Grant Rutherford, Maria & Marcelo Garay and Linda Perrin (Sportsman Day), Greg & Quinta Turton and the wonderful Nipper team (Bingo and numerous nipper

BBQs), Phil Stivano (State of Origin Night), Laurie Golsby & Scott Hobday (IRB Section). The above and many more club members made an extra effort and contributed to the running of all our club events and fundraising activities. Special mention to all club members that contributed to our Coin donation for the NSW Fire Appeal. A \$3,000 cheque was presented to the Bermagui SLSC. The Board continued to support our lifesavers and members with the provision of patrol lunches, club socials and live entertainment, bar promotions, youth camps and associated activities.

It was most unfortunate that we were not able to hold our annual nipper and club 'end of season' socials and presentations due to the forced ending of the season at the beginning of March (due to Covid-19 restrictions on public gatherings). Please be assured that the clubs Committee is rescheduling a number of events for this coming season when restrictions are lifted.

Sponsorship

The Juniors Group, Maroubra Seals Club & Matraville RSL donated funds to our club from the ClubsGrant scheme allowing for the purchase of vital lifesaving equipment. Randwick City Council also honoured long standing agreements with the club and continued their annual grant to assist the club with expenses related to the building and administration.

We also acknowledge Top Cat Catering, Bisley Workwear, RAMS Sydney South East,

Caltex, Sydney City Volkswagen, Cameron Airlie & NG Farah, Building with Options & EISS Super for their continued sponsorship and support of our club. Further on in the annual report is a list and acknowledgment to all of our club sponsors and supporters where we pass on our sincere thanks and gratitude.

This past season we welcomed 5 new sponsor's to our club family – Channel 10, NSW Ports, Southend Hotel, Ford Civil Contracting and JCM Excavations. We look forward to the remaining two year partnerships and expanding our relationship. Thank you to club member Uri Teitler and all club members who financially contributed to the purchase of a new ATV, Laurie Golsby (IRB Section), Peter 'Dino' Steenson and Rebecca Hamilton (Surfboat Section). Your assistance is greatly appreciated.

As our club continues to grow in Membership it has resulted in a massive increase in the workload for our club Officers, administration staff and volunteers. We are now the third largest nipper club in the Nation and I pass on my thanks to Michelle Lo, Maria Garay, Denise Silva and all the other club parents for all your assistance in the club office, selling club apparel, taking membership fees only to mention a few of the tasks. NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act NSW and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations. The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act and the NSW Charitable Fundraising Act and Regulations and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

The financial report is also prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provision of the Income Tax Act.

Building

The building in which the Club is situated is shown in the accounts as having a net value of \$598,929. In the event of a termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value. The cost of the building will be depreciated over the remaining term of the lease with Randwick City Council due to expire 30th June 2031.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Events Subsequent to Balance Date

There were no significant events occurring after balance date.

Cash Flow Information

The Club has no credit stand-by or finance facilities in place.

Insurance

A Public Liability Insurance Policy is held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in lifesaving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

Fundraising Activities

Charitable Fundraising Act 1991: This act and the supporting Charitable Fundraising Regulation prescribe the manner in which fundraising appeals are conducted, controlled and reported in NSW. The amounts shown at Note 8 are in accordance with the Authority Condition 7, which is issued to the Club under Section 19 of the Act.

Donations and bequests: These are returned as income as and only when received at the Club's administration office or deposited into the Club's bank account. As specified in the Act, unsolicited donations, members' donations and bequests are not treated as fundraising income when determining information required under the Act.

Cost of fundraising: Cost use in Note 8 includes all direct fundraising costs in accordance with the Act. The inclusion of indirect costs is discretionary. Excluded indirect costs include overheads such as the time spent by accounting or office staff administering appeals, cost apportionment of rent, light and power, and insurance. Exclusion of the indirect costs decreases the cost of fundraising.






catchment system and keep the beachside grass nice and green.

What a mixed bag this season was! The bush fires and then Covid-19 saw us experience new and unprecedented circumstances, with the latter ending our season four weeks early. In our second year as a team the Lifesaving Committee certainly stood up and led by example throughout the season. And we certainly had many laughs and good times.

I am extremely proud of our entire lifesaving community for ensuring visitors to our beach remained safe, to those who dedicate their time to training our new lifesavers and upskilling our current ones, to those who are available for emergency call outs or putting their hand up to attend fire ravaged communities to assist with evacuations: I thank you.

As we do, we kicked off the season with gear inspection with the whole lifesaving committee pulling together to ensure all our gear was up to spec. A big thank you to all those who helped on the day, ensuring we got through.

Kicking off patrols, we saw the return of Patrol 2 with Ben Keenan-Smith at the helm, and Patrol 14 with Laurie Golsby as the new patrol captain. Healthy recruitment over the last few years has meant we have also been able to flesh out many of our patrol teams. With the continued uptake of higher awards, it means we are seeing some greatly skilled lifesavers ensuring the safety of visitors to our beach. We have also had some great new IRB drivers and crew come through which has meant we have been able to supply dedicated drivers and crews to our Sunday nippers. With the season ending early we see lower number for total patrol hours, rescues and preventions, although it would seem we had a great number of stingers visit our beach this season with the majority of our first aids attributed to bluebottles. It's still great to see a good number of preventatives, meaning our lifesavers are being proactive in swimmer interventions keeping them safe. Because after all our purpose of existing as a club is to keep our beaches safe. I'm glad to report that again we had no lives lost between the flags.



Recruitment, training and upskilling continues to be focus point for lifesaving. Building on the increasing numbers from the previous seasons, and with Michael Fernandez's continued dedication, we were again on track to kick some goals in this area. However Covid-19 cut short a Bronze and SRC course and meant the cancellation of higher awards such as IRB drivers/crew, and advanced resuscitation. We hope to get our bronzies and SRC through before the new season kicks off. It's also great to see a good number of our members take on higher awards at Branch including the Silver Medallion Aquatic Recue and the Silver Medallion Beach Management. I'd like to say a massive thank you to all our trainers who dedicate a great number of hours to training our lifesavers and to Mike for leading the way. The new season will see a new challenge in the launch the new Bronze Medallion and SRC courses, but our trainers are more than capable of taking them on.

We continue to update our gear and ensure we are prepared for all occasions. In the IRB section, Laurie again led the way in further improving the section and ensuring our gear is always rescue ready. With a good maintenance procedure in place, the section is sure to continue to be a key part of our lifesaving capability. I'd again like to thank Ken Hudson for all the hard work he also puts into the section, guiding and assisting Laurie.

I have a great many people to thank including valued team members who have always offered

the hand of friendship, providing words of encouragement, and advice plus have assisted in so many practical ways to achieve great outcomes. 



IRB COORDINATOR REPORT

Another year, another annual report! I've been the IRB Coordinator now for 2 years and quite a bit has improved and shifted in the section. We have grown and improved this year in ways that should hold the ship on course for years to come. The season had its ups and downs like any year but it was a good step forward from last year.

In 2019/20 the section continued to dig deep to find new recruits for our flourishing IRB section. We now have 10 new IRB crewman and 6 new IRB drivers joining the ranks at South Maroubra Surf Club. This season saw extremely challenging condition for all levels of IRB operators which lead to some injuries; but by all reports they can't wait to jump back into the IRB. Our growing IRB operator numbers have not dipped in quality and ensure safe operation of our IRB fleet. The training team this year consisted of Nicole Krite, Isabelle Heazelwood and myself all under the leadership of Ronny Krite. We all had plans for more crews and drivers' courses for the season however it all came to an end with Covid-19 restrictions hitting.

Our resources are not only used to keep our beach safe but we provide water safety to a number of lifesaving events. I would like to express my gratitude to those who have assisted in all water safety events at the various carnivals throughout the season. I would like to give a special note to Ashleigh Braeden, Kirsten Newrick, David Dubois and Uri Teitler who stepped in to provide weekly IRB support to Nippers. To Nicole Cooney, Ashleigh Braeden and Kirsten Newrick, that made the long trek to Swansea to watch over the NSW State Age and Masters' carnivals, I appreciate you for sacrificing your weekends.

With the assistance of Ken Hudson our maintenance team were able to hold all our lifesaving equipment in tip top shape. As we saw old motors decommissioned and new engines placed on patrol, we didn't miss a beat this season; thanks to the donations from The Juniors Group, The Seals Club and The Coogee



Lions Club. From the lessons learnt this year we have regular maintenance schedule for all IRB equipment. To assist with the care for our IRB equipment I have tried to create a few SOP's (Standard Operating Procedures) that are currently hanging next to the patrol engines. These I believe are informative and assist with basic problem solving. I am due to create an updated version this season to refine the information and ensure that anyone can use these documents.

We sold two of three of our old IRBs this season. The two old 375 Achilles well on their way 20 years of age have been passed along to great homes where they will serve as fishing boats for families. The hard hull we are looking to retire is still being bided on but we hope to sell it soon. The money from these boats will go towards a parts register for our IRB fleet to shorten the turn around time on damaged equipment to ensure the section is running at full capacity all year round. With old boats making their way out of the section new ones are bound to follow suit. We brought back a Gen I Arancia and had a new floorboard for the boat donated by the IRB team. We have also purchased a

Gen II Thundercat with donated money from the Southend Hotel. Further to replace the older gear we have two brand new Gen III Thundercat's which have been generously donated from The Juniors Group.

I would like to send my gratitude to those who have helped me through this season whether it being assisting moving engines when I'm by myself in the shed or assisting when I call upon IRB members for water safety. I would like to express extra gratitude to Alex Shaddock, William Shaddock, Scott Hobday, Ken Hudson, Nicole Cooney, Codie Wem, John Golsby and Lee Golsby who have helped me push through the trials and tribulations of being the IRB Coordinator. With the experiences and lessons learnt from this season I'm sure if I am graced with the opportunity in being the IRB Coordinator for another season there will only be more improvement out of the section which I hope holds proud to the rich history of the South Maroubra IRB section.

DIRECTOR OF YOUTH REPORT

The 2019/2020 season has been one for the record book. Record numbers of new lifesavers, record storms and a global pandemic.

As in previous seasons, we were highly focused on member engagement, member participation, retention and looking at ways to improve more on the member experience. The professionalism, commitment and knowledge of our volunteers has been the key to the success of our program. This season we built on the previous seasons numbers with 850 nippers signed up. In order to develop great lifesavers and assets to the community, we invest a lot of resources focusing on lifesaving skills at the beach, education and development of our young members and family members. During the past season, we delivered numerous training courses, with a number of our Nippers representing our club at the Junior Development camps.

A number of our future young leaders from the U11s and U13s represented our club at the Sydney Branch Nipper Development camps. They learnt and shared valuable leadership skills, whilst furthering their lifesaving skills, in a well-coordinated program.

COMPETITION/TRAINING

This season's nipper training program was well structured, inclusive, and thorough, providing a more flexible approach and allowing working parents/carer's to take advantage of the program for their children. With the support of our board coaches, we started board training in early August, which was a huge success.

We had big numbers in water training attendance. Large numbers of Nippers attending surf swimming and board training, this reflected in the improved skills and confidence that our nippers showed on normal nipper days, as well in competition. Sand training was also developed further, providing again a well-structured and flexible program, we saw our attendance soar, what a great achievement.

Your knowledge and commitment are appreciated. Following on from the success of last year was the 2-day training camp at the club, with all the touring team members sleeping over at the club house. It was a pretty intensive training schedule but most importantly it really

brought the team together. It was an incredibly rewarding experience for the coaches and the kids, and certainly one that we will be repeating this season. I am sure the kids that swam out to the shark nets will never forget that experience!

Our nippers represented our club at several events during the season all over Sydney, Northern and Illawarra Branches, they wore and represented our club colour's with pride, enthusiasm and competed in a fair and friendly manner. This season the Touring Team Manager position was meticulously led by Renae McNamara. Renae's organisation, work ethic and communication meant that we all knew where we supposed and when, which is no mean feat. The Nippers and their families have never been so organised.

With the Sydney Branch competition cancelled this year due to huge surf conditions the run up to the State Competition was a bumpy one. It was the third year at Blacksmiths Beach up at Swansea - Belmont for the State Championships. We had a large contingency of 121 Nippers representing South Maroubra, who competed solidly, placing 6th in over-all point score in the State. Congratulations to the management team and coaches, it was a magnificent effort by our athletes... Well done!

And once again, Deanne Goldschmidt outdid herself by designing a unique and cool uniform for our team, we were the envy of many clubs at State, Thanks so much Deanne.

A presentation day was conducted for our young U6s, U7s and U8s who were presented with their medals, certificates and awards.

A disappointing end to an excellent season for the Boaties,

With Aussies cancelled due to COVID19 and Sydney Branch also cancelled due to large surf conditions, our season came to an end after the NSW State Championships. To say the Boaties were disappointed would be an understatement; however, we were lucky as most other states didn't get to run their state championships, finishing our season with several fantastic road trips.

South Maroubra surfboats are in a fantastic position with eight crews making it to the starting line last season. These crews are all keen to race again next season proudly representing our great club on the beach in the greatest sport of all. As I write this report, a group of young boys has been put together to fill the junior boys' division next season. Stay tuned!

Our team has bonded well now after a few seasons together, having another great season with some highs and lows and some fantastic results as a group.

Watching our A-grade girls (BISLEY) step up and into the top women's division was awesome after dominating the Reserve grade in their first year together the previous season. We saw 10 new competitors come into the team which put massive workload onto the IRB competition teams leaders.
