PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with great pleasure and a degree of relief that I am able to report to you the successful completion of the 2020/21 season, on time and as planned, albeit with a few hurdles along the way.

I'm sure most members on the back of the premature end to the previous season courtesy of COVID-19, which followed on from bush fires and floods that devastated large areas of the state, were wondering how this season would be conducted and if in fact it would occur at all.

Yes, the season progressed. No, it certainly wasn't a normal season; and yes, like every other season, we excelled in the face of adversity and here we are in July preparing for season 2021/22.

So, with a sigh of relief, let's get back to the season review that was 2020/21, a season where we saw state and national borders close, which in turn, resulted in massive increases in crowds from all parts of Greater Sydney diverging on Sydney beaches.

Despite many unplanned developments, our club rallied the troops and got through the season with 'no lives lost' whilst flags were up and our members on patrol.

Lifesaving wise and with much bigger crowds during the season, our volunteer lifesavers carried out a total of 86 Aquatic Rescues, 8,822 Preventative Actions, where swimmers were directed back into safe areas, and a massive 589 First Aid cases (thanks to swarms of bluebottles). Other lifesaving items of interest included:

- Record number of Bronze Medallion and Surf Rescue Certificate attained by our members.
- Record retention of our trained lifesavers.
- Lifesavers Ben Hall and Boat Captain Phil came to the rescue of a driver after an exploding gas bottle ignited with the driver still in his car.
- Implementation of Beach Safety Plans to manage massive weekend crowds, use of additional PPE, QR codes and hygiene precautions.
- The remarkable presence of air, sea and land oversight of crowds by NSW Police.

Yes, one summer season that will be difficult to forget. Congratulations are extended to the lifesaving leadership team and patrolling members!

Competition was also affected by COVID-19 with off and on-again carnivals, restrictions including reduced participation, longer daytime events in separated sections of a beach making it difficult for coaches and multi-discipline competitors to navigate between competition areas. Our IRB competition, including all 4 Rounds, State and Australian Championships at the back end of last season were

cancelled, although as I complete this report, this season's competition is underway.

Highlights of the season for me include;

- A number of coaches from our junior coaching team made the transition to our opens coaching team to support our athletes, including the youth members that graduated from Nippers along with existing members. This provided a more robust and thorough training program during the season.
- Our junior boaties in their first year of rowing, making it to the semi-finals of Aussies.
- Our club re-entering into lifesaving pool events under a new team of coaches.
- Our growing and successful group of masters covering many disciplines.
- Great results at Branch, State and exposure for our youth members and support team to the Australian Championships.
- Enthusiasm towards next season by all sections, including a more focused and determined boat section with some solid support around the team.

Nippers during the 2020/21 season certainly looked very different to years gone by. We started the season with Greg and his leadership team confronting a very different landscape when it came to participation, events and competition.

During the lead up to the season, we as a club confronted a real 'fork in the road' moment, where we had a choice to cut and run-in terms of electing to keep the books open for existing nippers to return, whilst also accepting potential nippers turned away at other clubs or declining membership in certain age groups due to COVID-19 along with social distancing requirements. Naturally as most would expect, South Maroubra elected the more difficult option and set ambitious membership thresholds, welcoming all kids that wished to learn the skills our nipper curriculum provides.

Selecting the more difficult option meant our nipper management team had to develop a transparent and detailed COVID-19 Beach

Safety Plan with age groups separated by barriers, access and egress plans managed by giant size directional signage and beach usage plan, COVID-19 Marshals, removal of beach relays, introducing hygiene processes for shared equipment and in another first, the creation of two nipper sessions, meaning a 6.30am start for set up volunteers to a 12pm pack up. To accommodate this, the creation of a 'drop and go' parking area allowing second session parents a safe drop off area.

Highlights of the nipper season for me include.

- How our nippers excelled in top class competition placing 6th out of 100 odd clubs at the highest-level at the State Championships.
- The determination of our entire nipper leadership group to battle and grow through COVID-19 whilst other clubs took the more conservative position.
- Becoming the largest nipper group in Australia and at the same time putting in all necessary safeguards to protect our families and members whilst also committing to a more time intensive program.

How would I describe the 2020/21 season? Perhaps demanding at times although rewarding, intense but also exhilarating, and periods of sadness mixed with happiness! Here's a short snapshot.

- We completed a long-awaited project, managed by Director of Finance and Life Member Yvette Rutherford, delivering a comprehensive solar panel project.
- We presented two Gold Member events, Australia Day, Good Friday, State of Origin matches, Grand Final Day, and Social Sundays every single Sunday, featuring our new beer garden as part of our COVID-19 Safety Plan.
- We once again acknowledged 'All Fallen Members' in our annual remembrance event.
- Conducted a wonderful reunion of our very first female lifesavers as part of our celebration of 40 years of Women in Surf Lifesaving.
- Conducted a COVID-19 Safe Sportspersons Day, Comedy for a Cause, and Trivia fundraising events.
- Hosted a wonderful sponsors and



supporters appreciation function.

- COVID-19 impacted all room hire bookings and income for our Heritage and Horizons lounges, eliminating a much-needed source of income.
- In a major blow for the club, we farewelled a great mate, an active Life Member and a true-blue long serving character in **John Marks**.
- We also farewelled former Clubman of the Year and Caretaker Dennis Clarke.
- We christened a wonderful new surf boat named in memory of fallen member Peter Farr-Jones aka *"The Woon"*.

In closing and acknowledging major supporters.

The word COVID-19 and its consequences is littered throughout my report. The pandemic created many challenges but in the true spirit of South Maroubra, we confronted and overcame those challenges much of the time. For that, I would like to congratulate all sectional leadership teams who put in place systems, plans, and the members who worked around the restrictions without complaint and of course all of the stakeholders and supporters we work so closely with in particular Mayor Danny Said, Councillors and Council staff, including its team of Lifeguards who acted in a proportionate manner when other Councils panicked and overreacted throughout the pandemic.

I hope those reading this report noticed improved communications to the membership utilising social media platforms such as the Club's Facebook pages, Twitter and Instagram, as well as, monthly newsletters, emails, our website, and SITUATION REPORTS (SITREPs) where we announced all major COVID-19 changes to club operations including restrictions, reopening of facilities, and other events of importance to be noted.

I'd like to extend my congratulations to members who were nominated and successful at our Presentation Night, Branch Awards of Excellence and Branch Championships, in particular Noah Teitler. Congratulations to Noah in being recognised and receiving the following awards:

- SLSS Junior Lifesaver of the Year
- SLSS U15 Lifesaver of year
- Club's Most Outstanding Cadet of the Year
- Club's Junior Lifesaver of the year

Thank you to our Caretakers Barry and Lesley for their ongoing commitment to members and the upkeep and security of the club. To Gus and Tony 'Head' Shaw, our very reliable and loyal Licensee and trainee Licensee, both of whom volunteer their expertise and time to help create a fun Social Sunday, plus run club social events, thank you. To our small band of volunteer bar staff, a big thank you as well for your precious time.

Thank you to my fellow Board of Management Members who work so hard to stay across all of the developing issues whilst working with their respective teams. At this point in time I make particular mention in this report of Life Member Yvette Rutherford who is the longest serving ever Board member and is standing down from her role as Director of Finance at the end of this season, hopefully she will assist with Fundraising and Sponsorship activities or the off project during the new season.

Finally, to all of our sponsors who stuck with us over one of the most testing periods for business in our nation's history. These companies and organisations are some of the heroes of the pandemic and have very much helped us keep our doors open.

Once again, to Mayor Danny Said a big thank you to you and all of the Councillors and staff at Randwick City Council who are always so courteous and supportive of our club, it's always great to have you pop into our club and attend our events.

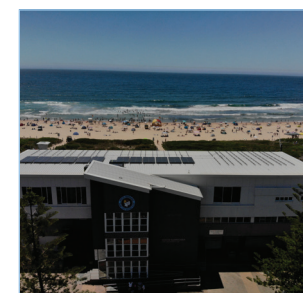
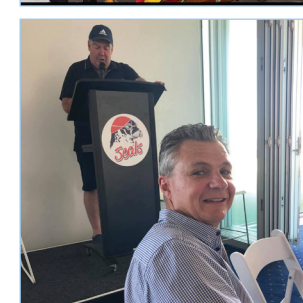
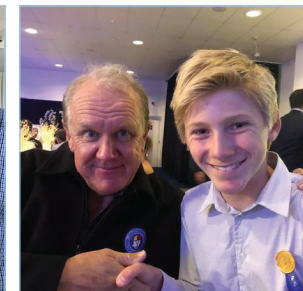

40 YEARS OF WOMEN IN LIFESAVING

1st July 1980 marked the date when Surf Life Saving Australia formally accepted females as members to surf clubs and were officially eligible to gain their bronze medallion award.

It was of no surprise that South Maroubra would open its doors to female full membership that season, despite some club members not being in favour of the inclusion at the time.

The benefits of this decision have proven to be such a progressive step to move our club forward in so many areas including lifesaving, education, surf sports, nippers and administration. A win-win decision for our organisation.

South Maroubra can stand proud to claim being the first Surf Club within the Randwick Municipality to accept females as full members.

12 females joined South Maroubra in season 1980/81

On Sunday, 1st of November 2020, we recognised and celebrated 40 Years of Women in Surf Lifesaving at South Maroubra and the contribution made by female members past and present to our great Club.

It was pleasing to see so many in attendance on what was such a winter's day. Sitting in the Club's Heritage Room and BK Lounge surrounded by our memorabilia and history. We celebrated and recognised our many trailblazing female members who have contributed to the success of our Club over the past 4 decades.

It was an absolute privilege to be part of this celebration alongside pioneers including:

- Patricia Beazley
- Kathy Mazzeri
- Renee Dever
- Yvette Rutherford
- Kim Rutherford
- Samantha O'Brien
- Fiona Thompson and so many more.

So many amazing females have contributed to our club over the past 40 years, we are indeed very fortunate.

Committee members from season 1980/81 were present and shared some wonderful words of the decision and the impact the introduction of females to our club as full members was back in 1980.

Our first female member from 1980, Bronwyn Roberts, who now resides in England and was one of our first 3 females to gain her Bronze Medallion award, sent a message to share on the day which is included below:-

I feel very privileged to be called a 'trail blazer' but in reality, all I wanted to do was follow my male club mates to the senior surf club having been left behind for 2 years in the nippers or nipperettes as we were called at the time.

I remember the President at the time telling my dad he was not surprised to see I was the first female to join South Maroubra.

He went on to say that they chose the wonderful Bernie Kelly to be our instructor, as they knew the importance of making sure the first female bronze medallion squad

were well trained and passed! We took it very seriously and were not about to let anyone down, hence we became part of the first females in NSW to gain the Bronze Medallion and patrol. I remember being very proud to finally be an active member and remained active for over 10 years with South Maroubra.

Season efficiency and discipline have once again for the 1980/81 season highlighted the Surf Club's motto “NO LIVES LOST” whilst the Club's patrols were on duty. South Maroubra Surf Club has a membership of 220 of which there are 148 Active Members. Out of the 148 Active Members to attain their 100% Patrol (Attendance) Efficiency Award. A fine effort and I congratulate all Patrol and Club Members.

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE REPORT

It gives me great pleasure to present the annual financial report for the South Maroubra Surf Life Saving Club for period 2020/21.

The club reported a net profit of \$153,859 (compared to \$57,415 in FY19/20) representing a significant result given the ongoing challenges of COVID-19.

During the financial year ending 30th April 2021 the club recorded a **total revenue of \$627,518**, which is slightly up from previous season (\$616,649 FY19/20)

Donations, Grants & Sponsorship increased by 13% over the past 12 months. The Juniors Group and Maroubra Seals Club provided a combined \$27,000 through the Club Grants Scheme with funds being expensed on Lifesaving Equipment.

New Club Sponsor Resinc Solar, subsidised our solar panel project with a most generous \$30,000 donation. This together with grants from Clovelly Community Bank, Community Building Partnerships (NSW Govt) and Randwick City Council made the project self-funded. Our club now proudly houses 108 solar panels which will considerably reduce our monthly electricity costs.

A new Surfboat & trailer were purchased throughout the season via full sponsorship from the Farr-Jones Family.

A special thank you to all our sponsors who have remained steadfast despite the impact of COVID-19.

Clubhouse Income is derived from Heritage Room hire, Kelly Bar sales, Club Kiosk and Horizons Lease contract.

The Heritage room generated a total of \$72,000 (\$68,880 FY19/20).

The May 2020 quarter and half of the August 2020 quarter Horizons Lease fees were waived by the Board due to venue closures and COVID-19 restrictions representing a significant amount and deduction of income to this ledger.

Total Membership stands at 1,538. I report a significant increase in the Cadet sub-membership category of 45% along with increases in the Active 15-18, Active 18yrs+ and General groups.

Our Nipper membership this season represented the largest group nationally.

There is a slight decrease in our **fundraising** revenue this season due to the fact that we did not conduct our annual Fun Run/Oktoberfest Community Event and the Annual Golf Day. Fortunately, we were able to conduct successful Sportsperson Lunch, Trivia Night and Comedy for a Cause activities.

Thanks to all our competition sections for their yearly commitment to

fundraising to assist the funding of our State and Aussie Touring Teams.

Net Merchandise Sales shows a loss this year of \$2,180 due to clearance sales on old apparel stock and the write-off of same stored inventory.

We currently still have merchandise stock to the value of \$25,000 and steps should be taken to reduce or write-off further old inventory.

Sundry Income is made up from First Aid/BM/SRC course fees, Education Manual sales, sale of club equipment (sale of Surfboat \$15,000), Touring Team Revenue & payment by nippers for some carnival entry fees. This form of income remains steady.

During the past financial period the club showed a 15% decrease in expenditure. 20/21 reports **total Expenditure at \$473,660** compared to \$559,234 FY19/20.

Admin and General Operating expenses remained steady at \$87,883 which resulted from expenditure linked to Admin and Office costs (\$28,709), bank fees and charges (\$3,230), Annual report, audit costs and club printing (\$6,130), Insurance (\$5,461), Capitations (\$33,000), phones and the like.

Building & Property expenditure increased by 21% this financial year due to the payment of \$30,000 for the solar panel project. Other items represented in this ledger are Electricity (\$20,208), Repairs and Maintenance (\$21,173), Lift, Horizons Maintenance, cleaning, Fire Safety and Gym Equipment (\$6,214). Clubhouse maintenance/renovations included the installation of new Kiosk shutters and blinds in the Heritage room.

Competition expenditure of \$75,200 includes Touring costs \$25,000 (Summer and IRB), the purchase of a new surfboat \$37,139, repairs and maintenance of competition equipment and senior member carnival entry fees of \$7,692.

Lifesaving expenditure decreased by 38% from last year as we did not need to purchase a new ATV. To support our Lifesaving commitment to ensure a safe aquatic environment at South Maroubra, investment was made in the purchase of new Lifesaving equipment \$14,265 (\$26,838 FY19/20) and IRB Equipment \$10,100.

Expenses occurred via the maintenance of Trailers and 2 x ATV's, provision of patrol lunches for our volunteer Lifesavers (\$5,284), Education/Lifesaving Awards \$5,718, first aid supplies, lifesaving patrol apparel \$4,519 and IRB Service & Repairs \$3,717.

Nipper expenditure decreased by 42% with the significant shaving of costs to fund the 2021 Nipper State Touring team from \$28,214 (FY19/20) to \$7,958. New Nipper boards were purchased at a net cost of \$8,577. Nipper Presentations cost \$7,916, Development Camps \$3,132 and total nipper carnival entry fees amounted to \$9,206.

Events & Fundraising figures are less this year, as we did not hold the annual Oktoberfest. The Board held a Sponsors Function and 2 x Christenings of new equipment (Surf Boat & Solar Panels). We also purchased an array of apparel specifically for our sponsors.

Member Expenses declined this year from \$50,479 (FY19/20) to \$28,640. Cancellation of our 2020 Senior Presentation Night due to COVID-19 reduced costs, however we off-set some of this by providing our patrolling membership that achieved 100% attendance the previous season a reduced membership fee.

Throughout the season, and as COVID-19 restrictions eased, we were able to open up our club bar and provide a number of club functions and incentives for the over 18 years membership.

The Board continued to support retention efforts of our 13 to 17-year membership groups to the tune of \$5,000.

Depreciation – our financial statement stays on the path of our 13-year cycle of \$53,000 per annum deduction (Amortization) from our financial books to remove the listed clubhouse Land and Building value from \$700,000 to zero.

In Summary: Despite COVID-19 restrictions and the challenges faced throughout the year, the financial position of the club remains sound.

Expenditure restraint must still be maintained as we recover and experience the ups and downs of COVID-19 restrictions, and the impact this may have on our income streams both externally and internally.

Thanks to our Club Licensees Gus Taylor & Tony Shaw and our bar staff for their efforts this year. A big thank you to Caretakers Barry & Leslie and our Office ladies. All of the above members have worked extremely hard this past year, along with the Board of Management Committee, to ensure our members and supporters enjoyed their time spent at South Maroubra Surf Club.

To Kelly Fernandez, my personal thanks to you for your expertise and guidance in the preparation of our financial records for the club Auditor.

In closing, I congratulate all our members for their efforts throughout the year. After more than 28 years on the club's Board of Management, I am standing down and wish to thank all who have supported, motivated, challenged and encouraged me over the years.

It has been an honour to be part of the club management, to work with a diverse group of people who all have the same goal – to ensure that South Maroubra Surf Club is a viable, friendly, community minded organisation that gives as much to the community as it does to its members.

The Solar my Club team helped make the solar process easy, as well as getting external grants to help pay for the system!

Thanks to the generous financial contributions of Clovelly Community Bank, NSW Community Building Partnerships, Resinc Solar and Randwick City Council.

SOUTH MAROUBRA SLSC

The Club installed a large solar power system on their rooftop in early 2021 which is now powering its facilities with clean green energy. Funding was gratefully received from RESINC Solar, and grants from Clovelly Community Bank and NSW Community Building Partnerships Grants. The project also received a \$3000 rebate from Randwick Council's Sustainability Rebates. Annually, it's estimate the system will:

Save 50% on facility's energy bill

Produce enough power equal to running 8 homes

Reduce carbon emissions by 40 tonnes

Equivalent to taking 14 cars off the road

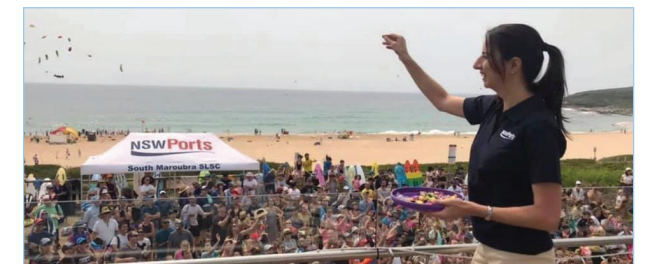
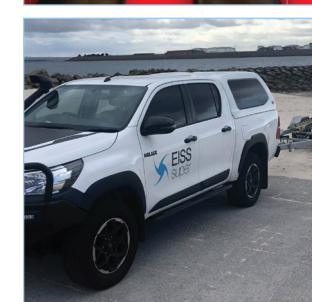



No other applicable Australian Accounting Standards, Urgent Issue Group Consensus Views or other authoritative pronouncements of the Australian Accounting Standards Boards have been applied.

The financial report is also prepared on an accrual basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values or, except where specifically stated, current valuation of non-current assets.

The following specific accounting policies, which are consistent with the previous period unless otherwise stated, have been adopted in the preparation of this report.

Income Tax

The Club is exempt from payment of income tax under the present provision of the Income Tax Act.

Building

The building in which the Club is situated is shown in the accounts as having a net value of \$545,294. In the event of a termination of the lease of the premises, it is anticipated that the building would not have a realisable value. The cost of the building will be depreciated over the remaining term of the lease with Randwick City Council due to expire 30th June 2031.

Inventories

Inventories are measured at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

Events Subsequent to Balance Date

There were no significant events occurring after balance date.

Cash Flow Information

The Club has no credit stand-by or finance facilities in place.

Insurance

A Public Liability Insurance Policy is held by the Surf Life Saving Association of Australia Providing inter alia cover for the Club and members of the Club whilst engaged in lifesaving activities or properly authorised duties as approved by the Club.

Fundraising Activities

Charitable Fundraising Act 1991: This act and the supporting Charitable Fundraising Regulation prescribe the manner in which fundraising appeals are conducted, controlled and reported in NSW. The amounts shown at Note 9 are in accordance with the Authority Condition 7, which is issued to the Club under Section 19 of the Act.

Donations and bequests: These are returned as income as and only when received at the Club's administration office or deposited into the Club's bank account. As specified in the Act, unsolicited donations, members' donations and bequests are not treated as fundraising income when determining information required under the Act.

Cost of fundraising: Cost use in Note 9 includes all direct fundraising costs in accordance with the Act. The inclusion of indirect costs is discretionary. Excluded indirect costs include overheads such as the time spent by accounting or office staff administering appeals, cost apportionment of rent, light and power, and insurance. Exclusion of the indirect costs decreases the cost of fundraising.



We're happy for any help from members, friends, corporates or Council!

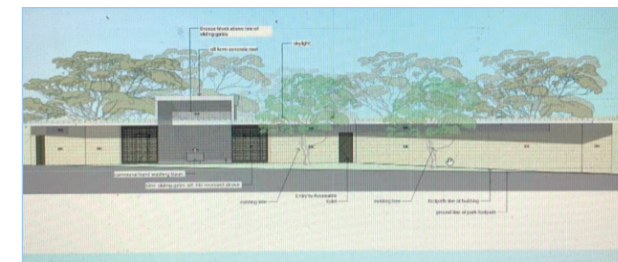
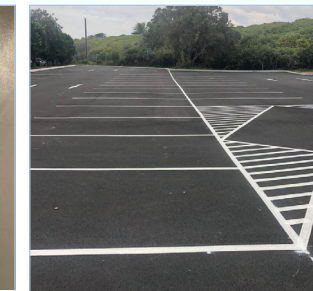
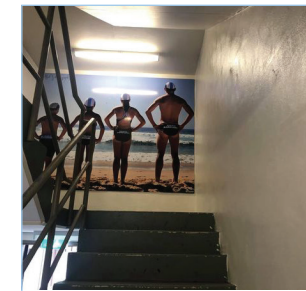
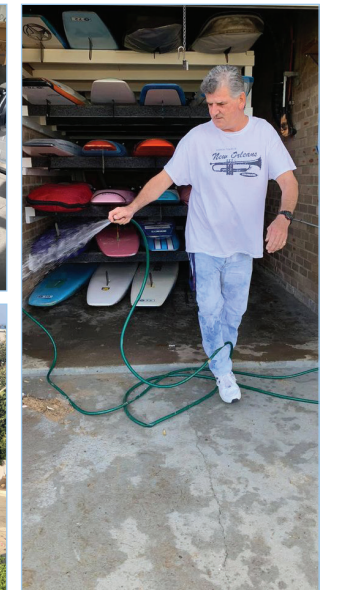
- Lifesaving Room relocation and set up.

DIRECTOR OF LIFESAVING SERVICES REPORT

It was great to be back on the beach for the 2020/21 season after our last season ending one month short due to COVID-19. This season has been different to others, as many parts of our lives have been over the last year or so, but I am proud that the whole community within the Club came together for a very successful season.

This season had mostly the same leadership team within the Lifesaving Portfolio, however with Jay Shelley moving away we welcomed Ben Keenan-Smith as the new Assistant Director of Lifesaving Services. The stability in the lifesaving committee allowed us to grow on our learnings from the previous seasons to take on the challenges of the season.

As usual we kicked off the season with gear inspection, with the whole lifesaving committee pulling together to ensure all our gear was up to spec. A big thank you to everyone who helped get all the gear ready in the lead up and to those who helped out on the day, but particularly to Ken, Laurie, Scott, Codie and Maria who put in a lot of work making sure we're ready. With a bit of shuffling around with our patrol teams and bringing on board some new patrol captains, we needed to ensure we had the patrol teams and roster updated and circulated to our patrolling members, and of course kick off recruiting for the new season (does it ever stop?).

Recruitment, training and upskilling has been a big focus over the last few seasons, and this season was no different. Due to personal circumstances we kicked off the season without our education coordinator, which had me step up to what is a large undertaking. This season also saw us introduce the new Surf Rescue Certificate (SRC) and Bronze Medallion (BM) courses. I have to say all the education team rallied together and we delivered one of our biggest seasons in a long time.

We put through some excellent numbers this season along with a total of 295 awards this season, which is up 230% from last season. We have an impressive 130+ new lifesavers, including 61 new Bronze Medallion holders, as well as 72 new Surf Rescue Certificate holders. With oxygen administration no longer a part of the BM course it was important we had more members upskill in the Advanced Resuscitation Techniques Certificate, this season we trained 22 more on this vital skill as well as a new trainer. I am sure we will see plenty more take this up next season. Additionally we trained 6 new IRB Drivers and 12 new IRB Crew. We've also had members take up higher awards such as the Silver Medallion Beach Management (19) and the senior First Aid Certificate (45), which gives us members who will have a greater awareness and ability while on patrol. Finally, but by no means the least, it's also been great to see new trainers join our training team. We can never have enough trainers and I hope we can see even more join us in the new season.

Patrols this season have been great, and I was happy to be able to get down to visit all the teams this past season and talk with our Patrol Captains and team members. We welcomed some new patrol captains this season. I'd like to mention in particular Andrew Newrick and Ashleigh Breden, who are both exceptional leaders, and were both nominated by their peers for the PC of the Year award. With stability in our member retention and a great influx of new lifesavers we have seen our patrol teams numbers grow again, as well as many taking up new skills means we're able to ensure those visiting the beach remain safe.

With not being able to travel and some very hot days over the summer holiday period we had some very busy beach days. We certainly saw this in our stats with visitation (74353) well up on previous years as well as rescues (82). Our rescues were performed with a number of different equipment including the IRB (35), rescue board (25) and rescue tube (17), which demonstrates how important the equipment and skills of our lifesavers is. I was happy to see a great increase in our preventative actions (8822), and to know that our members are keeping a keen eye on swimmers from various vantage points on the beach and from an elevated position in our Patrol Tower and being proactive in swimmer interventions keeping them safe. After all, our purpose of existing as a club is to keep our beaches safe. I'm glad to report that again we had no lives lost between the flags.

Last season we had bushfires and this season we had floods. Once again our membership stepped up and helped service the community. Thank you to Scott Hobday, Bronte Chadwick and Damien Woods for putting your hand up and attending the floods along with me. With each joint agency call out we get, we learn more and provide a new level of service to the community.

I feel well settled into the Director of Lifesaving Services role and have learnt a lot during the course of the last few seasons. I've had the

benefit of some great friends and mentors over the years and to all of you I am thankful. Thank you to valued lifesaving team members who have always offered the hand of friendship providing words of encouragement and advice plus have assisted in so many practical ways to achieve great outcomes. I would like to publicly acknowledge for the record the Lifesaving leadership Team – Ben, Laurie, Codie, Ken, Scott and Mike for taking care of your sections so well and for providing feedback and guidance where needed. A very big thanks to the Board of Management for your support and backing. To all the Patrol Captains and other Lifesaving Committee members – thank you for your feedback throughout the season, the positive and constructive feedback means we can continue to grow.

It's hard to do what we do without funding and as such I would also like to thank all our supporters, without their generous contribution to the Club we couldn't provide the service we do. Big thanks to The Juniors Group and the Maroubra Seals Club for providing key lifesaving equipment, Ampol for fuel sponsorship of our Inflatable Rescue Boat operations, and Randwick City Council for your continued support.

I am extremely proud of our entire lifesaving community for ensuring visitors to our beach remained safe, to their ability to adapt to new the new policies and procedures that came with COVID-19, to those who dedicate their time to training our new lifesavers and upskilling our current ones, to those who are available for emergency call outs or putting their hand up to attend flood ravaged communities to assist with evacuations: I thank you.

I look forward to the 2021/22 season and seeing you all on the beach.



EDUCATION & TRAINING COORDINATOR REPORT

The 2020/21 season was a huge one for our Education Team, seeing the team put through the highest number of total awards for a season that we have seen in recent years.

The club finished the season with a total of 295 new awards, placing us 3rd in the Branch for total number of awards. Ahead of us were Coogee and Bondi, and when you consider the membership base and the number of trainers they have in comparison, we as a Club should be extremely proud of the results delivered by our team.

As it is every year, our main focus is getting new members through the door by way of the SRC and Bronze Medallion. This season saw us put through 72 SRC members and 61 Bronze Medallion members, bringing a total of 133 new patrolling members onto our beach.

Our job now is to retain these members and encourage them to further enhance their lifesaving skills through the advanced awards we offer each season.

On top of a massive influx of new members, our returning members also sought out opportunities to increase their skill base, with 19 new IRB crews, 6 new drivers and 22 new Advanced Resuscitation award holders and we will look to build on these numbers even further going into next season.

While the numbers achieved are spectacular, none of this would have been possible without the continued dedication of our Education Team, special mention needs to go out to Nicole Cooney who stepped up to lead the first Bronze Medallion course of the season in my absence, while also leading the SRC course and running an ARTC course. For 7 weeks, Nicole was running training sessions

4 days a week, which adds up to about 12 hours a week. This is on top of her responsibilities as Director of Lifesaving, while also fitting in the time to run proficiencies for all our Active Members during the first half of the season. It is this effort that won her South Maroubra's Trainer of the Year which was rightly deserved.

Another special mention needs to go out to Codie Wem, who only joined our education team this season. Codie assisted Nicole with a bulk of the admin that goes with being the Club's Education Coordinator, as well as training both Bronze and SRC, putting in very similar hours as Nicole. By all reports Codie excelled in her first season as a trainer and again, it was this effort that saw her receive Rookie Trainer of the Year.

Last but certainly not least, thank you to all of our Trainers and Assessors. Without your continued effort each and every season, giving up your personal time on top of your regular patrols, we would not be in the position we are today. I genuinely appreciate all you give to education at the club and look forward to working with you all again next season.

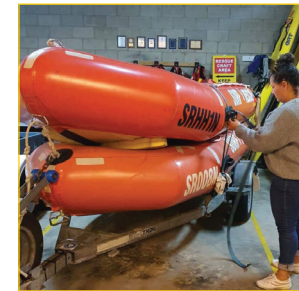

DIRECTOR OF YOUTH DEVELOPMENT REPORT

The 2020/21 season has been one for the record book, with a record number of new lifesavers within a changing environment caused by a global pandemic. In the lead up to the season start we were all uncertain as to whether the season could even proceed. All the Sydney Branch clubs were holding regular meetings through-out the off season desperately trying to plan for what was always going to be a very different Nippers.

We introduced a variety of changes to the Nippers format in order to be COVID-19 compliant. Restricted numbers, staggered start times, individual age zones, hand sanitizing stations, check in areas were just a few of the changes made to keep the nippers safe and on the beach. With the ever-changing landscape that the virus delivered we too had to keep changing. Communication needed to be quick and direct and all the volunteers, nippers and parents all had to adapt almost weekly.

You would think that all the changes and restrictions would have had an adverse effect on the Sunday Nippers but it was quite the opposite. The staggered start times increased the water time for all Nippers and the introduction of individual age zones allowed the Age Managers to engage with the kids. The adaptability and resourcefulness of all the volunteers to deliver a program to over 800 nippers each week is nothing short of remarkable.

As in previous seasons, we were highly focused on member engagement, member participation, retention and looking at ways to improve more

on the member experience. The professionalism, commitment and knowledge of our volunteers has been the key to the success of our program. We pride our program on being focused on inclusivity and education, whilst maintaining a well-balanced approach to competition and regular nipper activities. All done and delivered through a well-structured program in a family focused and fun COVID-19 safe environment.

This season we built on the previous seasons numbers with 806 nippers signed up. With the support of the new and existing Age Managers we were able to keep the doors open to old and new Nippers resulting in record numbers in the Under 6, 7 and 8 age groups. With many other clubs closing their books to the under 6's we saw an increase in this age group. We commenced our season with a similar calendar to previous seasons with the Under 6's and 7's utilising the rock pools at the southern end of the beach. With over 300 nippers in these two age groups it is no small task to keep them all engaged. This was again achieved by the U6/7's Age Managers, beach crews all under the coordination and helpful eye of Lauren McLean. The retention rate of these nippers coming back each year is an awesome achievement, and one we should all be very proud of.

Congratulations and a huge thank you to our Junior Captains Noah Teitler and Tyler Ellis. You both did South Maroubra and your families proud. Your commitment, approach and willingness to be there to support, whilst being exemplary role models did not go unnoticed. Best wishes to you

both in your senior path at our club. A special mention must go to Noah for taking out the title of Sydney Branch Junior Lifesaver of the Year and our Club's Cadet and Junior Lifesaver annual awards. An incredible achievement.

We also sadly said farewell to our U14s Young Lifesavers as they've graduated from the program. We wish them the very best in the senior ranks, and I thank Jason Griffith, Darren McLean, Adrian Di Blasio and their team for your support and work over the many years you coached and mentored these young lifesavers.

Our U8s made the move to the big side of the beach and the transition was seamless. Both groups were managed by David Jones and Matt Buttsworth, and of course, supported by our amazing Beach Crew and Water Safety.

To the U9s to U13s Age Managers, thank you for your continuous support and commitment. It was a challenging year with tricky conditions, your dedication and flexibility allowed the program to be delivered brilliantly without any negative feedback.

To past junior members that volunteered their time to mentor and share your knowledge with our Nippers, thank you. We appreciate your commitment and time; our nippers thoroughly enjoy having you around.

In order to develop great lifesavers and assets to the community, we invest a lot of resources focusing on lifesaving skills at the beach, education and development of our young members and family members.

During the past season, we delivered numerous training courses, with a number of our Nippers representing our club at the Junior Development camps.

- 712 achieved their age appropriate Surf-Education awards
- U13s/U14's achieved their SRCs and are actively patrolling our beach
- 45 Parents achieved their Age Managers award
- A large number of parents achieved their Bronze Medallions, all doing active patrols and water safety
- 10 Parents achieved their Level 1 Technical Officials award
- Several parents also achieved their IRB certificates (Crewman/Driver)

A number of our future young leaders from the U11s and U13s represented our club at the Sydney Branch Nipper Development camps. They learnt and shared valuable leadership skills, whilst furthering their life saving skills, in a well-coordinated program.

COMPETITION/ TRAINING

This season's nipper training program was well structured, inclusive, and COVID-19 safe, providing a more flexible approach and allowing working parents/carers to take advantage of the program for their children. With the support of our board coaches, we started board training in early August, which was a huge success.

We had big numbers in water training attendance. Large

numbers of Nippers attending surf swimming and board training, this reflected in the improved skills and confidence that our nippers showed on normal nipper days, as well in competition. Sand training was also developed further, providing again a well-structured and flexible program, we saw our attendance soar, what a great achievement.

To our Junior Coaches Marty Kiernan, Darren McLean, Andy Newrick, Murph Renford, Shane White and Tony Jenkins. I thank you for your guidance, support and encouragement. Your knowledge and commitment are appreciated. Please remember that all of our coaches are volunteers and give us their time to train our nippers. It is rewarding to see how these young athletes develop to become great lifesavers.

Unfortunately, due to COVID-19 restrictions we were unable to do the sleep over part of the training camp this year. We still held the full camp and it was a pretty intensive training schedule but most importantly it really brought the team together. It was an incredibly rewarding experience for the coaches and the kids, and certainly one that we will be repeating this season. I am sure the kids that swam out to the shark nets will never forget that experience!

With limited carnivals this season our nippers had to search out different areas of Sydney and NSW to compete. They represented our club at several events during the season all over Sydney, Northern and Illawarra Branches, they wore and represented our club colour's with pride, enthusiasm

and competed in a fair and friendly manner. This season the Touring Team Manager position was meticulously led by Renae McNamara. Renae's organisation, work ethic and communication meant that we all knew where we supposed and when, which is no mean feat. The Nippers and their families have never been so organised.

With the Sydney Branch competition cancelled again this year for the younger age groups due to huge surf conditions the run up to the State Competition was a bumpy one. It was the fourth year at Blacksmiths Beach up at Swansea-Belmont for the NSW State Championships. It was touch and go as to whether the carnival would proceed due to COVID-19 and in the end it was split over 2 beaches and extended to 4 days. The sand and water disciplines were split and families were restricted to where they could go. We still had a large contingency of 109 Nippers representing South Maroubra who competed solidly, placing 6th overall point score in the State. Congratulations to the management team and coaches, it was a magnificent effort by our athletes... Well done!

A big thank you to Andy Newrick for designing the state teams uniform this year. The kids looked amazing.

AWARDS/ PRESENTATIONS

A presentation day was conducted for our young U6s, U7s and U8s who were presented with their medals, certificates and awards. The older nippers received their awards later in the season and it

was a lovely moment when they formed a guard of honour for the Under 14's on their graduation day.

Congratulations to the Nippers that were awarded with their 100%, 200%, 300% and even 800% attendance trophies, a well-deserved award and recognition to the nippers and families for such commitment, and of course, congratulations to the recipients of the Coaches and Age Manager's awards.

Congratulations to all Nippers that received medals at the NSW State Championships and also congratulations to our Club Champions for your age groups. The Bruce Rutherford Memorial Award for the most outstanding surf female nipper competitor of the season was awarded to Mia Hoo, a well-deserving recipient, congratulations Mia.

The Surf lifesaving movement is delivered and managed by volunteers, our club is run and managed by a great bunch of volunteers that share the same vision and commitment to make our club great. To all the volunteers that gave up your time and efforts to support us during the season and ensure the program would be delivered successfully, a massive thank you! The nipper committee did an amazing job this year with numerous meetings pre and post season to organise what was a difficult year logistically.

The dedication of the club training officers is to be commended in helping our future lifesavers and parents learn more about the surf, beach conditions and valuable lifesaving skills. Thanks to the club's education team led by Mike Fernandez and I'd like to also express my gratitude to Nicole Cooney for the magnificent work she does with our SRCs. The numbers are growing each year and the beaches are safer for it.

To the amazing beach crew team, the support you provide to the Age Managers and Nippers is amazing. I thank you for your commitment, time, persistence and patience. The work and time you put in the development of our young lifesavers at training is invaluable. Packing and unpacking the beach is a task that many of you are not familiar with and not an easy one. With the extra set up requirements for the COVID-19 zones a 6am on a Sunday morning is a norm for our gear steward and support team followed by the pack up which

is completed an hour or so after the last nippers have left the beach. I'd like to recognise and thank Paul Ryan and Stu Donaldson for your support and dedication.

Thank you to our officials that have supported our section over the years, I congratulate the parents/carers that achieved their Official awards and officiated during the season.

Thanks to our Nipper partners Channel 10, Sydney City Volkswagen, Cook Lot Wines and Invisible Zinc.

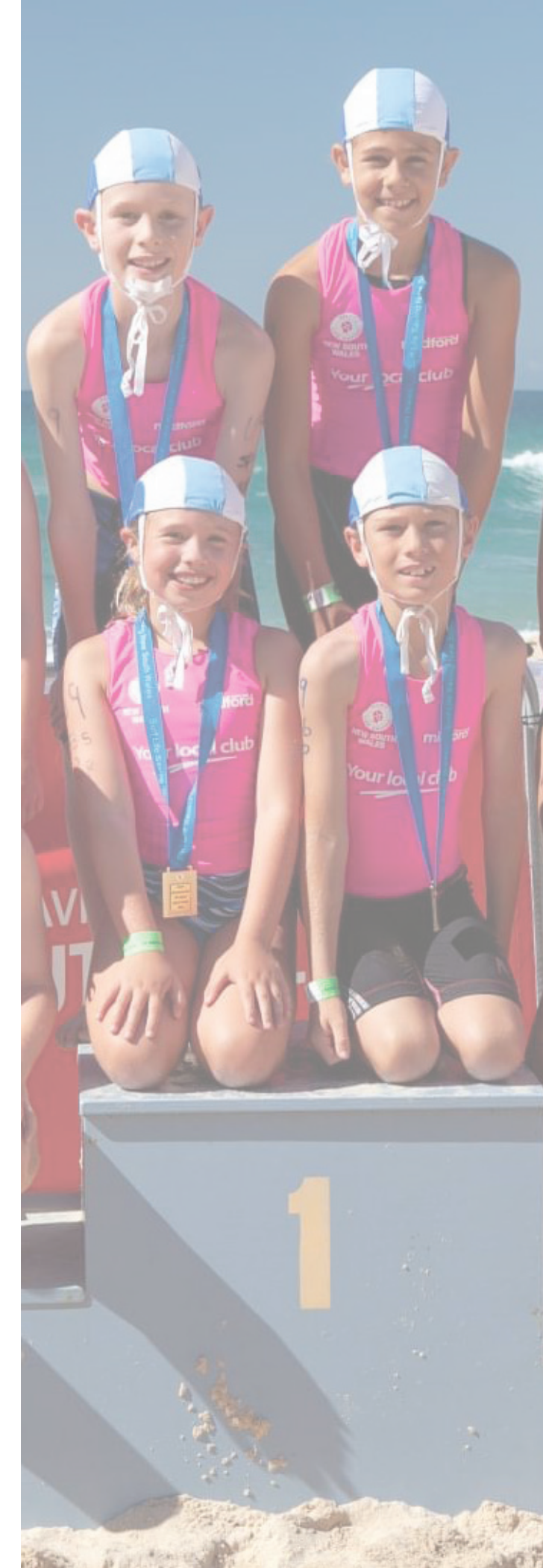

Without Maria, the Competition Committee would probably forget to meet each month and be unaware of what carnivals are coming up.

Thanks, must also go to Shane White and Dave Dubois for leading our charge to the Aussies and the reintroduction of the Sunday morning handicap surf race. These activities are a part of our club's DNA and it's great to see numbers at both are on the increase.

Due to COVID-19 restrictions, there were only a handful of carnivals to compete at this season, however, this did not deter our competitors. If there was a carnival on, there was a decent chance a South Maroubra competition cap could be seen on the beach.

I think most of our competitors have assisted the Northern Beaches Council with their facility upgrades from the amount of parking fees paid for the carnival over that way. We were fortunate that there was a carnival hosted by our friends from Maroubra SLSC, which was well attended by us.

For the major carnivals this season, we were well represented, with many of our members returning home with some jewellery.

To the State Championships at Blacksmiths Beach, we sent a team of 25+ competitors, comprising of 14 Masters, 5 Cadets and 5 Surf Boat Crews. The highlights of this carnival were without a doubt the Gold Medals achieved by young Evan Vukovic in the U15 Beach Sprint and Michael 'Murph' Renford in the 55-59 Rescue Tube Race. Other notable results from the State Championships were Max Murphy winning two silvers and a bronze, John Rooney and Jennie Smith returning home with silver and bronze medals, Genevieve Andersen-Allen winning silver, Ashleigh Breaden secured a bronze medal, along with Jayson Lincoln and Rene Prochnow doing likewise.

The Aussies were a new experience for the majority of our team this season, with more than half our team competing at this level for

the first time. The carnival started with our youth competitors. It is fair to say that they were not overawed by the competition. It was pleasing to see our members make their way through the various rounds of competition, with a number making finals at such an elite competition. We were fortunate to witness Charlie White, Fredo Mravec, Lucas Dubois, Tom Farr-Jones and Maximo Di Blasio reach finals in the water events, but it was in the Beach events where we achieved the most success. Evan Vukovic backed up his State Championship Gold Medal with great performances in both his sprint and relay events. Our three relay teams (boys, girls and mixed) all finished in the top 6. But the standout moment of the Aussies was witnessing Ruby Gray collect a bronze medal in the U15 Girls Beach Flags. Ruby celebrated this achievement with members, past and present, and was just reward for an extremely dedicated athlete.

Our Masters were always in the point score, with the indefatigable John Rooney and Max Murphy continuing on their fine form of the season. Max was rewarded for his performance with a Silver Medal in the Beach Flags.

Our Boats were again led by the charismatic Phil Stivano in a season hampered by COVID-19 restrictions and unfavourable surf conditions. The number of crews representing us at carnivals this season is growing, full details will be provided by Phil in his report.

The IRB section were unlucky that their season commenced just as COVID-19 entered our vocabulary, which resulted in the cancellation of the 2019 Season. Despite this setback, Will Shaddock and Codie Wem are developing an extremely enthusiastic and competitive team for this season. Their season is just getting underway at the time of writing this report, more details of their performances for this season will be provided to the members as they become known. Overall, these young members of our club were a fine example of what our club is about – teamwork, dedication and humility.

As I mentioned previously, season 2020/21 saw the return of the Sunday morning surf race. The prize on offer was one of Mick's Famous Chicken Schnitzel Burgers. The competition was fierce. I am sure there was a bit of foxing in the early rounds to secure a favourable handicap, but you have to get up early

to put one over the handicapper. The interest in this activity grew as the season progressed and I look forward to it becoming a regular activity for all of our members.

I would like to thank all our officials and coaches for their assistance and support this season. We are most fortunate to have a very dedicated membership who volunteer their time to assist each other.

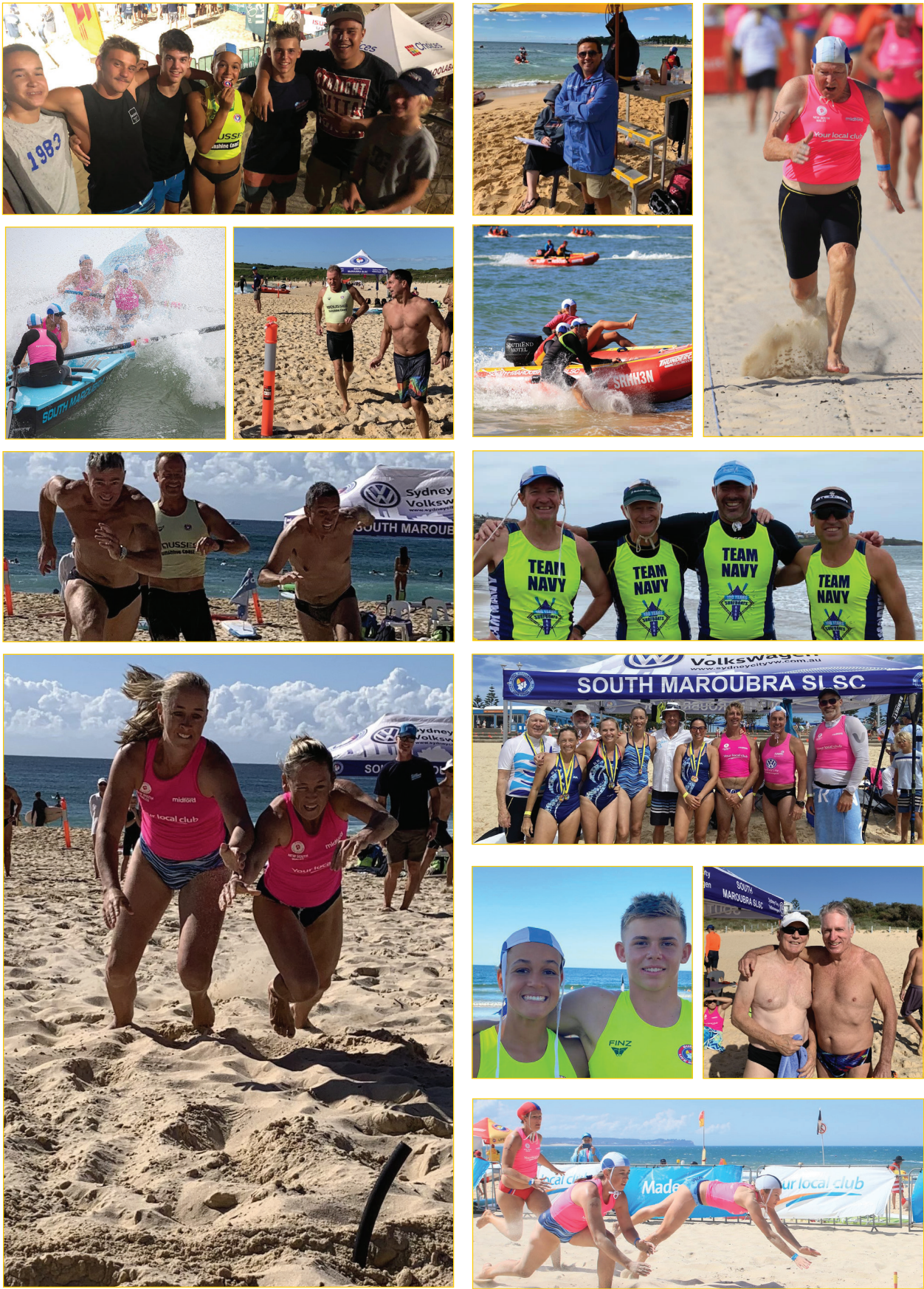

Marksie you have left a void in the club which we just now fill with the wonderful memories you have given us.

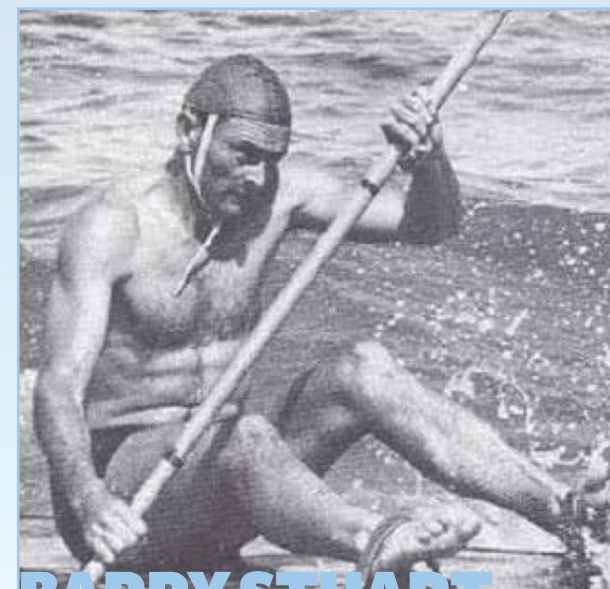

Gus has been a long serving member, previously carrying out the role of club caretaker and has been a major contributor to the success of the club for many years.

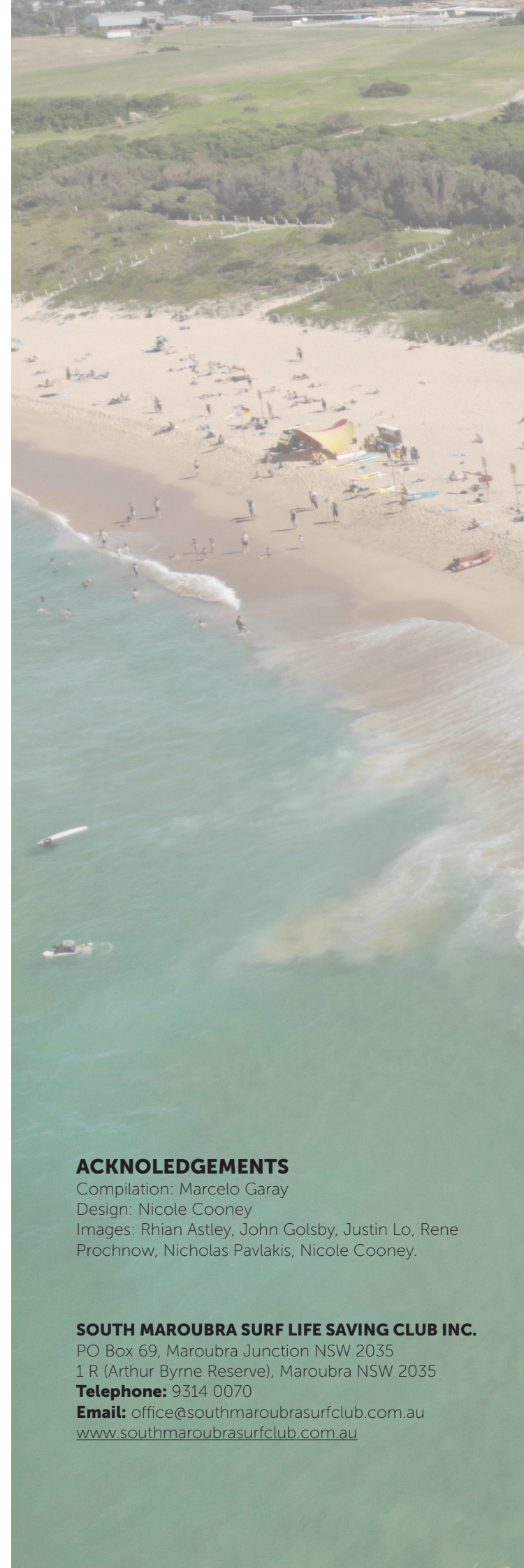
He demonstrates great commitment to South Maroubra SLSC and the importance of building club camaraderie whilst also building a regular income stream.
